## FORS—Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme—Information Sheet

The Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS) is a voluntary accreditation scheme for Fleet Operators.

The purpose of the scheme is for Fleet Operators to be able to demonstrate that they are working to a set of Standards that are designed to enhance road safety by reducing work related road risks.

There are three levels which operators can achieve. Bronze, Silver and Gold.

Transport for London are responsible for developing the standards that operators have to work towards, and FORS are the administrators for auditing compliance against the standards.

The scheme encourages operators to take a closer look at their fleet operations and identify what they do well and where they have areas that require improvements in relation to the given set of standards they are working towards.

A successful audit will result in Fleet Operators receiving recognition that they have achieved the standard and will have the FORS Logos displayed on all their fleet vehicles to distinguish them from other operators.

Contract owners may request within their contractual requirements that their suppliers are FORS Accredited in order to be able to contract for work.

The FORS Standard is applicable to types of vehicles that are operated on the Public Highway by a FORS approved fleet operator. This includes HGVs, Vans, Passenger Carrying vehicles with more than 8 passenger seats, cars, Powered two wheelers, and wheeled plant. The standard is applicable to all drivers in your organisation. A driver is defined as a person employed to drive or ride any vehicle that is in scope of FORS accreditation.

Part of the requirements to achieve the Silver Standard is to have 90% of your drivers achieved their on-cycle training and WRRR course every five years.

To help support this we have lowered our FORS Silver course prices and introduced a small group size price, to help those organisations who do not have sufficient drivers to pay for a large course.
