

## Propylene Asia Price Forecast Methodology

1 April 2016





The ICIS Propylene Asia price forecast is published via a 'Price Forecast' window on the ICIS Dashboard. The window comprises the 12-month price forecast series, with short commentary, and also offers a rolling 12-month price history.

- The monthly propylene Asia price forecast extends the historical gross weekly northeast Asia propylene price (CFR NE Asia) reported in the ICIS pricing report edited by Michelle Lim.
- The price forecast series includes the following month and the next 11 months in the future, i.e. 12 months in total.
- The forecast is made by our consultant, John Richardson, in the ICIS office in Perth, Australia.
- The price forecast is published in the second full week of Month 0 covering the period Month 1 to Month 12.
- Price forecasts are published in US dollars per tonne.
- The price forecast series is accompanied by a short commentary (around 120 words).

## ICIS compliance protocols:

- a) The information gathered in the process of making this ICIS price forecast does not flow back to the ICIS price reporting editorial staff.
- b) Confidential information that is gathered by ICIS editorial staff in the process of price reporting is not permitted to be included in the ICIS propylene price forecasting process.

Where a price forecast series is charted and downloaded in a currency other than its assessed currency, the 16:00 UTC foreign exchange rate, as provided by <a href="www.xe.com">www.xe.com</a>, from the first of the month in which the forecast series was generated is applied to all price forecasts within that forecast series. Where the first of the month is a non-publishing day, the prior publishing day's 16:00 UTC foreign exchange rate is applied. ICIS provides charting and downloads in alternative currencies as a guide only.

Our recommendation would be to chart and download in original assessed currency and to apply your own selected foreign exchange rates.
