What is happening

We are undertaking two pieces of work. A series of ground investigation, which require some vegetation clearance and a survey of utility services in the area.

Ground investigations

Ground investigation will give us more information about the type, strength and details of the land where the new railway will be built. These investigations will help us to confirm the land is suitable for the structures that we want to build.

To understand the ground beneath the proposed viaduct we need to drill holes into the ground to extract samples of the soil for testing. To do this we use drilling rigs which are small enough to be towed by an off-road vehicle. These works will be taking place on sites (shown on map) along the Grand Union Canal using existing accesses off Moorhall Road.

Vegetation clearance

To provide enough room for our drill rigs to access the areas where we need to take the soil samples, we will have to carry out a small amount of tree removal and vegetation clearance.

To make sure that we do not impact on protected species such as bats our ecologists have visited the sites and inspected the trees to be removed. Further to this, to meet our environmental commitments, we will have to replace any lost habitat.

Utility survey

We need to conduct a utility survey (shown on map) of the gas main that runs through the Moorhall Road area to find its exact location and condition to determine whether it needs to be moved for the construction of the viaduct. This will be done by hand-excavators to help protect the gas main during the activity.

How may this affect you

Our working hours will be 8am – 6pm Monday to Friday and 8am – 1pm Saturday, apart from two sections of the works.

For the ground investigation works taking place north west of Korda Lake between 4 March –18 March our working hours will be 7am – 7pm daily including Saturday and Sunday. We do not anticipate that these works will be disruptive.

The utility survey on the 11 March is being carried out around Moorhall Road. We will need to set up temporary traffic management. To make sure we cause as little disruption as we can and so that we can carry out the work as safely as possible two way lights will operate between 9.30am and 3.30pm.

During the vegetation clearance taking place 18 – 25 February there will be managed pedestrian access on Public Right of Way U75. Shown on the map overleaf, this path heads along the Grand Union Canal south of Moorhall Road and the London Loop and Colne Valley Trail. This is to ensure the safety of the public as we undertake our works.


