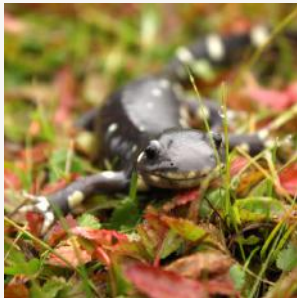

SUMMARY

In addition to being an effective wildlife barrier and one-way movement device, Animex can be used as a drift fence for wildlife movement studies. After performing extensive repairs to upkeep the deteriorating silt fencing that was installed in the first study season, Animex drift fence arrays were deployed at the Travis Air Force Base in a custom pitfall trap study monitoring the movement of breeding populations of California tiger salamanders (*Ambystoma californiense*). The portability, durability and reusability of Animex fencing makes it the perfect solution for any drift fence study.
