THE ANNUAL MEETING, held at the Milton Hall,  
244 Deansgate, Manchester, on Monday, 24th June,  
1935, at 4-30 p.m.

Mr. C. E. R. Abbott, the Hospital's Chairman, presided at the meeting, and there were present Members of the Board and Subscribers.

A list of apologies was read and the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting, held on 22nd June, 1934, were read and confirmed.

The General Report for the year ending 31st March, 1935, was presented by Mr. Abbott, the Medical Report by Dr. Chisholm, the Chairman of the Medical Committee, and the Income and Expenditure Accounts and Balance Sheet by the Honorary Treasurer, Mr. T. F. Heyworth.

It was resolved, upon the proposal of Mr. Abbott, seconded by Miss Ashton :—

“ That the Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st March, 1935, now submitted, be approved and adopted.”

The following resolution was then proposed by Mrs. Richardson, seconded by Miss Goodey, and carried :—

“ That the Honorary Treasurer (Mr. T. F. Heyworth), and the Honorary Secretary (Mrs. J. Goodier Haworth), and Members of the Board as set out be elected for the ensuing year.”

Mr. Heyworth moved that the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. Walton, Watts & Co., be reappointed for the coming year, and in addition he thanked them, on behalf of the Honorary Officers and the Board, for their valuable work during the year. This motion was seconded by Mrs. J. Goodier Haworth and carried unanimously. This concluded the business of the meeting.

## ANNUAL REPORT

for the year ending 31st March, 1936.

ON 10th July, 1935, H.R.H. The Duchess of York honoured the Hospital by opening the Nurses' Home and Medical Block. After inspecting the new buildings she visited the wards and showed great interest in the patients and the treatment which they were receiving.

Subsequently Her Royal Highness graciously consented to her name being associated with the Hospital. In November, 1935, the Manchester Babies' Hospital became The Duchess of York Hospital for Babies, Manchester, and the following message was received: “ Under its new name Her Royal Highness hopes the Hospital will go forward on the excellent lines on which it is at present run and continue to flourish.”

In presenting the 22nd Annual Report of the Hospital for the year ending 31st March, 1936, together with the Medical Report, Audited Accounts and Balance Sheet, the Board of Management welcomes the following new Members :—

Mrs. L. F. Behrens, Mrs. John Morley, Miss M. C. Paterson, Mrs. Pitty, Mr. Anthony Simon and Mrs. J. S. B. Stopford; also Councillor Samuel Meadowcroft and Councillor Miss Ellen Griffiths (Representatives of the Manchester Corporation), in place of Councillor R. G. Edwards and Councillor Miss Annie Lee, resigned.

## INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

Owing chiefly to the amount of much needed decorating undertaken during the year and to the added maintenance costs of the new Extensions, the maintenance account of the Hospital shows a deficit on the year's working of £469 13s. 4d. This, together with an excess of expenditure of £217 15s. 9d. on the Out-Patient Department account, brings the accumulated deficit on maintenance funds up to £1,251 5s. 3d.—a figure which causes the Board much concern, in view of the fact that the Hospital has only very small resources apart from its annual income.

A special Sub-Committee has been formed to explore the possibility of arousing interest in the Hospital in districts where its needs and work are little known. As, however, at least £500 additional income is required annually to meet the expenses of new facilities provided by the Extensions, the Honorary Treasurer will be grateful if all friends of the Hospital will use their influence to obtain new subscriptions and donations. Only by obtaining additional support can the work of the Hospital go on and its present standard in serving the needs of the community be maintained.

The Honorary Treasurer is glad to report the receipt of the following :—

- £1,000 from the Executors of the late Miss Ann Hick, with a request that this should be used for the Endowment of a Cot;
- £1,000 to Endow a Cot in memory of the late Colonel J. H. Deakin.

These sums have been invested and form a valuable addition to the very small capital funds of the Hospital, and the additional income which will be provided is gratefully appreciated.

Also £19 4s. 9d. from the Executors of the late W. J. Reid, Esq.

## OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

The work of this Department continues to grow and it has been found necessary to appoint an additional part-time Masseuse for work in the Remedial Exercises Department.

In January, an Orthopædic Clinic for referred patients was started, and an Orthopædic Registrar, Dr. Marguerite Johstone, appointed. The Department, by the useful work it is doing, has already justified its existence.

A part-time Dispenser has been appointed and a room in Brook House (the Out-Patient Department) has been converted into a Dispensary for the whole Hospital. Patients in the Out-Patient Department no longer have to wait for medicines, and most prescriptions can now be made up on the premises, resulting in a considerable saving of time and expense.

## BUTTERFLY GUILD.

The Board once more takes the opportunity of thanking the Butterfly Guild for its generous help. In addition to the cot maintenance grant of £130, a special donation of £100 has been given to the Special Efforts' Committee, and still the Guild starts a new year with a good balance in hand.

A room at Brook House, allotted to the Guild for its use, has been the scene of many happy and enthusiastic gatherings. Branch Guilds have now been started in other districts and the Board wishes them success in the future.

The Junior Butterfly Guild, started in 1934, has succeeded in interesting many young people in the Hospital, and by its efforts two very welcome donations of £10 each have been received towards the furnishing of the Nurses' Home. The Board wishes to include the Juniors when expressing gratitude to the Guild,

## GARDEN.

Considerable improvements have been made to the garden, including clearing and grassing a piece of waste ground for the use of the Nurses. Miss Lois Haworth kindly undertook the work of superintending the reorganization, and, in addition, obtained donations of £10 5s. towards the expenses. Further gifts of flowering trees and shrubs, plants and bulbs would be greatly appreciated.

## SERVICES RENDERED.

The Board wishes to place on record its appreciation of the devoted services rendered by the Medical Staff, the continued high standard of efficiency of the Matron and Nursing Staff, and of the Secretary and her Staff for their work in the general administration of the Hospital, also gratitude to Matron and her Staff for further donations of £220, making £420 towards the £500 they have promised to give to the Extension Fund.

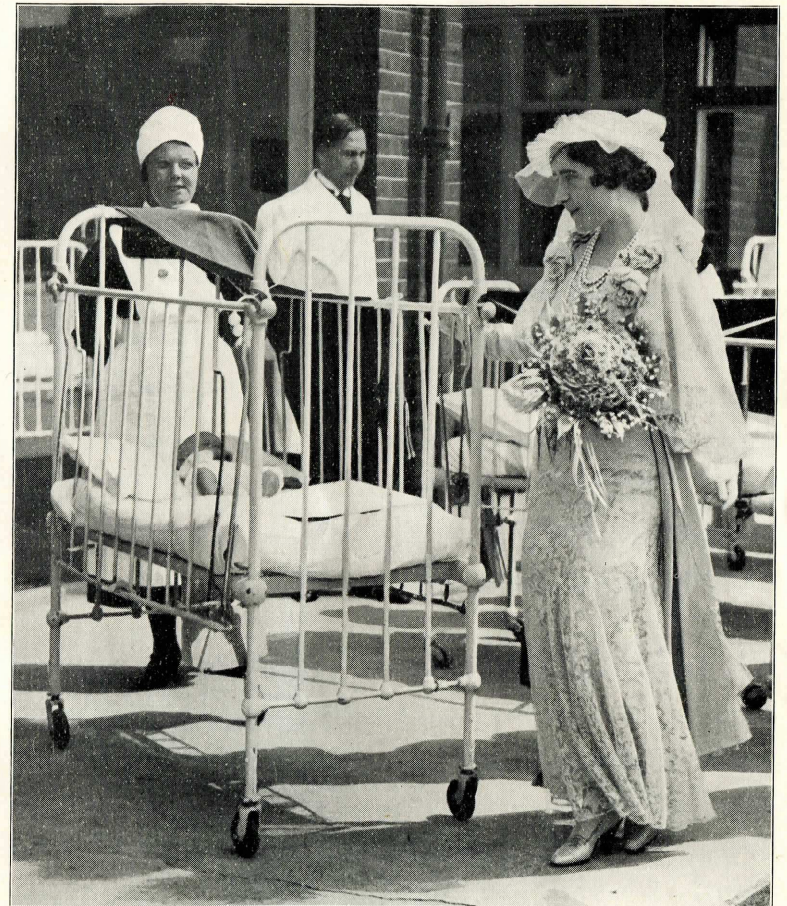

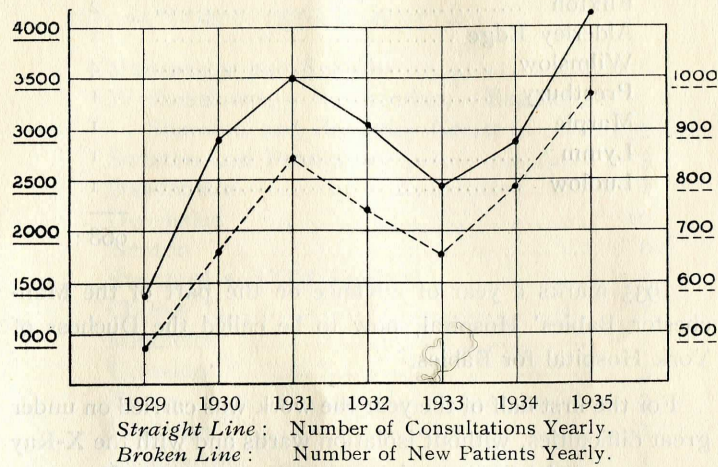
1935 marks a year of advance on the part of the Manchester Babies' Hospital, now to be called the Duchess of York Hospital for Babies.

For the first half of the year the work was carried on under great difficulties, without isolation wards and with the X-Ray apparatus and laboratory in temporary quarters. However, the new blocks—Laboratory, Theatre and X-Ray Unit and Nurses' Home—now offer great advantages, and the Medical Board are appreciative of the great efforts to provide them which have been made by the Special Efforts' Committee. To Mrs. Haworth's understanding and enthusiasm we feel we owe a large measure of the success of our recent development.

The accommodation for the isolation of suspected cases of infection, although adapted from the maids' quarters in the old stable block, are much more convenient than any we have had, and permit of three isolation rooms and bathroom, as well as of nurses' bedrooms.

The Out-Patient Department is developing greatly. It will be seen from the statistics appended how the numbers attending have increased. This increase in numbers necessitated the engagement of a part-time dispenser and a room has had to be adapted as a dispensary. This has proved a great help in the Out-Patient work, preventing patients being kept waiting for their medicines. In connection with this

department we would gratefully acknowledge the help of the Voluntary Aunts and also of the N.S.P.C.C. The Voluntary Aunts bring children who live at a distance in their cars. This is especially helpful for those children needing operations for tonsils and adenoids, who are kept for the day and need conveyance home. Further help of this sort would be much appreciated.

We regret that during the year Mrs. McCrea has been suffering from the effect of her accident last March, and tender our thanks to Mr. McCrea and Mr. Wilson for so kindly acting during her disability.

The Honorary Staff has been strengthened by the addition of Mr. Morley, the Professor of Surgery at the University, who has been appointed Hon. Consulting Surgeon, and of Mr. Platt, to whom in the past we are indebted for much help and who is now our Hon. Consulting Orthopædic Surgeon. To assist the liaison between the latter and the Hospital, an Orthopædic Registrar has been appointed to attend at the Out-Patients and see any case in Hospital

needing Orthopædic treatment. One of our late resident medical officers, Miss M. Johnstone, has been appointed, and her experience here, coupled with her training in orthopædic surgery, will be of advantage.

This year, in addition to the clinical demonstrations in children's diseases given to the University students on Friday morning, the University Vaccination Class has been held in the Hospital.

We have appended to the statistics the district from which our patients come. This shows the wide area served by the Hospital, both in the wards and in the Out-Patient Department.

We regret to have been compelled to refuse so many patients, owing to the lack of beds.

The usual lectures to probationers have been given by Dr. Nesta H. Wells, Mrs. Edith F. W. McCrea, and Dr. Sylvia K. Guthrie.

The Medical Staff wish again to record their high appreciation of the work of the Matron, Nurses, Masseuses and the Secretarial Staff.

In concluding this report the Medical Board wish to record their deep personal regret at the retirement of Dr. Florence Robinson. She was one of the founders of the Hospital and one of the first honorary medical officers. Her interest has been continuous. Her enthusiasm and devotion both to the medical duties and to the general interest of the Hospital has contributed very greatly indeed to the continued growth and development of the Duchess of York Hospital for Babies.
