Update: Notice of works on the Embankment near the River Pinn

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. As part of developing the design of the new railway, we are carrying out further ground investigation works in your area. The results will build on the information we already have from work done in 2017, helping us get a better understanding of the ground conditions in your area.

You will have received a notification similar to this around 3 weeks ago when these works were originally planned. We had to postpone the works due to circumstances outside of our control.

We will be working at two locations next to the Chiltern line railway, one near the River Pinn and the other at West Ruislip. We are working extended day time hours on the weekend when trains are not running.

What are we doing on the railway embankment?

We will be working on the higher part of the embankment, to the north of the Chiltern Lines near the River Pinn. You will see poles being pushed into the ground, with staff taking measurements. For some parts of the work a generator is needed to power equipment. This will be surrounded with acoustic barriers to minimise the impact of the noise.

Update: Notice of work at West Ruislip Bridge

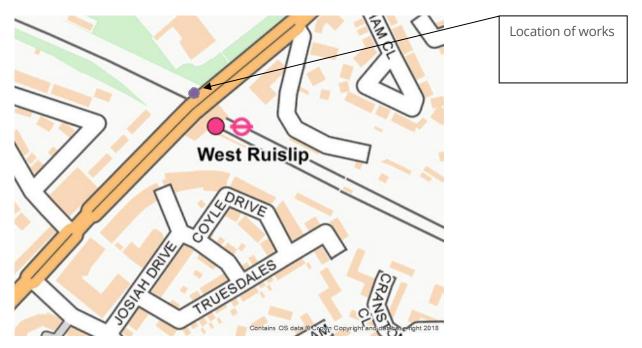

What are we doing at the West Ruislip Bridge?

At the bridge carrying lckenham Road over the railway at West Ruislip we will be drilling into the bridge. We will be carrying out horizontal and vertical ground investigation to understand the exact nature of the bridge structure, building upon previous surveys. This requires us to work from the Network Rail land to the west of the bridge.

During the investigation, you may see poles being pushed into the bridge from the side, with staff taking measurements. For some parts of the activity a generator may be used. This will be surrounded by acoustic barriers to minimise noise.



Why are you working extended hours on a weekend?

As the activity will take place next to the operational railway, the work has to happen when we can gain safe access to the land when trains are not running. This had previously meant working at night. While we will be working longer hours than usual on a weekend, we will not now be working at night.
