NOTICE OF GROUND INVESTIGATION SURVEYS

What are we doing?

As part of developing the route design of the HS2 high speed railway, we are carrying out ground investigation surveys on the area of open space in the middle of **Roundways** (see map overleaf). A site compound is expected to be erected on **Thursday 18 January**. Drilling work is likely to start from the week beginning **Monday 22 January**. A borehole will be drilled and the work will take approximately up to **2 weeks** (weekdays only) with working hours between 8am and 6pm.

Due to the nature of ground investigation there is a chance that unforeseen circumstance may change these dates by approximately two weeks. In the event that the timings of these works change by over two weeks, we will endeavour to give you adequate prior notice. Apologies in advance for any inconvenience this may cause.

This type of survey helps us get a better understanding of the existing ground and groundwater conditions. This information can then be used to enable the new railway to be safely constructed. How will this affect me?

The work will involve using drilling equipment to dig an inspection pit and borehole to take samples or measurements. The borehole will be sunk to a depth of up to 45 metres using large vertical drilling equipment.

Our contractor will work as quickly as they can, avoid unnecessary noise and keep the area tidy. Once the work is complete, our contractor will restore the area to its previous condition.
