


Animex® TEMPORARY FREE-STANDING WILDLIFE FENCING BELOW GROUND INSTALLATION

MATERIALS

REQUIRED:

- ANIMEX® FENCING
- ANIMEX® WASHERS
- UV RESISTANT ZIP TIES OR FENCE WIRE GRIPPLE WIRE JOINERS (OR SIMILAR)
- FENCE POSTS

- 12 GALIGE STRAINING WIRE
- FENCE END BRACES & WIRE STRAINERS
- FENCE POST SAFTEY CAPS

TOOLS & EQUIPMENT

- WEED WACKER / WHIPPER
- STRING LINE & MARKER PAINT
- BOX CUTTER / STANLEY KNIFE
- TRENCHER / EXCAVATOR
- SPADES / TRENCH SHOVEL
- POST DRIVER / SLEDGE HAMMER

- SPADE DRILL BIT 3/4in (20mm) Ø
- CUTTING PLIERS

- SHEAR ATTACHMENT FOR DRILL (TRIM FENCE)
- LITHIUM POWERED RECIPROCATING SAW (TRIM POSTS)
- DRILL BIT FOR DRAINAGE HOLES 1/8in (3mm) Ø
- GRIPPI E TENSIONING TOOL

STEP-BY-STEP

- 1) Clear vegetation along the fence line and work area.
- 2) Mark out the Animex® fence line.
- 3) Excavate trench. Ensure the trench is level and clear of large clumps or rocks.
- 4) Lay out posts at desired spacing and roll out Animex® barrier (Fold bottom lip if required)
- 5) Install posts at the back of the trench using manual or machine powered post driver (Install horizontal wire if required).
- 6) Place the Animex® fence material into the trench with the lips facing towards the area that animals will encounter the fence.
- 7) Fasten the Animex® to the posts or straining wire starting along the top and work your way down.
- 8) When attaching rolls overlap them following details on installation drawing. A minimum of 4 ties in total should be installed on any joins in the fence
- 9) Back fill the trench. Ensure the backfill is compact to eliminate gaps for animals to crawl through. Do the same on the back side of the fence.
- 10) Fasten the top lips and install any additional features such as one-way funnels or pitfall traps (if required).



TURNING CORNERS

You will be unable to bend the material around corners without cutting the top and bottom lip to relieve tension. By making a single cut in the top and bottom lip when you feel the fence becoming creased or difficult to bend it will allow you to position the fence around corners. Once the lips are cut in areas where tension occurs you can position the fencing where you need it and secure overlapping lips (for an internal curve) using a tie and washer (just like you would when over lapping rolls). For outward turning corners where lips will not overlap you can bridge this gap using an off cut of material and pay special attention when back filling to ensure no gaps appear at this section. These methods should work for most corners/bends in the fence line, however there may be times where this method will not work and you may need to cut the material and create overlapping joins.

CHANGE IN GRADIENT

(Refer to installation drawing)

You may come across a part of the trench where the gradient changes and there is a steep slope to be fenced. At this point you will have to cut the fence at an angle so that it overlaps the preceding material. Washers and ties may be needed to close up any gaps that may have appeared and the shape of the fencing you cut may need to be varied depending on the terrain requirements.
