INFORMATION.

We have a complete and up-to-date set of Videos produced in the U.S.A. where AIDS was first diagnosed, on AIDS, on the immune system and how the virus affects it, on the antibodies test, etc. We are prepared to present workshops, discussion groups, question and answer sessions for any individual, community or section of society. We have and can send you leaflets covering all aspects of the disease.

SUPPORT.

Through fear and ignorance people affected by AIDS often find themselves isolated and avoided; they have no-one to talk to. We in CAIRDE are available in complete confidentiality to talk and give support both emotionally and practically, either on a one-to-one basis or in a group of people similarly affected.

We are forming facilitated confidential groups for people tested positive to the antibodies test. If you are interested ring CAIRDE.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES.

We are available, with the use of videos and training manuals, to any organisation wishing to train volunteers to work with people affected by AIDS as well as training volunteers who wish to work with CAIRDE.

WHO IS AT RISK?

In order to catch the virus two conditions must apply: firstly you must come into contact with someone carrying the virus: secondly the virus must get in to the body. The HTLV-3 virus is difficult to pass from person to person. Only four methods have been proved:

- a) Sexual contact, hetro-or homosexual.
- b) Injection or transfusion of blood or blood products taken from an infected person.
- c) Sharing needles with an infected person.
- d) From infected mother to baby.

GROUPS OF PEOPLE AT RISK.

- Gay and bisexual men.
- Haemophiliacs.
- Drug users sharing needles.
- Sexual partners of at risk group.

CAIRDE is staffed and funded by volunteers. We need more help and funds in order to provide a better service.
