## Notice of works on the Embankment near the River Pinn

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. As part of developing the design of the new railway, we are carrying out further ground investigation works in your area. The results will build on the information we already have from work done in 2017, helping us get a better understanding of the ground conditions in your area.

We will be working at two locations next to the Chiltern line railway, one near the River Pinn and the other at West Ruislip. As this work is taking place on railway property we have to do the work at night when no trains are running. Please see the blue panel for the dates and times of work.

### What are we doing on the railway embankment?

We will be working to the north of the Chiltern Lines near the River Pinn. During the works you will see poles being pushed into the ground, with staff taking measurements. For some parts of the work a generator is needed to power equipment. This will be surrounded with acoustic barriers to minimise noise.

Work on the Ickenham Road Bridge will happen between 4 - 9 August

Work on the railway embankment next to the River Pinn will happen between 11-14 August

Due to the need to work on the railway embankment for both activities the working hours will be  
 Sunday: 1am to 7.45am  
 Monday: 12.30am to 5.30am  
 Tuesday to Friday: 1 am to 5.10am

### What to expect

Sites will be secured with barriers. Drilling equipment and mobile units will be on site

Where a generator is needed acoustic barriers will be used

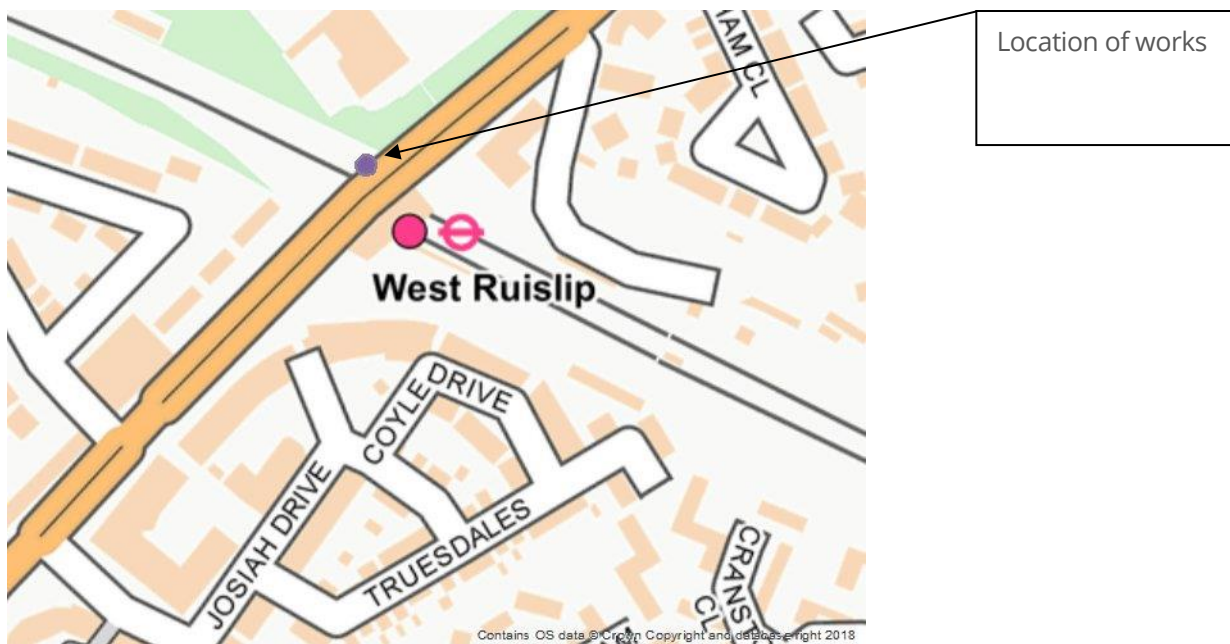
## What are we doing at the bridge?

At the bridge carrying Ickenham Road over the railway at West Ruislip we will be drilling into the bridge. We will be carrying out horizontal ground investigation to understand the exact nature of the bridge structure, building upon previous surveys. This requires us to work from the Network Rail land to the west of the bridge.

During the investigation, you may see poles being pushed into the bridge from the side, with staff taking measurements. For some parts of the activity a generator may be used. This will be surrounded by acoustic barriers to minimise noise.

As the activity will take place next to the operational railway, the work will be happening between the hours shown on the blue panel on the front page.
