Brazil is half a continent and a unique mix of cultures: Pre-Columbian, African and European. SAFER SEX

Safer sex guidelines are a simple and effective way of reducing your risk of contracting the AIDS virus. It is not the number of sex partners you have that matters, but what you do together. Basically, the advice is simple;

*Avoid any sexual activity which exposes you to your partner's body fluids - particularly semen and vaginal secretions.

*If you have anal or vaginal intercourse use a condom and a water based lubricant e.g. KY Jelly. Some lubricants are oil based and will damage the condom.

*Avoid activities which expose you and your partner to each other's blood.

However, human sexuality is very varied in its expression. This basic advice will give us an understanding of the levels of risk for our various sexual activities:



Safe

Kissing Hugging, Holding and Cuddling Body to body rubbing Mutual Masturbation

Low Risk

Oral sex - both fellatio and cunnilingus (mouth to penis and mouth to vagina contact)

Anal or vaginal intercourse with a condom (the risk here is if the condom breaks or slips off which is very unlikely IF the condom is used properly) Watersports (urinating on skin without cuts or sores). Swallowing semen.

Risky

Sharing dildoes, sex toys or douches, Rimming (mouth to anus contact). Watersports in your mouth or on broken skin.

Very Risky

Anal or vaginal intercourse without a condom.
