

<b>Course Title:</b> Nutrition Hydration		<b>Duration:</b> Half day
<b>Broad Aims:</b> To give the learner a better understanding of nutrition and hydration.		
<p><b>Overview</b></p> <p>This course is designed to provide learners with an introduction to nutrition and hydration looking at how best to enable people to choose and consume adequate food and drink. The actual support required by the person will be dependent on their individual needs. Learners will look at the effect of food and water on the body and general health, how to make changes to supplement illness and how to identify the key minerals and nutrients required by the body.
