Coronavirus.

Because of the need to prevent the spread of the Coronavirus Mayfield Deanery has decided to implement the following changes to liturgical practice, following the directions of the Bishop.

1. Holy Communion will no longer be offered from the Chalice. We know from the catechism that when we receive Holy Communion only under the form of bread, we receive all the fruits of Eucharistic grace.

(Catechism1390)

2. Holy Communion will only be administered in the hand. Those who normally receive on the tongue, & who cannot receive in the hand, should make a spiritual communion for the duration.

3. The sign of peace will no longer be given as a handshake, but by turning to the person next to you & wishing them peace.

4. The offertory profession will not take place for the time being.

5. The priest, deacon &/or extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist will sanitise their hands before administering Holy

Communion.

6. Remember: those who are sick or experiencing symptoms of sickness are not obliged to attend Mass. Indeed, out of charity they ought not to attend. (*cf. Catechism 2181*)

7. The holy water stoops have been emptied for the duration.

8. Likewise, there will be no tea or coffee after Mass.

9. If I am unable to say Mass there will be a service of the Word & Holy Communion.

Just as our Lenten penance is meant to deepen our relationship with God & our unity with all who suffer, we can allow these sacrifices & inconveniences to direct our prayers toward those who have died & their loved ones, our attention toward those who are ill or facing financial difficulties & our actions toward strengthening the common good, both at home & abroad. This new virus poses a threat that knows no borders, but neither does our love & concern for our neighbours.

Holy Cross Chapel will be open as usual from 6.30 am to 6.30pm for private prayer & reflection.
