1. Introduction

This privacy statement concerns the collection, use and sharing of personal data, in particular names and contact details, of Leading Teachers in the EU Code Week and related to the purposes of the organisation and management of EU Code Week.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the collection and processing of personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you may exercise in relation to your data (the right to access, rectify, block etc.).

The European institutions are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. As this service/application collects and further processes personal data, Regulation (EU) 2018/1725¹ is applicable.

2. Why do we process your data?

Purpose of the processing operation: The European Commission collects and publishes your personal information to facilitate the identification of contact points by stakeholders or project/programme beneficiaries. Offering real persons as contact points is often the best and most efficient way to ensure that interested people can get in contact with Commission services.

Lawfulness of the processing operation: The processing operations on personal data for the publication of contact points are necessary and lawful under the following articles of the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725:

- article 5.1 (a): processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest, namely the implementation of the EU Code Week as part of the Digital Single Market Strategy. It is therefore lawful under Article 42 Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

and/or

- article 5.1 (d): The data subject has given consent to the processing of his or her personal data for one or more specific purposes.(Article 5.1(d) Regulation (EU) 2018/1725). The consent is provided and recorded in an electronic form.

3. Which data do we collect and process?

Personal data collected are information which make your identification as a contact point easier and increase your visibility for the public. This includes in particular: title, name, surname, position, professional postal & e-mail addresses, phone number, EU Code Week activity.

These personal data are provided by you on a voluntary basis, by filling out the application form for Leading Teachers and by sharing your information with us for specific activities in the campaign.

4. How long do we keep your data?

DG Connect keeps the data for as long as you serve as a Leading Teacher. Personal data may be further kept in a data base for contacting you for participating in future activities if you have agreed to this.

All personal data will be deleted from databases 1 year after you have put an end to your functions as a Leading Teacher and if you have not given your agreement to be included in the database for future activities.

5. How do we protect your data?

All data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, uploaded batches of data etc.) are stored either on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors, namely GOPA Com. S.A. and EUN Partnership AISBL, in line with its decision C(2006)3602 of 16 August 2006 concerning the security of information systems used by the European Commission. The Commission's contractors are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your data on behalf of the Commission.

6. Who has access to your data and to whom is it disclosed?

All personal data provided by you can be accessed by the European Commission and its contractors, your respective national Edu Coordinators, Code Week Ambassadors and Leading Teachers.

Your personal data may become part of a database (please see notification DPO-3718) with the purpose of facilitating our future interaction with you as a stakeholder in your areas of interest. If you do not wish to be included in this database, please write to school@codeweek.eu.

Your personal data may be used by the European Commission for internal quantitative and qualitative analyses of the stakeholders' contributions. The results of such analyses may only be published in an anonymised form.

7. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You are entitled to have access to your personal data and to request the erasure, restriction, portability, or rectification if the data is inaccurate or incomplete. To do so, please contact the data controller as provided in the contact information below (section 8).
