

The Make Space Eco Wall Flower

Brighten up your wall or door with this recycled-paper flower wall hanging, shared by artist Kate Chittenden.



Materials

- A selection of old or recycled paper: magazine pages, wrapping paper, bits of coloured paper, pages from old books (brushed with a wash of thin paint)
- A piece of cereal pack card or similar
- Scissors
- Glue
- Pen



1. On the piece of card, draw a circle around a plate.
1. Cut out lots of petal shapes from the selection of papers.
TIP: It's quicker if you fold the paper up and cut the petals from the folded layers.



3. With a dab of glue at one end, start sticking the petals around the outside of the card circle. Work your way inwards towards the middle.
TIP: Roughly crease each petal longways before you glue it - this will give your flower more texture.



4. Cut 4 narrow strips of paper and glue in the centre of the flower.
5. Tape some string or twine on the back and hang the flower on a wall or door.
