other reptile and amphibian species. The installation method involved the bottom lip being placed on top of the ground and then covered with earth and gravel. This installation technique was very swift and effective, allowing the fencing to be in place to help reduce roadkill as quickly as possible. The fencing on both sides of the road was connected to a wildlife crossing culvert that will allow animals to safely travel between these two areas of their habitat.
