Special FPM seal material allows for use with: solvents, fuel, scale removers, waterproofing, anti-mould solutions, oils and lubricants. The only choice for brake cleaning fluid and for most commonly used chemicals in the food industry.

5. HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION

5.1 GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING: READ and UNDERSTAND this instruction booklet completely before using these sprayers.



The user must always ask the dealer for the safety card of the chemical product to be used, also for disposal of the residual liquid. The use of substances not in conformity with the current regulations is at the user's risk and peril.



Never open the pump when under pressure.



Do not eat, drink or smoke during use.



Do not leave the sprayer exposed to heat sources or intense cold.



Do not spray on windy days.



Do not use for spraying food products (wine, milk, etc.).



Wash hands and face after use.



Variable spray nozzle.



Keep out of the reach of children.



Do not spray toxic or harmful liquids on persons, animals or foodstuffs.



Keep bystanders away whilst using the sprayer.



Use suitable protective clothing during use.



Seek medical attention if spray gets in eyes, or if other symptoms develop during spraying.



Use suitable face mask and eye protection.



Never abandon potentially hazardous chemicals in the environment, drainage or sewerage systems.

Note: After use, rinse the container then operate the pump with clean water to completely empty the container and piston.

6. TECHNICAL DESCRIPTION

6.1 IDENTIFICATION



- ① Pump handle.
- Safety pressure valve.
- 3 Spray bottle.
- 4 Nozzle.
- (5) Lance.
- (6) Fill inlet.
- 7 Trigger assembly.

- (8) Hose.
- (9) Handle.
- 10 Lance holder.
- (11) Carry strap.
- 12) Pressure gauge.

7. UNPACKING AND CHECKING

7.1 PACKAGING

Carefully remove the product from the packaging and examine it for any sign of damage that may have happened during shipping. Lay the contents out and check them against the parts shown below. If any part is damaged or missing; please contact the Draper Helpline (the telephone number appears on the Title page) and do not attempt to use the product.

The packaging material should be retained at least during the guarantee period: in case the machine needs to be returned for repair.

Warning! Some of the packaging materials used may be harmful to children. Do not leave any of these materials in the reach of children.

If any of the packaging is to be thrown away, make sure they are disposed of correctly; according to local regulations.

8. ASSEMBLY

8.1 LANCE ASSEMBLY - FIGS. 1 - 2

- If not already in place, make sure the rubber gasket (A) and compression fitting (B) are arranged onto the lance (5) in the correct order, as shown in FIG. 1.
- Slide the end of the lance into the trigger assembly (7).



Screw the compression fitting
 B clockwise to secure the trigger and lance.



8.2 NOZZLE ASSEMBLY – FIGS. 3 – 4

- If not already in place, make sure the rubber gasket and compression fitting are in place on the end of the lance, as shown in FIG. 3.
- Slide the nozzle 4 onto the end of the lance 5.



 Tighten the compression fitting to secure the nozzle in place.

8. ASSEMBLY

8.3 ATTACHING THE HOSE - FIG. 5

- Insert the suction tubing (8.1) of the hose
 (8) into the spray bottle through the hose inlet (8.2).
- Screw the compression fitting (F) to secure the hose in place.



9. OPERATION AND USE






9.1 FILLING THE SPRAY BOTTLE -FIGS. 6 - 8

- Unscrew the pump handle (1) anti-clockwise to loosen and remove from the pump handle/assembly from the fill inlet (6).
- Fill the spray bottle with your chosen liquid to the desired level through the fill inlet (6) to the maximum fill line shown on the bottle.

Note: The additional use of a large funnel (G) may be adviseable, especially when using potentially hazardous liquids.










9. OPERATION AND USE

9.3 SAFETY PRESSURE VALVE - FIG. 10

The safety pressure valve (2) will operate when the volume reaches maximum pressure. It can also be opened manually to vent remaining pressure prior to opening.








9.4 SPRAY OPERATION - FIG. 11

The sprayer is operated by depressing the trigger (7).

- For continuous spraying pull the metal locking catch (7.1) forward and locate onto the plastic lug, locking the trigger in the open position.



9.5 FLOW RATE - FIG. 12

The force of the spray can be regulated using the flow adjustment dial (7.2) located on the trigger assembly.

Turn the dial anti-clockwise for increased flow rate and clockwise to decrease the flow rate.

9.6 VARIABLE SPRAY PATTERN -FIG. 13

The spray pattern can be varied by rotating the nozzle (4).

The sequence of spray patterns varies from fine jet, through to wide fan.



10. MAINTENANCE AND TROUBLESHOOTING

10.1 MAINTENANCE

- After use, rinse the container then operate the pump with clean water to completely empty the container and piston.
- At least once a year clean pump thoroughly, re-grease or lubricate all moving parts.

Warning: When assembling and servicing, carefully insert the pump piston without forcing, so as not to damage the gasket.

10.2 TROUBLESHOOTING

Fault	Problem	Solution
Weak or no spray.	Non-pressurisation.	Check and tighten connections, if necessary.
	Loss of pressure.	Check gaskets are lubricated and show no signs of wear – replace if necessary.
	Obstruction.	Check for possible blockage in nozzle, trigger or outlet hose.
Distorted spray.	Obstruction.	Check for possible debris partially obstructing nozzle.
Leakage.	Possible sediment accumulation on sealing surfaces.	Check sealing rings are free from debris and sediment – clean or replace if necessary.

11. DISPOSAL



11.1 DISPOSAL

- At the end of the product's working life, or when it can no longer be repaired, ensure that it is disposed of according to national regulations.
- Contact your local authority for details of collection schemes in your area.

In all circumstances:

- · Do not incinerate.
- Do not abandon in the environment.
