EXAM STRUCTURE

The IAD is assessed by a combination of computer-based assessments (CBAs) and/or written examination. Four of the available five units are assessed via two-hour CBAs, which consist of 80 multiple choice questions. The Private Client Advice unit is a three-hour paper-based examination that can be taken in June and December each year. It is a written exam consisting of a variety of short factual questions, as well as longer, essay-style and scenario-based questions.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The IAD is intended for employees currently advising and/or dealing in securities and derivatives, and those advising on packaged products. There are no formal entry requirements. If you already have IMC Level Four, you are usually exempt from either the UK Regulation and Professional Integrity paper, or the Investment, Risk and Taxation paper. We would recommend that you confirm this directly with the CISI.
