



NACD MAKES ITS MARK

The 45th Annual Meeting provided the perfect opportunity to reflect on the association's successes

Mat Brainerd marked the end of his tenure as NACD chairman by emphasizing the association's dedication to raising the bar on stewardship, leadership and collaboration within the chemical distribution industry.

"To me, there is no association more important, more effective or more genuine about helping our companies achieve success, than NACD. I believe no other group exists to match chemical stewardship and industry leadership. We wouldn't be here today without NACD's commitment to excellence."

Brainerd noted that NACD members provided jobs for nearly 27,000 employees in 1,900 facilities this past year, driving 175m miles and safely delivering chemicals to customers every 6.5 seconds.

The association has continued its advocacy efforts, successfully standing up to regulators, he said.

Now in its 25th year, its Responsible Distribution program also provides a solid framework to keep members' employees and communities safer, added Brainerd.

UP TO THE CHALLENGE

Regulatory overreach has been – and will continue to be – NACD's priority, says president Eric Byer

Delivering the president's report, Eric Byer referred to the "exciting and unique challenges" of the past year, celebrating NACD's achievements for its legislative and regulatory initiatives.

In addition to a successful Washington Fly In event, NACD has continued to grow its congressional site visit program to help develop relationships with members of the House and Senate.

He added that NACD had championed new TSCA legislation – to upgrade the regulation of chemicals for the first time in 40 years, and addressed Surface Transportation Board reform. It had rallied against OSHA's expansion of the process safety management standard that would have extended applicability to more NACD members, and worked on passing legislation to prevent unauthorized drone surveillance of chemical facilities.

It also stopped the Department of Transportation from prohibiting the co-mingling of shipments of chemicals, as well as challenging EPA's proposal to increase the Risk Management Program mandates.



RAISING THE BAR

This year's theme, Pride and Passion, encapsulates NACD and its Responsible Distribution program

NACD Annual Meeting chairman Doug Brown welcomed the 660 attendees to this year's event by stressing the high levels of performance and myriad achievements of the association and its members. Pride and Passion was the theme of the meeting and provided the backdrop for a packed program of speakers, seminars and networking.

"We must proudly tell people around us about the excellence of Responsible Distribution, our zeal for continuous improvement, our best in class performance, and our leadership in our industry and our communities," he said.

Brown pointed specifically to the many successes of the association's Responsible Distribution program.

"After Bhopal in 1984, we needed to do something dramatic to ensure the survival of our industry," said Brown. "We had to come up with a solution that would make the situation better for our membership, while at the same time positively changing the perception of our industry to those outside. We're now celebrating the 25th anniversary of Responsible Distribution."





LEADING BY EXAMPLE

Courage is a key attribute of any successful leader, says Annual Meeting speaker Mike Staver

The three pitfalls for leaders, said author and coach Mike Staver at this year's Annual Meeting, is the need to be right, the need to be in control and to be all things to all people. Instead, he said, a strong leader has the courage to stick firmly to what they believe in and to manage their teams effectively.

Staver's keynote speech provided insight into the ever-changing demands of leadership in today's tough business environment. "One of the great marks of a courageous leader is having certainty," he said. "The most important steps you

can take as a leader are accepting your circumstances, creating a culture of responsibility instead of blame, and showing that you're committed to action and forward momentum.

"The greatest challenge of being a courageous leader is bridging the gap between what you intend to do and what you actually do, between what you intend your people to accomplish and what they actually accomplish."

Accepting and confronting any difficulties along the way paves the way to success, he said.



A LEARNING PROCESS

Introducing a mentoring program to your business could help save money, boost profit and retain staff

Consultant Laura Varner took the opportunity at this year's event to stress how distributors could benefit by incorporating a mentoring program into their business plans.


Supporting staff and encouraging their development through these initiatives is a proven method of enhancing performance, improving job satisfaction and ultimately, boosting your bottom line, she said.

Studies have shown that mentoring can provide significant returns, both for the company and its employees – and all for a fairly minimal investment. Time and careful planning is all that is required, she noted.

Arguably, one of the biggest positives is the retention of staff. Both mentors and mentees are far more likely to stay at a company if they participate in a mentoring program, said Varner – with both parties feeling more integral to the business.

"The cost of an employee replacement today is somewhere between 10-50% of their annual salary so it definitely affects your bottom line," she said.








