to enclose the construction of a dredged material placement site (DMPS) in support of maintenance dredging in the Stockton Deep Water Ship Channel (DWSC). The 35-acre DMPS was established on Twitchell Island, adjacent to restored wetland habitat known to be inhabited by Alameda Whipsnakes (Masticophis lateralis euryxanthus) and Western Pond Turtles (Emys marmorata). The fence was installed at an angle for one-way movement, serving as an effective exclusion barrier while allowing animals to escape the active construction zone. Following construction of the DMPS, the fence was removed and disinfected to be used for future projects.
