Notice of utility works starting for pipeline diversion near Middleton

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Cadent needs to move an existing gas pipeline near Church Lane, north east of Middleton, to facilitate HS2's construction and to continue to ensure a safe and reliable gas supply.

What are we doing?

We have finished the preparation works and vegetation clearance north east of Middleton. We will be starting site set-up and work to move the pipeline at the end of May 2019 and expect all the work to be completed by April 2020. The work includes:

- Setting up a temporary works compound north east of Middleton. We'll also set up a new site access from the A4091
- Digging a trench for the new pipeline route
- Welding the pipe together then installing it in the trench
- Connecting and testing the new pipe

There will be 24-hour security on site so we can maintain a safe working environment. Please note, there will be no on-site lodging.

How will this affect you?

Our site access will be directly off the A4091. Setting up a new access here means none of our construction vehicles will need to travel along Church Lane or through Middleton to get to our site.

The new site access has been discussed with Warwickshire County Council and HS2.

We will be using the existing layby off the A4091 so our vehicles can enter and exit the site safely. This means the layby will be closed to other users, but we will put signs in place to make everyone aware of this.

Duration of work

- Late May 2019 to April 2020
- Our core working hours will be 8.00am to 6.00pm (Mon-Fri) and 8.00am to 1.00pm (Sat)
- We will be on-site one hour either side of these times for set-up and close-down

What to expect

- Access off the A4091, so construction traffic will not travel along Church Lane or through Middleton
- The layby off the A4091 will be closed to the public
- We will be using standard construction equipment and vehicles. This will be during normal HS2 working hours.
- 24-hour security on site
- Utility supplies in the area will not be affected by these works

What we will do

- Inform you as our work progresses
- Make sure there is minimal disruption to local people
- Maintain a safe working environment
