When asked what you thought the school needed to continue to develop:

A summary of the main comments	School Comments / Actions
To provide a breakfast club.	At present we do not have the facilities to provide a breakfast club, however this is continually reviewed. Children from our school are welcome to attend the breakfast club at Altofts Junior School.
To provide extra tuition for children to struggling with their work.	We have a very comprehensive intervention system in place at school. Our regular monitoring and tracking identifies children who may be struggling or not making the expected progress. The senior leadership team carefully place these children into short-term interventions with an appropriately trained member of staff. If concerns were to continue this would be discussed with parents.
To improve communication to those parents who work full time.	<p>Our weekly newsletters are available on the website and a paper copy of these can be obtained from the school office. Any other key information or dates are sent out by letter. We have an email and text messaging service for parents as well as a 'parents app' which you can sign up to.</p> <p>We recognise that many of our workshops, inspire mornings / afternoons and events are during the school day. Where possible we vary the times of these so that they are not always on a morning or an afternoon and give parents a range of dates to choose from. Where possible events are planned well in advance.</p> <p>Learning journey sessions, which are informal 'drop ins' with the class teacher, run throughout the year.</p> <p>If parents require any further information they are welcome to telephone the school office to arrange a phone call with the class teacher or headteacher.</p>
To co-ordinate the start and finish times of nursery with main school.	<p>Children in nursery have a statutory right to 3 hours of provision each day. In order to accommodate both a morning and an afternoon session, the start and finish times have to be staggered at either end of the main school day. Therefore the sessions run 8.30am to 11.30am and 12.30pm to 3.30pm. – As both sessions are required to offer the morning and afternoon children the same level of provision, the hour in between the sessions is required to set up the nursery and prepare resources for the afternoon. We will continue to review this situation, especially in light of the new 30 hours provision.</p>
