## STEERING COLLECTIVE REPORT

AT THE RECALL MEETING IN FEBRUARY 1982 , IT WAS DECIDED TO HAVE A RADICALLY DIFFERENT STRUCTURE FROM THE CORK CONFERENCE IN 1981 .

## WE AGREED :

- I. TO HAVE BOTH BLOCK WORKSHOPS , ON SPECIFIC THEMES RELEVENT TO BOTH LESBIANS AND GAY MEN , AND OPEN WORKSHOPS RATHER THAN A PROLIFERATION OF SMALL WORKSHOPS , CULMINATING IN A MULTITUDE OF MOTIONS AT A FINAL PLENARY SESSION .
- 2. IN VIEW OF THE SMALL NUMBER OF LESBIANS AT THE CORK CONFERENCE, THE DUBLIN CONFERENCE SHOULD BE STRUCTURED SO AS TO ENCOURAGE THE PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN .
- 3. IT WAS AGREED THAT THERE SHOULD BE A CORE OF 4 MAIN WORKSHOPS :
- A. COMING OUT/PERSONAL LIBERATION/FEAR OF POLITICS.
- B. GAYS IN A PATRIARCHIAL SOCIETY
- C. GAYS AT WORK/TRADE UNIONS.
- D. STRUCTURES FOR DEVELOPEMENT/A UNITED GAY MOVEMENT

IN OUR CHOICE OF WORKSHOPS, FILM, VIDEOS, AND ADVERTISING WE TRIED TO DRAW IN AS MANY WOMEN AS POSSIBLE; EMPHESING THE LINKS BETWEEN LESBIANS AND GAY MEN IN OUR STRUGGLE FOR GAY LIBERATION, BUT ALSO POINTING OUT TO GAY MEN THE FACT OF WOMEN'S OPPRESSION IN SOCIETY GENERALLY.

IN PREPARATION FOR THE BLOCK WORKSHOPS WE PRODUCED, AFTER DISC--USSION AMONG THE GROUP, A SERIES OF GUIDELINES. THESE WERE INTENDED AS LEAD-OFF POINTS TO STIMULATE, RATHER THAN DICTATE, THE DISCUSSIONS.

WE ALSO SET ASIDE TIME AND SPACE FOR PEOPLE TO CALL WORKSHOPS ON

ANY TOPIC OF THEIR CHOICE.
THE CONFERENCE CONCLUDED WITH A PLENARY SESSION, AT WHICH WE HEARD A REPORT BACK FROM EVERY WORKSHOP AND ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE VARIOUS NEW GROUPS FORMED ( ACTION FOR LESBIAN MOTHERS, GAYS AT WORK GROUP, DUBLIN GAY COLLECTIVE, GAY ALCOHOLICS GROUP).
A NUMBER OF SPECIFIC RESOLUTIONS WERE ALSO PASSED AT THE PLENARY SESSION (SEE PRESS RELEASE FOR LIST).

A PRESS RELEASE WAS ISSUED FOLLOWING THE FINAL SESSION .

## PUBLICITY

IN DEALING WITH PUBLICITY WE IDENTIFIED FOUR SEPERATE AREAS :

- I. MEDIA
- 2. PROGRESSIVE GROUPS
- 3. INDIVIDUALS
- 4. LEAFLETS AND POSTERS

## . MEDIA

THIS HEADING INCLUDES NATIONAL, LOCAL AND COMMUNITY NEWSPAPERS, NATIONAL AND ALTERNATIVE MAGASINES; TELEVISION AND RADIO STATIONS.

WE FEEL IT IS VITAL TO MAKE CONTACT WITH JOURNALISTS/REPORTERS WELL IN ADVANCE, SENDING INFORMATION TO THE NEWS, FEATURES AND WOMENS SECTIONS; AND TO LOCATE INDIVIDUAL JOURNALISTS WHO MAY BE SYMPHATHETIC. A CONTACT NAME AND TELEPHONE NUMBER SHOULD BE INCL--UDED WITH ALL INFORMATION. CONSTANT CONTACT WITH JOURNALISTS AND PERHAPS A PRESS RECEPTION IN THE WEEKS PRECEEDING THE CONFERENCE WOULD IMPROVE THE POSSIBILITY OF WIDESPREAD COVERAGE.

IN OUR EXPERIENCE, JOURNALISTS WILL NOT BE INTERESTED SIMPLY IN INFORMATION ON THE CONFERENCE, BUT WILL WANT AN 'ANGLE' ON WHICH TO BASE AN ARTICLE (THE STORY WILL NEED TO BE VIRTUALLY WRITTEN FOR THEM). IN THE CASE OF LAST YEAR'S CONFERENCE THE ISSUES WHICH INTERESTED THEM WERE THE KINCORA AFFAIR, THE CHARLES SELF MURDER AND SUBSEQUENT POLICE HARRASSMENT; AND THE L.G.P.S.U. MOTION IN FAVOUR OF LEGAL PROTECTION FOR GAY WORKERS.

ALSO, SHORTLY BEFORE THE CONFERENCE IT IS WORTHWHILE TO A LETTER TO THE LETTERS PAGE OF ALL THE NEWSPAPERS, INSERT AN ADVERTISEMENT IN THE PERSONAL/CLASSIFIED COLUMN OF THE DAILY AND EVENING PAPERS; AND TO GIVE THE CONFERENCE DETAILS TO THE 'WHAT'S ON' COLUMN OF PAPERS, MAGAZINES ETC..

### 2. PROGRESSIVE GROUPS

BY PROGRESSIVE GROUPS WE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING : GAY GROUPS(BOTH HERE AND ABROAD); WOMEN'S GROUPS; TRADE UNION PAPERS AND NEWSLETTERS; STUDENT UNION MAGAZINES AND MISC. GROUPS SUCH AS THE I.C.C.L., C.N.D. ETC.
THESE SHOULD BE CONTACTED WELL IN ADVANCE, AND WE FOUND IT USEFUL TO ADOPT PARTICULAR LETTER FORMATS FOR THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF ORGANISATIONS. (SEE THE APPENDIX FOR SAMPLE LETTERS)
WE ALSO USED, WHERE POSSIBLE, THE INFORMATION NETWORK OF THESE ORGANISATIONS E.G. U.S.I. COOPERATED BY SENDING OUT LEAFLETS, POSTERS ETC. TO OVER 50 COLLEGES IN THEIR MAIN-MAILING.

## 3. INDIVIDUALS

WE CONTACTED ALL THOSE WHO HAD ATTENDED PREVIOUS CONFERENCES, MEETING ETC.; ANY ACTIVISTS WE KNEW OF AND REQUESTED THE GAY ORGANISATIONS TO INCLUDE INFORMATION IN THEIR MAIL-OUT TO THEIR MEMBERSHIP.

POSTERS SHOULD BE PRINTED AND DISTRIBUTED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. FLY POSTERING IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT IN SOME AREAS AND IT WOULD BE UP TO LOCAL GROUPS TO DECIDE HOW FEASIBLE THIS IS. POSTERING CAN ALSO BE DONE IN SUPPORTIVE BOOKSHOPS, ARTS CENTRES, THEATRES, STUDENT CENTRES, WOMEN'S CENTRES, GAY PUBS AND ANY WHERE ELSE POSSIBLE.

WHERE IT IS DIFFICULT TO POSTER WE SUGGEST STICKERS (E.G. LESBIAN CONFERENCE STICKERS). THESE ARE CHEAP TO MASS PRODUCE AND DISTRIBUTE; AND CAN BE EASILY PLACED IN ALMOST ANY LOCATION.

IT IS ALSO USEFUL TO PRODUCE A CHEAP LEAFLET , WHICH GIVES THE BASIC INFORMATION ON THE CONFERENCE AND CAN BE DISTRIBUTED IN GAY PUBS , DISCOS ETC .

## \* RE ADVANCE PUBLICITY :

- INVITE PEOPLE FROM SPARE RIB , GAY NEWS ETC. TO CARRY ARTICLES ON THE CONFERENCE .
- 2. ASK PEOPLE TO WRITE ARTICLES FOR THEIR LOCAL MAGAZINES, GROUP NEWS-LETTERS, GAY NEWSPAPERS ETC.
- 3. HAVE YOUR OWN PHOTOGRAPHER PRESENT AT THE CONFERENCE.
- 4. HAVE AT LEAST ONE PERSON WITH SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR DEALING WITH THE PRESS AT THE CONFERENCE AND/OR SOME FACILITY FOR BRIEFING ANY JOURNALISTS WHO TURN UP.

### WOMEN'S REPORT

80 WOMEN REGISTERED AT THE START OF THE CONFERENCE, AN EXCEPTIONALLY LARGE NUMBER FOR A MIXED EVENT SUCH AS THIS. THIS STRONG LESBIAN ATTEND-ENCE, AND THE ENJOYMENT OF THE FILM ('TOWN BLOODY HALL') AND DISCO, CREATED AN AIR OF OPTIMISM FOR THE CONFERENCE AS A WHOLE.

THIS WAS QUICKLY DISPELLED BY THE SECOND WORKSHOP ON 'PATRIARCHY' . IT
MIGHT HAVE BEEN PRESUMED THAT MOST OF THE MEN THERE WOULD HAVE SOME BASIC
GRASP OF SEXUAL POLITICS - THIS PROVED WRONG . APART FROM A MINORITY OF
GAY MEN WHO HAD MADE SOME EFFORT TO TACKLE THEIR OWN SEXISM , THE BULK WERE
EITHER AGRESSIVELY DEFENSIVE , OR BLISSFULLY UNAWARE OF THEIR OWN OPPRESSIVE
ROLE IN A PATRIARCHIAL SOCIETY . THE ANALYSIS OF MANY OF THESE MEN WAS THE
MOST SIMPLISTIC POSSIBLE - SINCE THEY WERE OPPRESSED BY A HETEROSEXUAL
SOCIETY , ALL SEXUAL OPPRESSION WAS HETEROSEXUAL .PUT EVEN SIMPLER, IF THEY
DID NOT RELATE SEXUALLY TO WOMEN , THEY COULD NOT OPPRESS THEM ! MANY
APPEARED DISCONCERTED AT THE LARGE NUMBER OF WOMEN PRESENT , PERPLEXED BY
THE INCLUSION OF A BLOCK WORKSHOP ON PATRIARCHY AND INCREASINGLY RESENTFUL
AT THE CHALLENGE TO THEIR IDEAS . MOST OF THE WOMEN , IN TURN , WERE RED-UCED TO FRUSTRATED FURY BY THE IGNORANCE AND/OR MISOGENY THEY ENCOUNTERED
IN THE WORKSHOP.

THOSE WOMEN WHO HAD ALREADY BEEN DUBIOUS ABOUT PARTICIPATING IN A MIXED CONFERENCE HAD THEIR WORST SUSPICIONS CONFIRMED. FROM THIS POINT ON, MOST OF THE SESSIONS, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE WORKSHOP ON 'WORK' AND THE PLENARY, WERE DIVIDED INTO SEPERATE WOMEN ONLY AND ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY, MEN ONLY WORKSHOPS.

DISCUSSION IN THE WOMEN'S WORKSHOP LED TO THE FORMATION OF AN'ACTION FOR LESBIAN MOTHERS' GROUP - A MUCH NEEDED DEVELOPEMENT. THE OVERALL MOOD WAS ONE OF ANGER, AND THIS MEANT THAT MUCH OF THE DISCUSSION FOCUSSED ON THE DIFFERENCES BETWEEN GAY MEN AND WOMEN, AND THE UNDESTRABILITY OF WORKING IN A MIXED MOVEMENT. THERE WAS, HOWEVER, NO DISCUSSION OF THE POLITICAL DIFFERENCES AMONG LESBIANS THEMSELVES E.G. THE VERY DIFFERENT APPROACHES OF LESBIAN SEPERATISTS AND SOCIALIST LESBIANS.

ON THE POSITIVE SIDE, MANY OTHERWISE ISOLATED WOMEN ESTABLISHED CONTACT WITH OTHER LESBIANS, THE CONFERENCE GAVE A GRANT TOWARDS THE LESBIAN CONFERENCE, AND THE PLENARY VOTED OVERWHELMINGLY TO AFFILIATE TO THE ANTI-AMENDMENT CAMPAIGN AND THE WOMEN'S RIGHT TO CHOOSE CAMPAIGN. HOWEVER THE 1983 CONFERENCE ORGANISERS WILL HAVE AN UPHILL STRUGGLE TO PERSUADE MANY OF THE WOMEN TO ATTEND ANOTHER MIXED CONFERENCE.

INITIALLY, DETAILED ATTENTION WAS GIVEN TO THE PRESENT STRUCTURES, PARTICULARILY THE TWO DUBLIN-BASED 'NATIONAL' ORGANISATIONS . THERE WAS GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT , WHATEVER THEIR ORIGINAL INTENTIONS, THE ORGANISATIONS HAD GRAVE 'IN-BUILT' DEFECTS , AND HAD ALSO DEVELOPED OTHERS . SPECIFICALLY , IT WAS AGREED THAT :-

THEIR HIERARCHIAL RIGID STRUCTURES ARE ALIENATING BOTH TO THE

CASUAL AND THE COMMITTED MEMBERS.

: THEY HAD DONE LITTLE OR NOTHING TO RAISE THE VERY LOW GAY AWARENESS OF MOST OF THEIR MEMBERS.

: THEY HAD DONE NOTHING OBSERVABLE TO OVERCOME THE FREQUENTLY APPALLING SEXISM OF A GREAT MANY OF THEIR MEMBERS.

: THEY HAD GREATLY OVER-FOCUSSED THEIR ENERGIES IN PROPERTY ACQUISITION AND EMBELLISHMENT .

: IN BOTH , THE DISCO WAS THE ONLY CONSTANT FACTOR - OTHER ACTIVITIES SEEMED EPHEMERAL .

: VERY LITTLE SENSE OF SUPPORTIVENESS WAS GENERATED BETWEEN THE MEMBERS .

DESPITE THIS GENERAL AGREEMENT , THERE WAS DISAGREEMENT ON WHETHER OR NOT THESE ORGANISATIONS COULD REALLY COME TO SERVE THE GAY COMMUNITY . MANY FELT THAT THE STRUCTURAL FAULTS WERE IRREDEEMABLE AND THAT THE ORGANISATIONS SHOULD BE IGNORED . OTHERS FELT THAT VERY CONSIDERABLE XPERTISE AND RESOURCES COULD BE REDIRECTED , AND THAT IT WOULD BE VALUABLE IF PEOPLE WORKED WITHIN THE ORGANISATIONS AIMING SPECIFICALLY TO ELIMINATE THE ABOVE DEFECTS .

DURING THE DISCUSSION IT WAS UNANIMOUSLY AGREED THAT THE 'SPLIT' BETWEEN THE TWO NATIONAL GROUPS WAS UNIMPORTANT, AND THAT IT WAS IRRELEVANT WHETHER OR NOT THEY REJOINED. IT WAS ALSO AGREED THAT THE OVERALL NATIONAL 'UMBRELLA' GROUP (PROPOSED AT LAST YEAR'S CONFERENCE) WOULD JUST ADD ANOTHER LEVEL TO THE HIERARCHY AND THAT THE PROPOSAL SHOULD BE IGNORED.

THERE WAS MUCH DISCUSSION ABOUT , AND ADMIRATION FOR , THE ACHIEVEMENTS AND STRUCTURE OF THE CORK GAY COLLECTIVE . IT WAS GENERALLY FELT THAT THE COLLECTIVE MODEL OFFERED THE MOST PROMISING WAY FORWARD . THE MODEL INCLUDED THE FOLLOWING ATTRIBUTES :-

- : AN OPEN NON-HIERARCHIAL , UN BUREAUCRATIC STRUCTURE .
- : AN INHERENT FLEXIBILITY IN THE GROUP'S METHODS AND AIMS .
- : A STRUCTURE THAT IS INHERENTLY EQUAL AND ALSO NON-SEXIST .
- : A COMMITTMENT TO THE GROWTH IN GAY AWARENESS FOR ALL MEMBERS .
- : AN EFFECTIVE SUPPORTIVE FRAMEWORK FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL .

IT WAS ALSO NOTED THAT PERMANENCE WAS NOT AN ESSENTIAL ATTRIBUTE OF SUCH A GROUP, AND ALSO THAT SEVERAL COLLECTIVES, FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES, OR FOR SPECIFIC INTEREST GROUPS, MIGHT BE THE MOST VALUABLE OUTCOME.

IT WAS FINALLY NOTED WITH APPROVAL THAT 4 GROUPS WERE ALREADY BEING FORMED AS THE CONFERENCE PROCEEDED; THE DUBLIN GAY COLLECTIVE; THE GAYS AND ALCOHOLISM GROUP; THE GAYS AND TRADE UNION GROUP AND THE ACTION FOR LESBIAN MOTHERS GROUP.

FIGHT AGAINST.

THIS WORKSHOP WAS ATTENDED BY ABOUT 25 LESBIANS AND GAY MEN.

WE STARTED BY INTRODUCING OURSELVES AND GIVING SOME DETAILS.

OF OUR SITUATION AT WORK.

WE THEN TALKED ABOUT COMING OUT AT WORK AND WHETHER OR NOT EACH OF US WAS OUT AT WORK. QUITE A FEW U9F US ARE OUT, WHILE OTHERS FELT THAT THEY COULD NOT COME OUT BECAUSE OF THE DIFFICULTIES AND PROBLEMS IT COULD LEAD TO.

THERE WERE CLEAR DIFFERENCES AMONG US IN OUR FEELINGS ABOUT COMING OUT AT WORK. IT WAS CLEAR THAT PUBLIC SERVICE WORKERS, OTHER THAN TEACHERS, FELT MORE SECURE ABOUT COMING OUT. THEY COULD NOT SO EASILY BE SACKED AND THIS LEADS TO A GREATER SENSE OF SECURITY AT WORK. NONE HAD ANY ILLUSIONS THAT COMING OUT WOULD NOT AFFECT THEM AT WORK. IF IT DID NOT LEAD TO A CLEAR ATTACK ON JOB SECURITY, IT COULD LEAD TO DISCRIMINATION IN PROMOTION

THOSE WORKING IN PRIVATE BUSINESS FELT MUCH LESS WILLING TO COME OUT AT WORK. IT WAS SAID THAT IT COULD LEAD TO BEING SACKED AND MANY WERE UNSURE TO WHAT EXTENTIHOSE WORKING WITH THEM WOULD FIGHT ON THEIR BEHALF.

OR JOB PROSPECTS , WHICH COULD BE DIFFICULT TO IDENTIFY AND

THE TEACHER AMONG USEXPLAINED THAT IT WAS PARTICULARILY DIFFICULT TO COME OUT AT WORK, BOTH BECAUSE THE MANAGEMENT IS THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH, AND BECAUSE MANY WOULD SHOUT THE HOARY OLD MYTHS OF 'CHILD MOLESTER' AND SO ON . HE WASN'T SURE HIS UNION WOULD BE SYMPATHETIC IN SUCH A SITUATION. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT THIS SITUATION FACES MANY WORKERS IN SERVICES EFFECTIVELY CONTROLLED BY THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH, SUCH AS EDUCATION AND SOCIAL SERVICES.

THE WOMEN AMONG US FELT SPECIAL DIFFICULTIES AT WORK . ONE WOMAN SAID THAT SHE FELT SURE COMING OUT WOULD LEAD TO GREATER SEXUAL HARRASSMENT ON THE ,TO PUT IT CRUDELY, 'ALL A LESBIAN WOMAN NEEDS IS A GOOD MAN TO CURE HER 'VIEW . THE WOMEN GENERALLY FELT A GREAT DEAL OF PRESSURE AND DISCRIMINATION AT WORK AS WOMEN AND MOST HAD DECIDED THAT THEY COULD NOT AFFORD TO COME OUT .

WE THEN WENT ON TO DISCUSS WHETHER OR NOT IT WAS A GOOD THING TO COME OUT AT WORK . ALL AGREED IT WAS AND THOSE NOT OUT AT WORK WOULD BE IF THEY FELT MORE SUPPORT.

IT WAS SAID THAT NOT COMING OUT AT WORK LEADS TO GREAT STRAIN IN TRYING TO KEEP UP A'STRAIGHT IMAGE' . FICTITIOUS HETEROSEXUAL PARTNERS HAD TO BE INVENTED , YOU HAD TO GRIN AND BEAR WITH ANTI--GAY JOKES AND COMMENTS ; YOU COULDN'T EASILY COMMUNICATE WITH OTHERS AT WORK ON LIFE ON LIFE OUTSIDE WORK .

IT WAS SUGGESTED THAT WE ALL NEEDED SMALL SUPPORT GROUPS OF OTHER GAY WOMEN AND MEN TO HELP US AND GIVE US SUPPORT IN OUR LIVES GENERALLY , BUT PARTICULARILY AT WORK . BEING OPEN AND OUT AS GAY COULD NOT BE ACCOMPLISHED ALONE . COMING OUT AT WORK INVOLVED NOT ONLY THE STATEMENT "I AM GAY" , BUT ALSO THE BRINGING OF OUR GAY LIVES OUTSIDE WORK INTO THE WORKPLACE . THIS MEANS , FOR EXAMPLE , TALKING ABOUT WHAT WE DO DURING THE WEEKEND WHEN OUR STRAIGHT COLLEAGUES TALK ABOUT THEIR WEEKEND ACTIVITIES . TALKING ABOUT OUR LOVERS AND PARTNERS WHEN THEY TALK ABOUT THEIR PARTNERS.

IN A NUTSHELL, BEING BLATANTLY GAY AT WORK IN THE WAY THEY ARE BLATANTLY HETERSEXUAL. TO BE OUT IN THIS WAY WE NEED FIRSTLY, THE HELP OF BROTHERS AND SISTERS, TO TALK ABOUT HOW WE FEEL, THE DIFFICULTIES INVOLVED, TO BUILD STRENGTH AND CONFIDENCE, AS A REFUGE REFUGE IN WEAKNESS. SECONDLY WE NEED TO MAKE OUR LEGAL SITUATION STRONGER AND THIS BROUGHT US ONTO THE ISSUE OF TRADE UNIONS AND THE LABOUR MOVEMENT.

A SHORT HISTORY WAS GIVEN OF TRADE UNION ACTIVITY TO DATE, THE RESPON RESPONSES SENT BY UNIONS IN REPLY TO THE NGF QUESTIONNAIRE, THE STRUGGLE TO HAVE THE IRISH FEDERATION OF UNIVERSITY TEACHERS ADOPT A PRO-GAY POSITION, BACKED BY THE MEMBERSHIP IN THE FACE OF OPPOSITION FROM THE EXECUTIVE, AND THE PROCESS OF HAVING A PRO-GAY POSITION ADOPTED BY THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC SERVICES UNION (LGPSU).

THE POSITION AT THAT TIME WAS THAT EITHER OR BOTH IFUT AND LGPSU WOULD BE FORWARDING RESOLUTIONS TO THE FORTHCOMING IRISH CONGRESS OF TRADE UNIONS CONFERENCE IN BELFAST, CALLING ON THE ICTU TO BACK THE RIGHTS OF GAY WORKERS. THE IMMEDIATE TASK WAS TO ORGANISE LOBBYING OF DELEGATES ATTENDING THE WORKSHOP TO BACK IT.

IT WAS AGREED THAT THE CORK GAY COLLECTIVE WOULD PRODUCE A LEAFLET IN FAVOUR OF THE MOTION , THAT NIGRA WOULD ORGANISE A FRINGE MEETING ON THE ISSUE IF IT WAS FELT NECESSARY , AND THAT SOME OF US WOULD TRAVEL TO BELFAST TO ATTEND THE CONFERENCE .

THE ICTU CONFERENCE OVERWHELMINGLY PASSED THE RESOLUTION . ALTHOUGH THIS ADVANCE SHOULD NOT BE UNDERESTIMATED , THE BRITISH TUC HAS NOT YET ADOPTED A CLEARLY PRO-GAY POSITION. IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT THIS WOULD BE ONLY THE FIRST , LARGE STEP ON THE ROAD . IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO MAKE THIS RESOLUTION WORK IN PRACTICE.

THIS IS A TASK FOR ACTIVE TRADE UNIONISTS , CLEARLY COMMITTED TO THE HEALTH AND STRENGTH OF THEIR UNIONS . IT WAS POINTED OUT THAT TRADE UNIONS HAVE A BUREAUCRACY , THAT THERE ARE DEBATING RULES ETC. TO BE MASTERED , THAT THEY ARE NOT ALWAYS AS DEMOCRATIC AS WE WOULD LIKE THEM TO BE . THE WORKSHOP ON GAYS AND THE MEDIA CONSISTED OF A DISCUSSION ON THE GENERAL ASPECTS AND WAS INCONCLUSIVE AS A RESULT . DUE TO A LARGE WOMEN'S WORKSHOP AND THE GAYS AND THE POLICE WORKSHOP, ONLY A SMALL NUMBER ATTENDED THIS WORKSHOP .

THERE WAS A DISCUSSION ON THE BASIC PROBLEM OF THE MEDIA IN IRELAND - THAT
IT IS CONTROLLED BY A SMALL NUMBER OF ULTRA - CONSERVATIVE INDIVIDUALS WHICH
MAKES ACCESS DIFFICULT. THE ABSENCE OF ANY RADICAL PRESS OR TELEVISION/RADIO
MEANS THAT UNTIL SUCH OUTLETS EXIST, THE GAY COMMUNITY WILL CONTINUE TO
FIND ACCESS TO THE CONSERVATIVE MEDIA VERY DIFFICULT. THERE WERE SUGGESTIONS
THAT WE SHOULD DELIBRATELY TONE DOWN OUR VIEWS AND LIVES IN ORDER TO GET SOME
COVERAGE BUT THIS SUGGESTION WAS LARGELY REJECTED.

THERE WAS GENERAL FRUSTRATION ABOUT THIS WHOLE ISSUE .SOME EXPERIENCES OF GAYS AND THE BRITISH MEDIA WERE RECOUNTED , BUT THESE WERE UNFORTUNATELY LARGELY INAPPLICABLE TO THE IRISH SITUATION .

THE OTHER MAIN TOPIC OF DISCUSSION CENTRED AROUND WHAT REFERENCE THERE WAS TO GAY ISSUES IN THE MEDIA IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR. THESE WERE LARGELY UNFAVOURABLE AND REACTIONARY. THE COVERAGE OF THE KINCORA AFFAIR WAS PARTICULARILY BIASED WITH NORMALLY UNBIGOTED JOURNALISTS JUMPING ON THE BAND WAGON OF SENSATIONALISM. THIS WHOLE AFFAIR AND ITS MEDIA COVERAGE HAD BEEN PARTICULARILY DAMAGING FOR AGYS IN NORTHERN IRELAND. THE OTHER MAIN ISSUE WHICH AFFECTED GAYS WAS THE COVERAGE OF THE MURDER OF CHARLES SELF, THOUGH THE HOMOPHOBIA WAS LESS BLATANT. A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF COVERAGE HAD BEEN GIVEN TO THE GAY DEFENCE COMMITTEE'S PUBLIC MEETING AND PICKETS, BUT THIS ACTION HAD BEEN LARGELY IGNORED. THE SMALL COVERAGE GIVEN TO THE CONFERENCE ITSELF, DESPITE COMPREHENSIVE PUBLICITY FROM THE ORGANISERS, WAS ALSO DEPLORED. FINALLY, THE BANNING OF GAY NEWS BY THE IRISH CENSHOSHIP BOARD WAS CONDEMNED AND A GENERAL MOTION ON THIS WAS UNANIMOUSLY PASSED AT THE CLOSING SESSION.

THERE WAS A GENERAL FEELING OF ANGER AND FRUSTRATION TOWARDS THE MEDIA FROM THOSE AT THIS WORKSHOP, PARTICULARILY AS CHANGING THE EXISTING SITUATION IS VERY DIFFICULT AS LONG AS THE MEDIA REMAINS CONTROLLED BY CONSERVATIVE IDEOLOGIES.

A workshop on gays and alcoholism was held in Trinity College on Saturday, 19th July '82, as part of the National Gay Conference. Those who attended included eight members of Alcoholics Anonymous. Aspects of the links between homosexuality and the disease of alcoholism were discussed.

It was generally agreed that alcoholism and drug addiction penetrate deeply into gay society throughout the world, Ireland being no exception. It was felt too that the facilities for dealing with same were heterosexually orientated and had an unfortunate lack of understanding with respect to homosexuality. All commentators agreed that there was a great need for cooperation between all sections of the gay community to root out this disease and to help those affected to recover.

Statistics quoted showed that 30% of gays were probably alcoholic. The disease itself is now officially regarded as being the third greatest killer in the world.

The recovering alcoholics present felt that while the present availability of Alcoholics Anonymous meetings served the primary purpose of helping people to stay 'off the drink', there was room for a gay orientated meeting, which could be held on a weekly basis, at which gays could speak openly and honestly about themselves without fear of retaliation.

A decision was taken to form a Gay A.A. group, which has already made efforts to provide a venue for meetings. It was also announced that the LONDON G.A.A. groups were willing to give any support they could.

At this stage there would seem to be a great prospect of success for such a venture and those involved wish to express their thanks to the Organising Committee of the NGC. Further information on the GAA meetings may be had from TAF at 710608 during their hours of work.

Not just in its dehumanising of gays but also because of its implied disregard for women. The weakness and lack of intelligence in gay men is depicted as coming from their effeminate side. This womaniy influence on their character makes them the way they are. Sexists and queer bashers unite. If you must find out for yourself what this film is really like I suggest you bring a sick bag.



HOMOSEXUALS are to seek a public platform for their views in metional newspapers, on radio, including pirate radio etations, and television.

"We are not getting our fair share of media coverage and, indeed, the Press in general ignores the gay movement," said a spokesman at the National Gay Conference in Dublin yesterday.

He sail one of their objectives was a weekly television programme on RTE made by gays for gay people and to promote the sims and objectives of the movement here.

A number of delegates at the comference criticised the noncoverage of debates by national newspapers. But when it was pointed out that a Press representative was present, this reporter was fold to leave.

At one of the conference workshops on a number of problems facing gay people here, there was criticism of the Gardai, some delegates alleging intimidation of gay people during a murder investigation into the death of a homosexual.

The workshop was told that police dossiers had been built up on 1,500 homosexuals during the investigation. But delegates split on the question of garda activity, one half accepting the force as "friendly" while the remainder saw them as "moral agents" of the State who should not be helped.

# Union support sought for gay ts changes

MOST Public Service unions have supported a campaign for new laws to protect homosexual people at work, but there has been no backing from craft unions.

This was said yesterday in Dub-lin at the National Gay Conference during a workshop on "gays at work." Among the attendance were teachers and civil servants who described how their colleagues, employers and unions responded to their homosexuality.

In the discussion it emerged that there had been a "positive" response to a circular sent by the National Gay Federation to Public Service unions, an "average" Service unions, an "average" reaction from the mainline unions, and none at all from the craft ones. The circular had asked the ones. The circular had asked the unions whether they agreed there should be employment protection for gay people, whether the law should give this protection, and whether they knew of instances where gay employees had been harroseed. harrassed.

Of those who responded, only one union remembered a worker being sacked because of his sexual orientation, although the reasons given by the employer for the sacking were different. The Local sacking were different. The Local Government and Public Services Union has already passed a motion seeking support for gay workers, and this is expected to be brought to the floor at the pending conference of the frish Congress of Trade Unions.

The NGF circular was not sent to the Irish National Teachers' Organisation, because of the dif-

ferent circumstances under which teachers were employed, but teachers at yesterday's conference had little confidence that they would get INTO support. One teacher said colleagues

where was gay, but not the management of the school. To "come out" in public could cause difficulties with parents. A Northern Ireland teacher said that being gay did not seem to matter, as long as it was not flaunted.

A civil servant with about 80 immediate colleagues said he had

found no difficulties when he announced his orientation. With civil servants there was a difference, however, in that it was nearly impossible to sack them.

A colleague also said that once he got over the initial awkwardness, he became happier and better at his work when he "came out". Another employee spoke of how a "closet" gay person could be miserable in an office setting among talk of children, families, courtships and wives.

An engineer said there could be a difference in attitudes to homosexuality between blue and white collar workers. In a "group situation (the first) tend to sneer. Then, when they know you, they will slide up affectionately to confound their own curiosity." However, with the engineers it was a "smiling, liberal thing."




The second National Gay Conference, which was held last weekend in Trinity College Dublin and attended by over 200 lesbians and gay men, concluded with the adoption of several resolutions. These included the passing, by an overwhelming majority, of a motion of support for and affiliation to, the Woman's Right To Choose Campaign and the Anti-Amendment Campaign.

The conference also condemned the recent decision by the censorship board to ban Gay News, as another example of the institutionalised oppression of lesbians and gay men in this country.

Workshops were held on various topics of relevance to gays, including one on gays at work and in trade unions. This workshop decided to set up a 'Gays at Work' group, and called on the trade union movement to press for the extension of the Unfair Dismissals Act to cover sexual orientation. The conference also decided to support 'The People's March for Decent Jobs' The women's workshop set up an 'Action for Lesbian Mothers 'group, to support the many lesbian mothers who are struggling to retain custody of their children. It was decided to hold a Lesbian Conference in the Autumn and the conference voted to give £100 towards its organisation. The Conference also demanded that the Northern Irish Gay Rights Association (NIGRA) recognise the right of women to use their premises autonomously every Friday or Saturday night with sole control over the funds raised on that night.

Conference also noted the recent decision of the European Court of Human Rights, condemning the laws against male homosexual in Northern Ireland, (identical to the oppresive laws in the Republic) and the subsequent decision of the Westminister government to extend the English 1967 Sexual Offences Act to the North. It was demanded that the law be brought into line with those governing heterosexual relations, rather than with one which continued discrimination against gays by imposing a higher age of consent and other inequalities. It also demanded the extension of the 1967 Abortion act to Northern Ireland, and called on the government of the Irish Republic to provide the same facilities for its citizens.

The Conference ended with the decision to hold a Recall Meeting in three months time, for which the Steering Committee will prepare a report of this year's conference. This Meeting will consider the report and decide on the time, venue etc. of next year's conference. Further information can be obtained from the N.G.C.S.C., c/o p.o. box 1076, Dublin 1.
