#### 37/18 Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from Cllr. H. Jones.

#### 38/18 Minutes of the previous meeting

**RESOLVED** that the minutes of the meeting held on 21st June 2018, having been circulated previously, be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

#### 39/18 Declarations of interest

### 40/18 Visit from Les Hawkins, Specials Supported Policing Coordinator, to discuss the potential recruitment of Special Constables for the local area

Mr Hawkins gave an introduction to the Special Constables Scheme, emphasising that a Special Constable is not the same as a PCSO. Special Constables are part time volunteer police officers who are fully warranted and have exactly the same powers as a standard police officer.

Special Constables are recruited by a parish to serve that parish in particular for a minimum of 16 hours per month albeit most choose to do more hours. As they are volunteers the parish cannot dictate their hours beyond the minimum requirement. In an emergency they can be called elsewhere but the parish would not be charged for their time on these rare occasions. They get paid a small allowance on a sliding scale as well as mileage. All Special Constables have to report to the Clacton Police hub before driving to their designated parish, this is to allow them to register their start-time and to collect their kit. They have to return to sign-out following the end of their shift. The annual cost of one Special Constable is estimated at £500 - £1,000 per annum.

Once a Special Constable has been recruited it will take up to two years before they can start in their role as they need to be trained, vetted and signed off as being as competent.

Following Mr Hawkins presentation the councillors voted as being in favour of the scheme. There is a proposal to possibly share Special Constables between Manningtree, Mistley and Lawford parishes. The council will await the decision of the other parishes and need to review the council's budget to establish how much they can afford to spend on the project.

## 41/18 Visit from Dave Blackiston, Co-ordinator, Harwich and District Community Speed Watch Partnership

Dave Blackiston provided the council with an introduction to the Speed Watch Partnership. They currently have 31 approved sites for speed watching with a further 11 in the pipeline, including Mistley and Manningtree. A speed watch group normally consists of 10 volunteers with 2 – 3 volunteers taking part in each speed watch monitoring event. During these monitoring events, the registration number of any cars going above the speed limit will be logged and sent to Essex Police. A warning letter is then sent to the offender. Mr Blackiston asked for Manningtree Town Council to e-mail him with any names of roads that they would like to be included in the scheme. It was proposed that the clerk e-mail him suggesting that Brook Street, High Street and possibly Trinity Road if appropriate be included. Action: Clerk

# 42/18 Visit from Race Discovery to discuss a proposal to organise a 5 & 10km endurance race in Manningtree & Mistley

Two representatives from Race Discovery attended the meeting and provided the council with information on future running races they are planning to organise in the area (including Mistley and Lawford). The council had no objections to these races taking place. Race Discovery is also contacting the neighbouring parishes asking for their views. It was proposed that they contact the Rotary Club. The clerk is to e-mail them the Rotary Club's contact details.
