1.1 SCOPE

Professional users helmet with solar powered automatic shading facilities when arc is struck. Also features a dedicated grinding setting.

Suitable for enthusiasts and tradespersons alike. Any application other than that it was intended for, is considered misuse.

This product is not a toy and must not be used by children or any person with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge, or people unfamiliar with these instructions.

Local regulations may restrict the age of the operator.

3. HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION

3.1 GENERAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR WELDING HELMETS

Warning! Read all safety warnings and all instructions.

- Severe burns are possible with a damaged lens (cracks, pits and holes etc.). Do not use damaged lenses.
- Optical radiation can possibly enter in from behind the helmet from other welders welding in the immediate area.
- This helmet is not designed to protect against severe impact, explosives or fragments from spinning wheels on abrasive discs.
- Do not weld in the light state.
- If filter fails to turn dark. Immediately stop welding.
- Do not use in an excessive heat environment.
- Ensure that the sensors are kept clean.

Personal Protection:

- The body should be protected by suitable clothing.
- The use of neck protection may be necessary against reflected radiation.
- Wear safety glasses when chipping, wire brushing, grinding, or when near cooling welds as metal filings or slag can be thrown up. Fully enclosed goggles are advisable.
- The UV and IR radiation generated by welding is highly damaging to the eye, causing burns. This can also affect the skin. Protect the eyes and face.
- Where environments are subject to pedestrians and traffic ensure a protective screen is used to avoid accidental arc glare.
- Do not weld in the vicinity of children or animals and ensure no one is looking before striking up.
- In the welding environment, damaging levels of noise can exist. Wear hearing protection if the process dictates.
- Do not touch hot equipment or metal. Allow the weld time to cool, use the correct tool and wear protective welding gauntlets.
- Wear flame retardant clothing (leather, wool, etc.).
- The arc generates
 - ultra-violet radiation (can damage skin and eyes).
 - visible light (can dazzle eyes and impair vision).
 - infra-red (heat) radiation (can damage skin and eves).
- Such radiation can be direct or reflected from surfaces such as bright metals and light coloured objects.
- In the vicinity of an arc, non-reflective curtains or screens shall be used to isolate persons from the arc radiation. A warning, e.g. a symbol for eye protection, should refer to the hazard of arc radiation.

4. UNPACKING AND CHECKING

4.1 PACKAGING

Carefully remove the product from the packaging and examine it for any sign of damage. Check contents against the parts shown in Fig A. If any part is damaged or missing, please contact the Draper Help Line (see back page). Do not attempt to use the product!

The packaging material should be retained during the warranty period, in case the product needs to be returned for repair.



- (1) Solar cell.
- (2) Sensors x2.
- 3 UV. IR filter (outside PC lens).
- 4 Dark shade control.
- (5) ADF Self-check button.
- (6) Low volume alarm.

- 7 LCD Protect plate (inside PC lens).
- (8) Headband adjusting knob.
- Sensitivity control knob.
- 10 Lithium battery.
- 11) Delay time control knob.

6. ASSEMBLY

6.1 HEADBAND INSTALLATION - FIG.1

Style of headband may vary from illustrations shown.

Take out the mask and install the headband according to the exploded view:



Around head tighten/loosen.




FIG. 2 Vertical between eye level to top of head up/down.



Adjust the distance from viewing window to the eyes forward/backward.



Slightly adjust the window viewing angle.



7. BASIC OPERATION

7.1 AUTO DARKENING FILTER'S OPERATION

The table below is the darkness colour number comparison table; please select correct darkness colour number

based on the actual working conditions so as to reach the optimal protection and work efficiency:.

7.2 SENSITIVITY ADJUSTMENT – FIG.6



- When the welding current is small, adjust the sensitivity (9) to high, so you can see the weak stable arc.
- When welding current is large, adjust the sensitivity (9) to low. You can avoid the arc interference by others.

7.3 DELAY TIME:

Delay time (11) is time from dark to light, Step-less control.

- When welding current is large and the light of molten pool is very strong, you need to select the delay (11) to high, so you can avoid the eye injury by the light of molten pool.
- If you want to do spot welding, you need to put the delay (11) to low, so you can improve the work efficiency.
- Adjust delay (11) to middle place is suitable for most of welding projects.

7.4 WELDING/GRINDING/CUTTING FUNCTION – FIG.7

When switched to Grind, it enters grinding/cutting mode under which the auto-darkening filter will not turn black when detecting any arc light; therefore, please switch to the correct position based on service conditions before using.

7.5 TESTING

Press the TEST button (5), if working correctly the filter will turn black.

7.6 BATTERY REPLACEMENT - FIG.8

When the red warning light (6) is illuminated, you need to replace the battery (CR2032).


