



NOTICE OF GROUND INVESTIGATION SURVEYS

What are we doing?

As part of developing the route design of the HS2 high speed railway, we are carrying out ground investigation surveys in **Lawn Close**. The site will set up on Friday 17 November and drilling will start from week beginning Monday 20 November. A borehole will be drilled and the work will take approximately up to two weeks (weekdays only) between 8am and 6pm.

This type of survey helps us to understand more about the ground where we want to build the railway. It is important that we know about the soil before construction begins so we can build effectively. How will this affect me?

The work will involve using drilling equipment to dig an inspection pit and borehole to take samples or measurements. The borehole will be sunk to a depth of up to 45 metres using large vertical drilling equipment on the grassed area at the end of the close. We recognise that the area is used by the community and will endeavour to restrict our activities to half of the green space.

Our contractor will work as quickly as they can, avoid unnecessary noise and keep the area tidy. Once the work is complete, our contractor will restore the area to its previous condition. We apologise in advance for any inconvenience that this may cause.

- Weekday working hours
- Working hours between 8am and 6pm
- Our contractors may also be on site for one hour's start-up and shutdown.

What to expect

- Background noise from drilling boreholes and digging trial pits and the use of water pumps
- Hoarding around the site
- Contractor vehicle movements to and from site.

What we will do

- Inform you in advance of any changes to the dates shown
- Keep all sites safe and secure
- Ensure that all sites are reinstated to the required standard.
