24HOUR DELIVERIES TO STORE

Members are aware that deliveries to this site had been temporarily extended to ensure that the food store was able to accept deliveries during the Covid-19 public health crisis.

Members have received complaints from local residents in nearby properties because of the noise generated by the delivery yard. There have been occasions when the doors have not been closed and reversing beepers have not been silenced.

Members also feel that it is unfair to expect the local residents to accept the continuous disruption of extended deliveries on a permanent basis taking into consideration that stock deliveries and staff shortages seem to be settling in the current climate.
