Notice of survey works at Coleshill Embankment

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Western Power Distribution (WPD) has been asked to support preparations for the construction of the railway. As a part of this work, WPD will be undertaking surveys in the local area.

Surveys taking place

From 23 to 27th January 2019 we will be carrying out surveys adjacent to the M42 near the Birmingham Road as it passes through Coleshill.

These surveys will involve the drilling of bore holes to a depth of 10m by a small team, no larger than five people, using specialised machinery to carry out the works. There will also be hand excavated trial pits, dug to a depth of 1.2m by a team of two people.

The surveys will guide future work in the area. This is necessary to plan the future removal of an existing 132kV overhead cable and replacing this with an underground cable.

The survey work will last approximately five days and will move across the highlighted area of the map overleaf.

We will be on site from 23 January 2019 until 27 January 2019.

Our working hours will be 8.00am to 6.00pm (Mon-Fri) and 8.00am to 1.00pm (Sat).

There will be no traffic management as we will not be closing any lanes or roads for the duration of the works.

Roads will be kept clear at all times.

Inform you in advance of any changes to the dates shown.


Notice of survey works at Coleshill Embankment
