High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Western Power Distribution (WPD) has been asked to support preparations for the construction of the railway. As a part of this work, WPD will be undertaking surveys in the local area.

We're doing ground surveys

From 20 May to 24 May 2019 we will be carrying out surveys adjacent to the A446.

These surveys will help us to identify any existing assets in the grass verge adjacent to the A446 layby, which is south of Watton Lane and north of Gorsey Lane.

We're using non-intrusive surveys

We'll be using Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) surveys to identify any existing utilities assets. This involves using non-intrusive equipment, including a Cable Avoidance Tool (CAT).

There won't be any road closures

We will maintain full access to the road and we'll inform you in advance if there are any changes.

Keep all sites safe and secure


