## Dear Member,

We hope this email finds you safe and well. It is a further update on the Society's current and planned future activities which are, of course, contingent on external factors.

In our 1st June email we advised that the Welsh Government's restrictions on gatherings and social distancing requirements mean that the Society will be unable to hold fortnightly talks at Cardiff University for many months to come, and we were therefore planning, for the foreseeable future, to hold our talks online using the Zoom video conferencing platform on which guidance is available on the home page of the Society website <a href="https://www.cardiff-astronomical-society.co.uk/">https://www.cardiff-astronomical-society.co.uk/</a>.

In advance of each talk we shall, as usual, send you an email reminding you of the date and time of the next talk and providing, where possible, extra details about the talk and the speaker. More importantly, these emails will contain instructions on how to attend the relevant Zoom talk. Our first Zoom talks (which will be the final talks of the 2019/20 season) are as follows:

- Weird Worlds: The new science of exoplanets by The Sky at Night's Professor Chris Lintott on **Saturday**, **27th June** at 5.00 p.m. (further information on this talk will be emailed to you early next week); and
- When Galaxies Collide by Dr Megan Argo, University of Central Lancashire, on Thursday, 9th July at 7.30 p.m.

In addition to this, we have been successful in starting the 2020/21 talks much earlier than usual. Indeed, we have arranged for next season's first talk to be held on Thursday, 30th July – only three weeks after the last talk of this season! And on 27th August we will receive a presentation from the discoverer of radio pulsars, Dame Jocelyn Bell Burnell.

Details of the programme of initial talks for 2020/21 will be posted on the CAS website within the next few weeks and, if possible, will be attached to next month's email update.

As you know, the Society's 2020 AGM will be held on Thursday, 23rd July. The agenda and other relevant papers will be emailed to you early next month.

You are also reminded that CAS member Marc Delaney has kindly set up a series of informal Zoom-based astronomy discussion sessions on alternate Tuesday evenings.
