### Update on works at Adelaide Local Nature Reserve



### HS<sub>2</sub> update

Costain Skanska Joint Venture (CSJV) on behalf of HS2 Ltd took over responsibility for the Adelaide Local Nature Reserve (LNR) site in September 2017. CSJV plan to build additional habitats and ecological enhancements so that animals from other HS2 construction sites may be rehomed at the nature reserve if necessary.

The following features have been added to the site to complement the existing biodiversity:

- a hibernation site suitable for amphibians and reptiles
- three log piles to support fungi and insects
- a stag beetle loggery
- an invertebrate hotel
- three bat boxes
- two hedgehog boxes.

In addition, repairs to the internal fence line have been completed and the fencing along the trackside upgraded. A new bench has also been installed.

HS2 Ltd, CSJV and Camden Council are pleased to support Adelaide Nature Reserve Association (ANRA) and Belsize and Adelaide Green Gym (BAGG) in promoting their 'Community Open Day' being held on Sunday 25 March.

#### Ventilation shaft

To the east of the nature reserve is 'Chalk Farm Embankment'. This land is currently managed by Network Rail and is where the HS<sub>2</sub> Adelaide Road ventilation shaft will be constructed.

In Summer 2017, HS2 Ltd appointed the Main Works Civils Contractor SCS Railways, responsible for the design and build of the tunnels and shafts at Adelaide Road. They are currently progressing the detailed design. The estimated programme for construction works at Adelaide Road is for clearance construction activity to start on site in summer 2019 with construction of the ventilation shaft to follow in early 2020. SCS Railways and HS2 Ltd will continue to keep you updated as more information becomes available.

ANRA and BAGG invite you to take part in volunteering opportunities at Adelaide Local Nature Reserve

Adelaide is one of four local nature reserves in Camden, which are designated and protected to provide access to nature for the local community. Adelaide LNR is home to some of the best of the borough's wildlife including a summer meadow, a pond, native hedgerow and a small woodland supporting a wealth of insects, birds and mammals.

The site became a nature reserve in 1985. The Adelaide Nature Reserve Association was formed to help look after the new nature reserve. In 2006 the site received prestigious Local Nature Reserve status.

ANRA, run by volunteers, do practical conservation tasks and conduct bird and wildflower surveys. The group meets at the nature reserve the last Sunday of every month, between 10:45 and 2pm. Many different groups have volunteered at the nature reserve but in recent years the most significant initiative has been The Green Gym. This combines conservation work with some simple exercises. ANRA is supported by Belsize and Adelaide Green Gym.

## Wildlife often found on the nature reserve:

Green woodpeckers descend on the meadow to feed on the colonies of yellow meadow ants

The main pond supports newts with a dipping platform for exploring the pond life

Some rare galls (plant growths) have been found here by an expert from the London Natural History Society

In summer there are numerous butterfly species

Bats fly around the meadow in summer feeding on insects

Foxes breed on site and are often seen locally

A very rare insect – the Barbary Bug – was found here one year but sadly has not returned

The meadow is alive with grasshoppers and crickets in the summer including rare species
