- b) Application Ref. No. 17/01758/TCA, 1 No. Eucalyptus fell, 70 South Street, Manningtree, approved on 7th November, delegated decision.
- c) Application Ref. No. 17/01562/FUL, First floor rear / side extension with alterations, 51 South Street, Manningtree, approved on 9<sup>th</sup> November, delegated decision.
- d) Application Ref. No. 17/01479/FUL and 17/01480/LBC, Alterations and extensions of existing vacant bank premises, to provide a retail unit and change of use to multi-residential accommodation (1 retail unit, 6 flats and 1 house), 2 High Street, Manningtree, approved on 10<sup>th</sup> November, delegated decision.
- e) Application Ref. No. 17/01664/FUL and 17/01665/LBC, Change of use of first floor offices to two flats, First Floor, 25 High Street, Manningtree, approved on 20<sup>th</sup> November, delegated decision.
- f) Application Ref. No. **17/01855/TCA**, T1 Yew, T2 Beech, T4 Sycamore fell, Hill House, 54 South Street, Manningtree, approved on 21<sup>st</sup> November, delegated decision.
- g) Application Ref. No. 17/01631, Single storey side / rear extension, Hillside, 23 Colchester Road, Manningtree, approved on 21st November, delegated decision.
- h) Application Ref. No. 17/01892/TCA, 1 No. Ash fell to ground level and remove stump, Cotswold House, Mill Lane, Manningtree, approved on 28th November delegated decision.
- 6). To discuss Planning Application No: 17/01950/OUT, Outline application for the erection of 110 dwellings with public open space, landscaping, sustainable drainage system, and vehicular access point from Grange Road. All matters reserved except for means of access, Land at Grange Road, Lawford

**RESOLVED** that the District Council be informed that the council strongly objects to the planning

application for the following reasons:

- 1. Overdevelopment the number of new builds already agreed in the area already far exceeds the requirements of the local plan;
- 2. Infrastructure traffic in the area has increased a great deal in the last year and this development will increase traffic on Cox's Hill and the surrounding area even further. The railway underpass which sits on the main route (A137) through Lawford and surrounding villages and connects Essex to Suffolk is already creating bottlenecks as hundreds of cars pass through on a daily basis;
- 3. Railway infrastructure it appears that this has not been given much thought. The commuter trains from Manningtree are already over capacity during the rush hour as it is and we suspect this development will add to that. In addition, commuter parking is already proving a problem for the area with not enough parking provision at the station as it is;
- Health services We note that NHS England have commented that the development proposal would further overload the existing GP provision and that no provision has been provided for contribution;
- 5. Direct access to the site is limited:
- 6. The local schools are already oversubscribed.
