### **Getting to the Garden (CB2 1JE)**

-  15-20 minute walk from the City Centre with entrances on Trumpington Road (Brookside Gate) and Hills Road (Station Road Gate).
-  Visitor cycle parks at both entrance gates.
-  8-10 minute walk from the main Cambridge rail station (CBG) to the Station Road Gate.
-  The Garden can be reached via a variety of Stagecoach, Whippet and other local bus routes. These include the Guided Busway, Trumpington and Babraham Park & Rides, the Hop-on Hop-off Bus Tour and the Universal Bus.

Limited pay and display parking on Trumpington Road and Bateman Street.

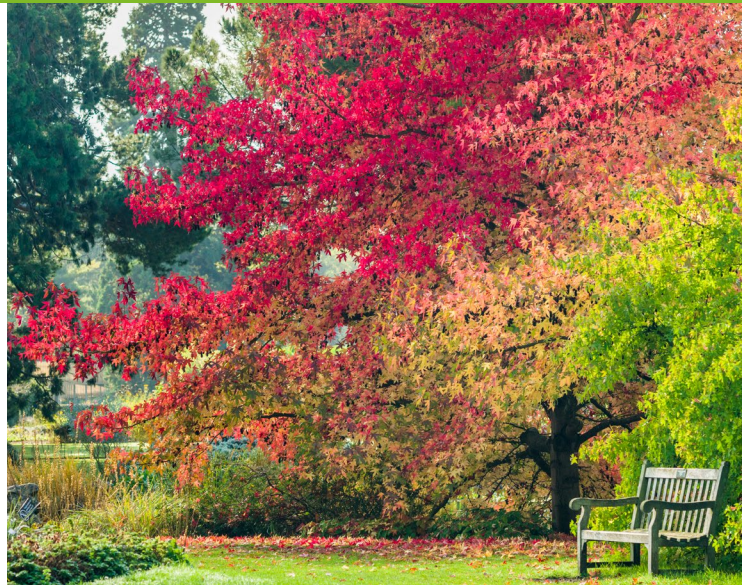
Relaxation
