**When asked what you thought the school did well:**

- **Communication** – including weekly newsletters and class pages to keep parents up to date. Information about school dinners and regular learning journey sessions for parents of our youngest children.
- Has **high expectations** of attainment, progress and behaviour for all.
- **Kind, friendly and approachable** staff who support and reassure parents.
- A **caring and nurturing** environment which helps to build confidence and makes sure that each child's needs are met.
- After school clubs.
- **Celebrates** achievements of children.
- Teaches children well to ensure they reach their potential.
- Provides a **range of experiences** for the children including sports, music etc.
- Extra events and sessions for parents.
- Waterton Trust Opportunities.

**When asked what you thought the school needed to continue to develop:**

<b>A summary of the main comments</b>	<b>School Actions</b>
Parents having more opportunities to come into school with their child – in a morning to change library books or through more parent workshops where you can interact with your child in the school environment.	We are currently reviewing ways in which we can provide additional opportunities for you to either come in and work with your child or attend parent workshops. From September 2017 we will have an outline in place for parents of when these events will be held. Since December 2016 we have held our curriculum information meetings for parents in all classes, as well as a safety meeting for parents, a reading meeting for Reception parents and we have a healthy eating information session planned for 28 <sup>th</sup> March 2017.
Additional updates on your child's progress through either more parent's meetings or more reports.	At present the school holds three formal parent's evenings for parents throughout the school year with a formal report for children going out in July. Reception classes hold weekly 'Learning Journey' sharing sessions for parents. We appreciate that some parents would like further updates and will review how this could be put into place for September 2017.
More use of email and text messaging to communicate key information or dates.	As a school we are keen to continue our good communication with parents and carers and as such have already been looking into the use of a text messaging service for parents. We are hoping to have news of this in the very near future. The school newsletter is always available on the school website as are other key dates and information.
Less of a focus on attendance and the statistics.	We are very proud at Lee Brigg of our excellent attendance and the support that we receive from parents with this. It is wonderful to know that the children love coming to school! We appreciate that weekly attendance figures are always part of the newsletter and it is something that we celebrate each week in our assembly and at the end of each term. We acknowledge that all children are affected by illness at some point and may not be able to come into school, however we will continue to promote good attendance within school as we believe every day counts!
Providing a breakfast club.	At present our children who need / wish to attend a breakfast club do so at Altofts Junior School and are then brought up to school. Although we are always reviewing and evaluating our provision in school we do not yet have the facilities to provide our own breakfast club.
Developing the outdoor area for the Reception classes.	We currently have a project underway to begin developing all of our outdoor areas for all of the children. The Friends of Lee Brigg have already started an

	amazing job of fundraising for this. The staff and children have submitted their own ideas and we have started to look at initial plans for the grounds. Please keep an eye on our newsletters to see where parents and carers can help us with this!
The passing on of information to the class teacher.	Mrs Brook is available each day outside in a morning to pass on your daily incidents or concerns. If you wish to speak to someone in school about an issue which may be more personal, please do not hesitate in contacting Miss Gordon or Miss Kilkenny via the school office.
Opportunities for more art / design technology in the curriculum.	Miss Kilkenny and Mrs Taylor are currently planning for the school to receive the 'Artsmark.' This is an award which recognises the work of children and the school's role in developing a curriculum rich in all the 'arts' for the children. As such this will be one focus of our school development plan for next year and will provide even more opportunities for our children in art, music, drama and design technology.
Access into school for prams and pushchairs to the reception.	We have already identified this as an issues for those parents and carers with prams and pushchairs. We are currently reviewing ways in which we can rectify this so that the school entrance is more accessible.

Thank you to all who responded to the spring parent's survey. We were overwhelmed by the lovely comments that we received. Where some issues were highlighted for individual children in specific classes, this information has been passed on to the appropriate class teachers.
