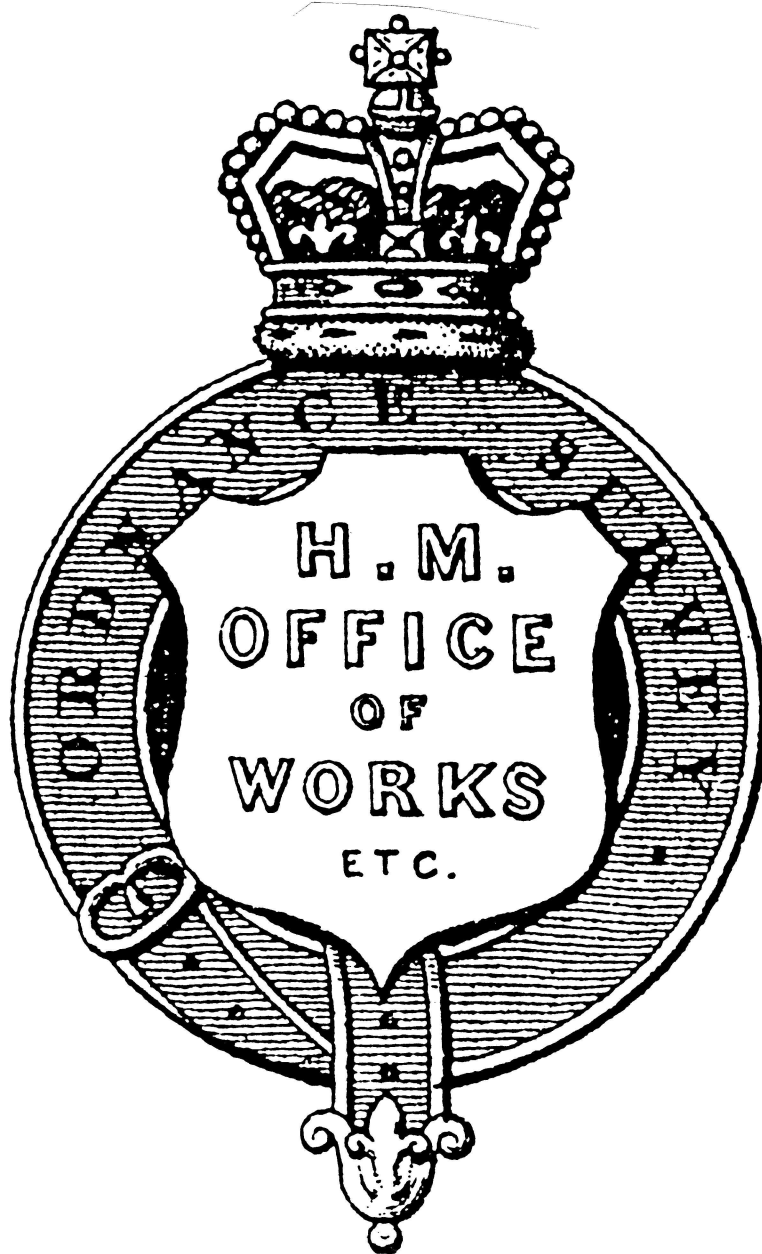

Combined reprint

Sheetlines 28, 29 and 30 were originally published separately in 1990-91 and were the first issues to be produced by 'desk-top publishing methods'. The result was somewhat rough-and-ready in places, as the text was first typed on an Amstrad PC 1512 and then converted for 'typesetting' on an Apple Macintosh. For this 'reprint' the opportunity has been taken to reset the text, to make a number of discreet corrections, to make some additions, to remove some redundant announcements, and to use a more spacious layout. In order to facilitate reference to the Index to *Sheetlines* 1-45 the original page breaks and page numbers (in brackets) have been retained; I believe that this more than offsets the apparent eccentricity of page numbers in mid-page. Continuous page numbering is in **bold**, top left and top right.

In the table of contents, the original page number *within* the individual issue is given in ordinary type, in brackets, and the continuous page numbering in this reprint is given in **bold**.
