1 INTRODUCTION

The Office of Public Works (OPW) commissioned RPS to undertake the Raphoe Flood Risk Assessment and Management (FRAM) Study in March 2013. A pre-feasibility study was undertaken by Jacobs UK Limited in 2009 which examined flood risk in the town and recommended potentially viable measures for managing the risk. The aim of this FRAM study is to further assess and develop measures to manage existing flood risk in Raphoe town that shall comprise of a feasibility study and preparation of a Flood Risk Management Plan in accordance with the Project Brief (2268/RP/008/A, October 2012). The flood maps produced through the project, and proposed flood risk management measures shall be incorporated into the North-West and Neagh-Bann Catchment Flood Risk Assessment and Management Study which is currently ongoing under the EC Directive on the Assessment and Management of Flood Risks, 2007 (2007/60/EC) as implemented in Ireland by SI 122 of 2010 European Communities (Assessment and Management of Flood Risks) Regulations, 2010.

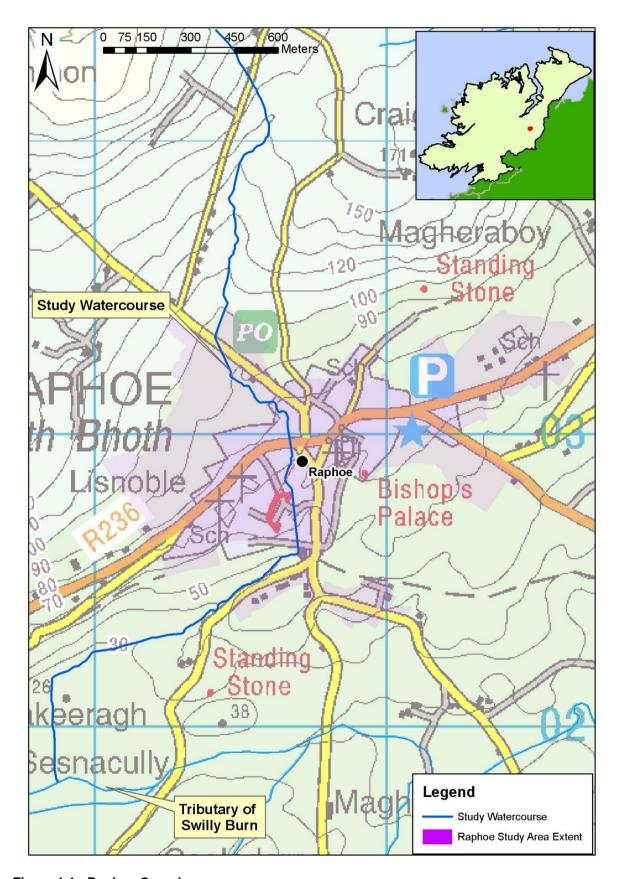


Figure 1.1 - Raphoe Overview

Raphoe town is located in County Donegal within Hydrometric Area 01. It has a population of approximately 1000. The principal river system in Hydrometric Area 01 is the River Foyle which flows northwards from the confluence of the rivers Finn and Mourne at Lifford and Strabane towns. The Foyle forms the international border between the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland, draining the Mourne, Finn and Deele tributaries, discharging into Lough Foyle. As indicated by Figure 1.1 Raphoe is situated on an unnamed tributary which flows into a tributary of the Swilly Burn. The Swilly Burn discharges into the River Foyle approximately 6km north of Lifford/Strabane. The town is surrounded to the north and west by steep sided hills. The small watercourse which runs from north to south through the town from the hillside is predominantly culverted with a catchment area of 4.4 km² where it meets the upper reaches of the Swilly Burn south of Raphoe.

Raphoe has experienced flooding in the past from a combination of fluvial and pluvial flooding, most notably in September 2006 and June 2007.

1.1 PURPOSE OF THE OPTIONS REPORT

The main objectives of the options report is to detail the activities associated with Flood Risk Assessment and the development of Flood Risk Management (FRM) Options and to present the outcomes of each.

The report first details the flood risk to the study area based on the following four groups of receptors:

- Society (including risk to people);
- The Environment;
- Cultural Heritage;
- The Economy.

This assessment informs how best to manage the present and future flood risk to the study area.

The second part of this report details the decision making process in identifying the most appropriate FRM options and details of the options to be taken forward to consultation.

1.2 INTRODUCTION TO THE OPTIONEERING PROCESS

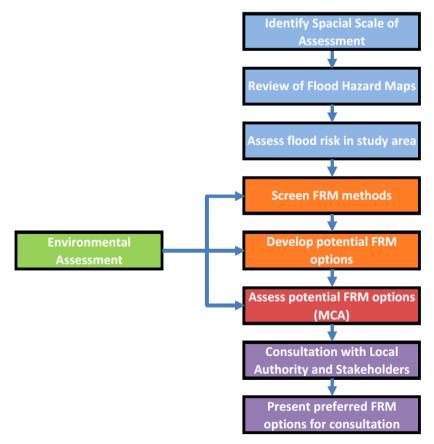


Figure 1.2 - Optioneering Process

Optioneering is a process where the flood risk to an area is identified and quantified which informs what the most appropriate FRM options are. This is carried out through a series of activities summarised in Figure 1.2.

The activities shown in the blue boxes in Figure 1.2 identify and assess the flood risk. This is undertaken by establishment of the baseline flooding situation through hydrological and hydraulic analysis to produce a series of flood hazard maps. The flood hazard maps are then used to assess which receptors are at risk and subsequently produce flood risk maps. The flood risk receptors as defined in section 1.1 are assessed in order to ascertain where flood risk management will be required and to what extent. These activities are detailed in chapter 4 of this report.

On quantifying the flood risk the FRM measures are screened to rule out unacceptable measures. The remaining measures are then developed further and combined to make potential FRM options. This process is described further in chapter 5 and illustrated in the orange boxes.

The FRM options are assessed against a set of criteria and objectives and scored in order to identify the preferred options (red box). These options are then presented for consultation with the OPW, progress group (consisting of local authorities and key stakeholders) and the preferred options identified are taken forward to public consultation, thereby allowing the public the opportunity to influence the options (purple box). Comments from the public consultation are then considered and incorporated if appropriate to produce updated preferred options. This in turn becomes the FRM Measure to be presented in the draft Flood Risk Management Plan (FRMP).

2 DATA COLLECTION

This section details the data used in the optioneering process. The data was received primarily from the OPW, Donegal County Council or produced by RPS through the hydrological and hydraulic analysis activities. Supplementary data was also received from stakeholders and members of the public through the Public Consultation Day held on 26th September 2013. The following sections list the data used for the various activities in the optioneering process.

2.1 BACKGROUND MAPPING

Mapping was used throughout to aid the various tasks. This included assessing the flood risk in the study area and identifying the receptors at risk. The maps were used to locate and inform the alignment of proposed FRM options and to reference the options being displayed in the various maps produced. Table 2.1 - Background Mapping Data below summarises the maps that were used.

2.3 FLOOD HAZARD

The output of the hydraulic analysis provides details on the flood extent, depth, velocity, risk to life and flood zones. This was used to inform the flood risk assessment, the screening of FRM measures, developing and assessing potential FRM options. The following datasets were used.

2.4 SURVEY DATA

A survey was carried out by Murphy Surveys for the main watercourse which flows through Raphoe. This consisted of surveying river cross sections, and specified structures such as culverts, bridges and weirs. Existing defences were surveyed and their geometric data was also recorded. LiDAR surveys were flown for all relevant areas within the study area providing detail of the topography of the entire town of Raphoe.

3 FLOOD RISK ASSESSMENT

The aim of the Flood Risk Assessment is to assess and map the potential adverse consequences (risk) associated with flooding in the study area to the four receptor groups as described in the table below. The level of flood risk to a receptor can be affected by its location within the flood extent or the adjacent to the receptor and the receptors' vulnerability to flooding.

3.1 FLOOD RISK MAPS

The clearest way to present the flood risk within a study area is through flood risk maps. These maps detail the source of the risk and the receptors at risk. The following flood risk maps were produced:

- Social Risk map
- Environmental Risk map
- Cultural Heritage Risk map
- Economic Activity map
- · Economic Risk Density map
- · Number of Inhabitants map

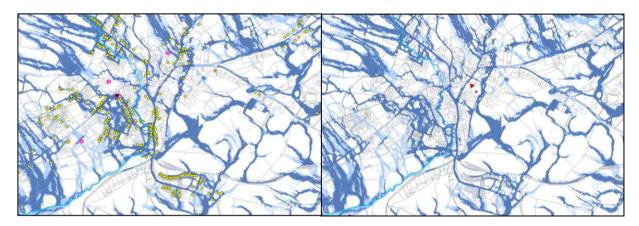


Figure 3.1 - Example Social and Cultural Heritage Risk Maps

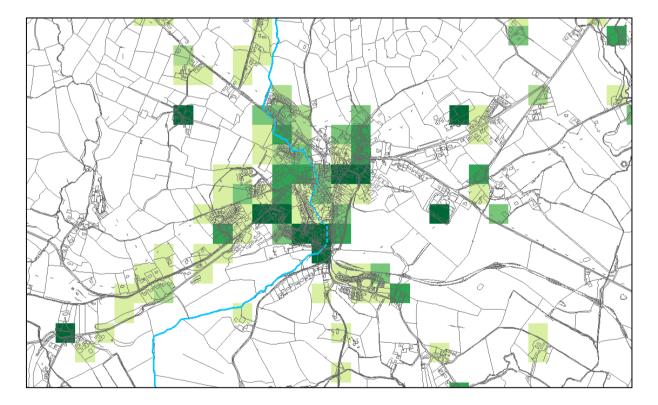


Figure 3.2 - Example Economic Risk Maps

In areas where there are few receptors it may be possible to combine the social, environmental and cultural heritage receptors together in one map. An example of the social, environmental and cultural heritage risk maps are shown in figure 3.1 below. The economic activity map presents the receptors with a monetary damage according to their type as listed in table 3.1. The economic risk density maps present the annual average damage (AAD) calculated from the damage assessment, for further details on the damage assessment see chapter 4. The AAD is represented by the total damage occurring from all receptors in a square grid. An example of Economic Risk Density map is shown in Figure 3.2. The full set of flood risk maps are presented in Appendix A.

4 DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

As part of the economic risk assessment a monetary damage is assigned to certain receptors at risk. This damage represents the costs to the nation if the flood events being considered were to occur. The following receptors are assigned a monetary damage value:

- Residential properties
- · Commercial properties
- National road network and rail network
- Utility infrastructure

The total damage to a study area is used to quantify the economic risk and provide the amount of potential benefit that would occur if a FRM measure is put in place which would prevent the damage from occurring.

4.1 DAMAGE ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

The damage assessment methodology follows the guidance in "The Benefits of Flood and Coastal Defence: A Manual of Assessment Techniques" (Flood Hazard Research Centre, Middlesex University, UK, 2005), This document is often referred to as the Multi Coloured Manual (MCM).

The MCM is a result of research carried out by Middlesex University Flood Hazard Research Centre and provides data and techniques for assessing the benefits of flood risk management in the form of flood alleviation. The MCM has focused on the benefits that arise from protecting residential property, commercial property, and road disruption amongst other areas as experience has shown that these sectors constitute the vast majority of the potential benefits of capital investment.

Based on this research the MCM provides depth damage data for both residential and commercial properties. For certain depths of flood water a damage has been assigned to a property. This damage is a combination of the likely items within the building and the building structure itself. The damage to each property is dependent on the property type, as such the MCM has categorised both the residential and commercial properties. An example of the depth damage data is shown in Figure 4.1 below.

4.2 RECORDING DAMAGE ASSESSMENT DATA

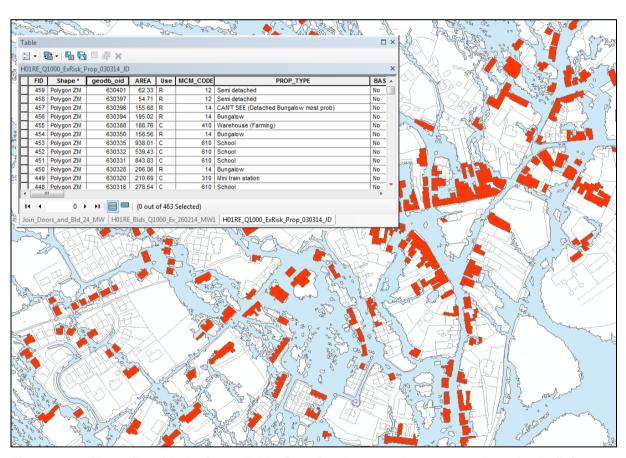


Figure 4.2 - Shapefile with Attribute Table Showing Damage Assessment Data for Buildings at Risk

The damage assessment is carried out in order to quantify the economic risk to the study area. This requires a lot of details to be recorded such as background data, interim calculations and final damage results. As such RPS created several geo-referenced shapefiles with relevant data recorded in their attribute tables, an example of which is shown in figure 4.2. One of the shapefiles created includes building information such as building type, use, area, among other attributes. The buildings shapefile is

presented as polygons. Another shapefile created incorporates attributes such as elevations and depths at building entrances. These building accesses are presented as points.

Two shapefiles created by RPS in order to complete the damage assessment are the buildings shapefile and the join door level shapefile. The building shape file was created to contain background data for building polygons including building type, use, area, among other attributes. The join door level shapefile includes data regarding the doors/entries to all properties, elevation aOD and whether there was a difference between ground level and entry level. From this the Finished Floor Level, FFL, of the property could be calculated. This shapefile was combined with the modelled flood events (50%, 20%, 10%, 5%, 2%, 1%, 0.5%, 0.1% AEP) to give depths referenced to finished floor level for each flood event. For buildings with multiple entries, the maximum level of water above FFL was taken. These were used to produce a final shapefile showing economic risk of properties relating to a range of flood events.

The following sections detail how the damage assessment is carried out and the data that is recorded during various processes within the shapefile attribute tables.

The Raphoe study produced a shapefile detailing the economic risk to all properties called "H01RE_Blds_Q1000_Ex_JD_long" quantified as total AAD and total pvD. These will be summarised at the end of section 4.

4.3 CATEGORISATION OF PROPERTIES

All properties identified as at risk during the flood risk assessment were included in the damage assessment. The first task in this process is to identify the property use. This was carried out

according to MCM guidelines; Table 4.1 details the various property types. The MCM assigns a code to each property type to aid the damage calculations where a number can more readily be used in calculations rather than a description in text format.

For Raphoe all properties found within the 0.1% AEP flood extent were categorised. This was carried out using data gained from site visits, surveys, OSi mapping, An Post geo-directory and online mapping. The OSi building polygon layer was used initially to locate all the properties and provide their floor area. Sheds and garages which have no depth damage data in the MCM guidelines were then removed and the remaining building categorised. The following details were recorded within the buildings polygon shapefile attribute table:

Within the Raphoe 0.1% AEP flood extent there was a total of 345 residential and commercial properties.

4.4 PROPERTY THRESHOLD LEVEL

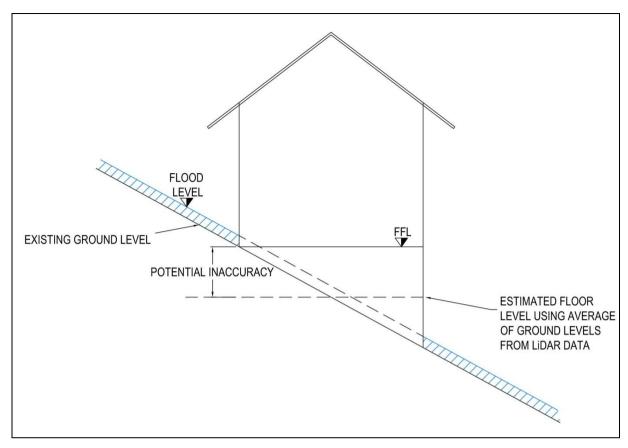


Figure 4.3 - Difficulties in Determining Property Threshold Levels

The damage assigned to a property relates to the depth of water above floor level. As such the threshold level of all properties is required as part of the damage assessment. As a general rule most properties are constructed with the floor level raised 300mm above the adjacent ground level. This would be particularly characteristic of fluvial or coastal floodplains which are generally low lying and flat in nature. In Raphoe the predominant source of flooding emanates from surface water runoff, generally as a result of convective type rainfall events common to the summer months. This type of flooding is exacerbated by the fact that the town itself is surrounded by elevated ground and falls steeply from its northern to southern boundary. A characteristic of surface water flooding is that it is generally fast flowing and of low depth, therefore the determination of finished floor levels with a good degree of accuracy is essential in determining the number of properties which are actually at risk. The steep topography also has an influence on finished floor levels whereby some properties have split level front doors and back doors and some properties enter at ground level but have basements below. The standard approach of adding 300mm to the average of the surrounding ground level could potentially produce some erroneous results. Figure 4.3 provides an example of how the steep topography could result in an inaccurate assessment of threshold levels.

To improve the accuracy in the assessment of threshold levels RPS have undertaken a number of exercises in this regard. These are detailed below:

A review of each property initially using Google Street view and Bing maps and a walkover check survey to establish front and back door locations.

Classification on the entrance type to each property:

- Raised = +200mm for every step above LiDAR defined ground level (where 2 more steps exist).
- Normal = +300mm above LiDAR defined ground level.
- Flat = LiDAR defined ground level taken as threshold level.
- Lowered = -200mm for every step down below LiDAR defined ground level.

A final chosen threshold level was assigned to each property by taking the worst case of the predicted flood level at both the front and back door locations.

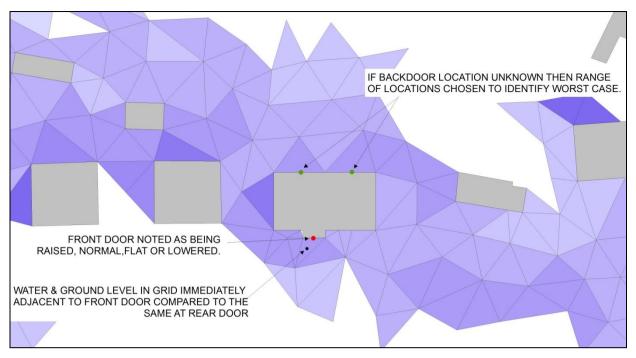


Figure 4.4 - Determination of Property Threshold Level

Figure 4.4 provides a graphical depiction of this methodology.

4.5 FLOOD DEPTH OF PROPERTIES

To estimate the damage to a property an estimation of the predicted flood depths is required for a wide range of flood events. The Project Brief requires the depths to which the properties flood during the 50%, 20%, 10%, 5%, 2%, 1%, 0.5% and 0.1% AEP flood events to be calculated. The depth of flooding is calculated by finding the difference between the flood water elevation and the estimated threshold level (as described in section 4.4). To achieve this, the maximum flood depth at each property is required. It is recognised that as flood water passes around a building the water levels will vary and, specifically characteristic to the surface water flooding in Raphoe, flood depths can be low and potentially only affect a property should they flow directly into a doorway. To maintain a conservative approach the maximum flood level adjacent to either the front or back door of the property (as described in section 4.4) was extracted and recorded in the attribute table of the economic risk shapefile. This process was achieved by carrying out a statistical analysis in ArcGIS

and was carried out for each property and for each flood event. The following details were recorded within the economic risk shapefile attribute tables:

4.6 FLOOD DAMAGE TO PROPERTIES

Once the depths of flooding are known the damage can be calculated using the MCM depth damage data. This is known as direct damage in that the flooding directly damages assets, it does not account for indirect damages such as heating costs to dry out the house, etc. For each property type a typical damage based on historical data has been assigned to a depth of flooding. These direct damage figures have been updated to 2010 pound sterling prices and are based on the square metre of the floor area of the building, an example of this data is present in Figure 4.1. A GIS tool has been developed which provides the direct damage in each flood event for each building in pound sterling 2010 prices per square metre by interpolating between the depth damage figures provided in the MCM guidance. This damage figure is then multiplied by the floor area of the property to give the total damage. This figure is converted to Euro and updated to 2013 prices using the OECD's purchasing power parities (PPP) records and CSO Ireland's consumer price index (CPI). The overall adjustment factor used in the Raphoe FRAM Study was 1.345, the conversion rates are shown below.

4.7 INTANGIBLE DAMAGES AND EMERGENCY COSTS

Apart from the material damages to the building structure and the goods inside the property, it is recognised that there are monetary damages associated with clean up costs, temporary accommodation, stress, etc. To account for this it is OPW policy to assign intangible damages to all residential properties equal to its direct damages. No intangible damages are assigned to commercial properties as these costs do not apply at the same level with the exception of small family run businesses. To achieve this, a survey was carried out to identify these small businesses and an intangible damage equal to the direct damage was also assigned to the property.

A cost will be associated with emergency services dealing with the flood events. Following the EA's Flood or Coastal Erosion Risk Management (FCERM) appraisal guidance, which the MCM guidance has been adapted to comply with, a value of 10.7% of the residential damages has been assigned to the emergency services costs. This percentage of the residential damages has been used in this damage assessment also. The details in Table 4.8 were recorded within the economic risk shapefile attribute tables:

4.8 ANNUAL AVERAGE DAMAGE AND PRESENT VALUE DAMAGE

In order to gain an appreciation of the economic risk the overall damage needs to be calculated. This is represented by assessing the likelihood of each of these flood events occurring in any given year and applying this as a percentage to the damage. This is known as the Annual Average Damage (AAD). The AAD can then be taken over the lifetime of the study that has been set at 50 years and discounted back to present day costs. This present day discounted cost is known as present value damage (pvD).

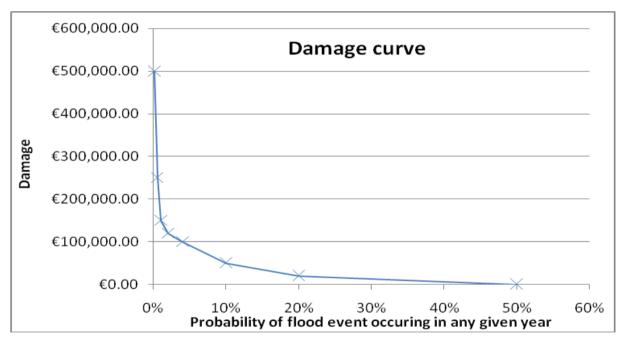


Figure 4.5 - Example Damage Curve

The AAD can best be described by considering the graph shown in Figure 4.5. The points shown represent the various design flood events where the damage has been calculated. Their position on the graph is dictated by the damage caused and the frequency of the flood event occurring in any given year. These points are joined together to create a damage curve. The area under the curve is therefore a function of the damage and the frequency and gives the AAD. The events that were considered for this study were the 50%, 20%, 10%, 5%, 2%, 1%, 0.5% and 0.1% AEP flood events.

Once the AAD is calculated the present value damage is calculated. The present value damage calculation sums the AAD that is expected to occur for each of the 50 years being considered in this study. However in order for the damage value in each year to be comparable with each other they are discounted to represent the equivalent present damage value. Discounting damage values in the future is based on the principle that generally people prefer to receive goods or services now rather than later. This is known as time preference. The cost therefore of providing a flood management option will also be discounted to present day values. The discount rate to be used on public projects is set centrally by the Department of Public Expenditure and reform at 4% and has been implemented in this study. Over the 50 year lifetime being considered, this amounted to factoring the AAD by 22.341. The AAD and pvD are calculated for the direct damages, intangible damages and the emergency costs separately and totalled to give the overall damage available.

The AAD calculations consider damages up to the 0.1% AEP flood event, however when considering the FRM measures to alleviate this risk the standard of protection will usually be the 1% AEP flood event. The following details were recorded within the economic risk shapefile attribute tables:

4.9 CAPPING DAMAGES

It is recognised that for certain properties the overall damage associated with it can far exceed the market value of the property. This can be due to either the depth to which it floods or the frequency with which it floods or more likely a combination of both. Where such a situation occurs it is necessary to cap the damages at the market value.

The market value was calculated using market data sourced from the CSO. The area chosen was 'other areas' as to not include National, Dublin, Cork, Galway, Limerick and Waterford to give a more accurate representation for prices in rural Ireland. Quarter 2 of 2013 was chosen as this is when the works began. An average of the mean 'new house prices' and mean 'second hand house prices' was taken to give a value of €189,664. The approach taken in this study is to cap the direct damages and the intangible damages separately before totalling up the overall damages with the emergency costs. The following details in Table 4.10 were incorporated within the economic risk shapefile attribute tables:

4.10 DAMAGE ASSESSMENT REVIEW

A review of the damage assessment was carried out to quality check the data being used. This was carried out by reviewing the properties that contribute over 1% of the capped pvD. The review consists of checking the property type and the finished floor level including split levels, the footprint areas and the depth damage being applied.

4.11 SUMMARY OF DAMAGES IN RAPHOE

The last field, CapVal, in the attribute table of the economic risk shapefile is the total damage which sums the capped present value direct damages, the capped present value intangible damages and the

present value emergency costs. This gives the overall present value damage. The table below summarises the damages associated with Raphoe.

4.12 LIMITATIONS OF THE FLOOD DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

Within any study of this nature there is always uncertainty which needs to be accounted for in the overall analysis. This emanates from a variety of sources including standard errors in datasets, limitations of computer modelling and lack of historical data of sufficient accuracy. This has been recognised by RPS and a number of modifications have been incorporated into the hydraulic model and subsequent flood outlines to provide greater accuracy in the above calculation of AAD. These include:

- Removed all areas showing flooding less than 10mm depth as the model is not calibrated to this accuracy.
- Removed all isolated areas of flooding less than 200m² as in reality these are unlikely to contribute to damage to property and will be dealt with by existing drainage systems.
- All roads were dropped by 100mm to ensure the model correctly simulated flow between kerbs.
- 50% AEP rainfall profile removed from all hydrographs to better reflect that taken by the drainage network.

Even with these additions to improve accuracy, a figure in excess of €8m would be considered to be a very high value for AAD and could be reflective of applying standard methodologies to what are very unique flooding mechanisms in Raphoe. In reality the comprehensive sensitivity analysis (detailed in Section 6.5.2 of this report) and some of the lower figures of AAD generated from it may provide a more accurate assessment.

5 FLOOD RISK MANAGEMENT MEASURES

There are various ways to manage the flood risk within any study area. These measures can be grouped into 4 areas.

- 'Protect' measures reduce the likelihood of flooding. Measures include flood walls, flow diversion and upstream storage.
- 'Prepare' measures reduce the impact of flooding. Measures include individual property protection, flood forecasting and public awareness campaigns.
- 'Prevent' measures avoids future flood risk. Measures include planning and development control.
- 'Permit' measures accepts that flooding will occur. Measures include maintaining the existing regime and doing a minimal amount of maintenance.

The Raphoe FRAM study has set an objective to identify viable structural and non-structural options and measures for the effective and sustainable management of flood risk within the Study Area. With this being said it is an aspiration of the study to provide the highest standard of flood risk management. This would, in general, entail providing 'protect' measures over 'prepare' measures and avoiding 'permit' measures where possible. 'Prevent' measures should always be included as they consider future flood risk.

5.1 STANDARD OF PROTECTION

The standard of flood risk management is also dependent on the design standard being applied i.e. the maximum level of protection that the FRM measures provide. The preferred design standard for this study is the 1% AEP event for pluvial flood risk.

Where there is a clear technical, economic, social or environmental case as to why the preferred standards would not be appropriate or acceptable, or where the adoption of alternative standards would provide significant additional benefit in relation to costs and impacts, then measures below the preferred design standard may be considered.

5.1.1 Residual Risk

For any FRM measure the flood risk to a study area can never be totally eliminated as a flood event greater than the design standard can occur. This is referred to as residual risk. The preferred design standard for Raphoe is the 1% AEP event. It can therefore be assumed there will be residual damage for the 0.5% and 0.1% AEP flood events. A further consideration to Raphoe is that some of the assumptions made within the hydraulic modelling approach make the exact quantification of residual risk difficult. Due to the lack of information on the existing drainage network an assumption was made whereby the capacity of the existing drainage network was originally ignored then assumed to cater for only the 50% AEP rain fall event (refer to Raphoe Hydrology / Hydraulics Report, IBE0809Rp0001, Section 4.6 for details). This means that flood extent maps are conservative and subsequently the need for FRM measures in certain areas may be questionable. Furthermore, once FRM measures are proposed, the model will still simulate rainfall falling behind these defences and potentially identify areas of flooding which in reality maybe dealt with by the drainage network. This could lead to defences or measures being proposed in locations where they may not be required.

For the purposes of this study it is assumed that for FRM measures that contain the flow within the river channel, such as flood walls, the residual damage for flood events greater than the design standard will be the same as the present day current damages. For FRM measures that reduce the flow, such as upstream storage, a benefit will be provided during flood events greater than the design standard event and therefore should be calculated.

Each measure has been reviewed against its applicability for Raphoe and those which are obviously unsuitable were removed.

5.3 BASELINE CONDITION

The FRM method "maintain existing regime" is considered the baseline condition as described in Table 5.1 above. This represents the current scenario which all other scenarios, created by the implementation of other FRM measures, are compared to. This is realised by the reduction in receptors at risk, as described in chapter 3, and the reduction in monetary damage (see chapter 4) also known as benefit.

6 ASSESSMENT OF FRM MEASURES

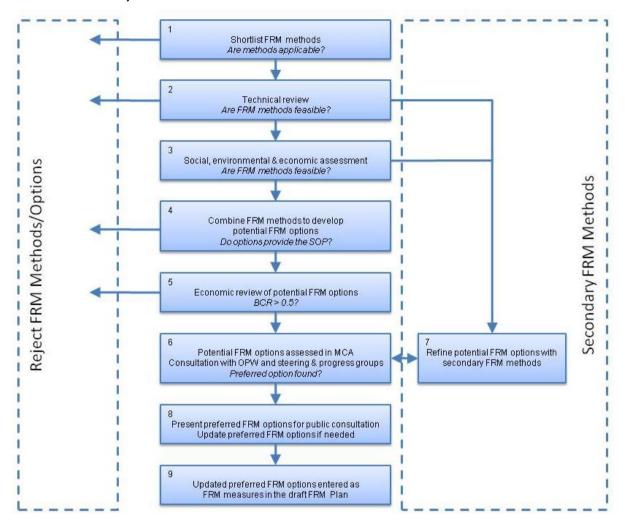


Figure 6.1 - Flood Risk Option Development Flow Chart

The development of FRM options for Raphoe will follow the flow chart as defined in Figure 6.1. This process has been developed to demonstrate that all feasible measures have been considered and that suitable justification has been provided by those measures which have been included and also those which have been rejected.

The flow chart summarises in boxes 1 to 3 how the screening of FRM measures is carried out. Boxes 4 and 5 describe how the feasible FRM measures that come through the screening are developed into potential FRM options and box 6 shows how the potential FRM options are assessed to identify the preferred FRM options. If however no preferred FRM option is identified, box 7 shows how the options can be refined with additional or other FRM measures and reassessed. The preferred FRM options are then taken forward to public consultation and, if required, updated to reflect the comments and issues raised before presenting the final FRM measure in the FRM Plan as shown in boxes 8 and 9.

6.1 SCREENING FLOOD RISK MANAGEMENT MEASURES

The aim of the screening process is to ensure the widest possible range of FRM measures are considered in the assessment process while the rejection of any measures shall be robust and with clear and transparent reasoning. The long list of measures in Table 5.2 are consistent with those being proposed on the OPW CFRAM projects but have been reviewed to ensure the unique flooding mechanisms that exist in Raphoe can be accounted for.

6.1.1 Applicability Review of FRM Measures

All measures which have been considered as applicable are then reviewed on their technical merits and their ability to alleviate the specific mechanisms of flooding that exist in Raphoe. This is based on engineering judgement, information from local engineers, feedback from the Public Consultation Day, flood mapping and reviewing animations of model output.

6.1.2 Flooding Mechanisms

Before undertaking a technical review of the applicable FRM Measures, RPS carefully considered the flood mechanisms which exist in Raphoe. This was imperative to ensure that all proposed FRM measures considered the correct source and flow path of each flooding mechanism.

Historical flood events and animations of modelling outputs have identified that during significant or intense rainfall events, surface water runoff flows rapidly from the steep agricultural catchment to the north and west. This is exasperated by minimal infiltration occurring in the catchment due to high bedrock level which is evident at different locations above the town, and at times sediment run off from arable fields as advised by local residents at the draft mapping PCD. As the runoff reaches the town the roads and streets act as conduits collecting the flows from the hillside and conveying the flow to almost all areas of the town. As a consequence there are few properties which are not inundated by flooding to some degree or at least have access to their properties affected. Figure 3.3 in Appendix E shows in more detail the sources and flow paths identified from the 1% AEP event modelling output which was used in the technical review of the applicable FRM Measures.

6.1.3 Technical Review of FRM Measures

Measures which have technical merit will be divided into two categories; primary and secondary. Primary measures are those which will be considered as having a reasonable likelihood of providing the required standard of protection, to the majority of properties at risk from a 1% AEP event. Secondary measures may have some technical merit and could solve some localised flooding issues but will only address flooding to a small number of properties at risk during the 1% AEP event.

This approach ensures that the primary measures will be prioritised for consideration with the opportunity to add in the shortlisted secondary measures to resolve localised issues. Addition of secondary measures may be implemented after consultation at a detailed design stage, or be revisited in the future to address more localised issues.

6.1.4 Environmental and Social Review

It is important to ensure that measures being brought through the assessment process will not have significant detrimental environmental, social/cultural or economic impacts. To this end each primary method progressing through the technical review is assessed from environmental, social/cultural and economic criteria in turn.

The following rationale were considered when developing the methodology for screening measures in relation to their potential to impact on environmental, social and cultural receptors:

- The methodology must be robust and defendable;
- The methodology must be rapid and replicable;
- The methodology must be precautionary to avoid rejecting measures at an early stage which might prove to be the best available method manage flood risk;
- The methodology must not overlap the multi-criteria analysis and environmental assessment processes.

In order to fulfil these aims, the methodology considers whether the method is likely to have a direct or indirect negative effect on Special Areas of Conservation (SACs), Special Protection Areas (SPAs) or Unesco sites.

- If there are no SACs, SPAs or Unesco sites within the footprint of the proposed method, directly adjacent to the proposed method, or directly upstream or downstream of the proposed method, then the method can continue through the screening process as a primary method.
- If an SAC, SPA or Unesco site is within the footprint of the proposed method, directly adjacent, upstream or downstream of the proposed method and subject to a clear and negative impact from the method, it cannot be considered as a standalone method at this stage and is classed as a secondary method.

This methodology ensures that when a method has been flagged as potentially having a negative impact on an SAC, SPA or Unesco site, the optioneering team will put the method aside and consider other measures which have not been flagged in terms of environmental, social or cultural impacts first. As there are no SACs, SPAs or Unesco sites within the catchment in consideration all of the primary and secondary measures can pass through to the next stage of screening. This is confirmed in Table 6.4.

6.2 DEVELOPING POTENTIAL FRM OPTIONS

The primary FRM measures which have progressed through the technical, environmental and social screening have been combined to create potential FRM options for Raphoe. Most measures, while providing significant reductions in flood risk, will not manage the flood risk entirely by themselves. Measures are therefore required to be combined into options so that they will manage the flood risk and achieve the objectives set by the study. All possible combinations of FRM measures have been considered as potential FRM options; however, only options that can provide the required design standard are progressed further.

6.2.1 Further Technical Analysis of Primary Measures to Produce Potential FRM Options

It was apparent from the draft mapping public consultation day and the walkover surveys undertaken by RPS, that substantial flood risk management solutions within the town would be unfeasible given the narrow streets and the subsequent constraints they present to construction work. Instead, it was decided that focussing on options outside the town with an emphasis on storage and diversion would provide the primary option. RPS therefore developed three potential options for Raphoe from the list of primary measures presented in Table 6.4. These options are presented in Table 6.5 with a short description of each option provided below. Plan drawings of all three options are provided in Appendix B.

A brief description of what each FRM option will encompass has been included below.

Option 1 - Diversion of surface water flow originating from the hills to the north and west of Raphoe by the creation of an open channel to collect and divert flows away from the town. Earth embankments from the excavated channel will be created on the lower side of the channels to provide freeboard and prevent overtopping. Diverted flow will be directed to existing river channels to the south-west and south-east of the town respectively. A plan drawing of Option 1 is provided in Appendix B.

Option 2 - Similar to option 1, this arrangement will intercept runoff from the hills to the west of Raphoe and direct it towards the existing watercourse to the south-west of Raphoe. Runoff originating from the hills to the north will be intercepted in a similar manner and diverted to existing watercourse to the south-east. Instead of an open channel this option considers the use of a reinforced wall/channel to collect and divert the flow away from the town. A plan drawing of Option 2 is provided in Appendix B.

Option 3 – Differs from option 1 and 2 in that instead of diverting surface water flow from the hills it considers the possibility of creating storage areas to the north and west of the town. These structures will need to be constructed from reinforced concrete as the storage depths exceed 5m such that earth embankments with the standard gradients for front and rear facing slopes would minimise the area available for storage. The reinforced concrete structures will intercept and store water for a short period of time before releasing the water in a controlled manner both during and after the rainfall event. A plan drawing of Option 3 is provided in Appendix B.

6.3 ASSESSMENT OF POTENTIAL FRM OPTIONS

The 3 potential FRM options which have progressed to this stage have been found to be technically, socially, environmentally feasible. In order to ascertain the preferred option for Raphoe, each option must be considered against a range of criteria and objectives to determine the optimum solution. This is undertaken by scoring each option against the following three criteria to provide an overall score for each:

Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR) - The ratio between the monetary benefit of adopting a FRM option
and the overall cost of constructing, operating and maintaining the option. A ratio of one or
greater must be achieved for an option to be considered further.

- MCA score The sum weighted score of all of the objectives set in the MCA. This score represents the non-monetary benefit of adopting the FRM option.
- Overall Net Benefit/Cost This is a ratio between the non-monetary benefit of adopting a FRM option and the overall cost of constructing, operating and maintaining the option.

6.3.1 The Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR)

The BCR is a simple calculation of the whole life cost of a FRM option against damage avoided over the same time period. The estimation of damages has been described in detail in Chapter 4 of this report and the method for the estimation of costs is described as follows.

The cost of constructing FRM measures has been calculated using data from OPW, Local Authorities, the UK Environment Agency and RPS. This data is based on previous schemes using real costs. This data is presented as rates to be applied to the FRM measures depending on the quantities involved.

As such the first stage in this process was to quantify the FRM measures. This information included wall lengths and heights, volume of embankments, etc. This was carried out by hydraulic modelling and using the GIS software ESRI ArcMap. The location and extent of FRM measures were delineated in GIS using OSi mapping with consideration of the flood risk receptors. Once finalised the design standard flood event was simulated with each FRM method incorporated within the hydraulic model and the heights required calculated. Once the heights have been calculated, the construction rates can be applied to estimate the cost. Drawings of these options are included in Appendix B

Costs additional to those for construction were included to give a complete estimate of the overall cost of the option. Table 6.6 lists the additional provisions that were included.

Maintenance of any FRM options has been accounted for by factoring 1% of the construction cost by 21.48 to give the NPV maintenance cost over a design life of 50 years.

6.3.1.1 Estimation of BCR Ratio

Based on the methodology set out in Section 6.3.1, costs for the three potential options have been calculated and compared to the damage avoided. This is summarised in Table 6.7.

With each of the three primary options there is a considerable amount of residual damage still occurring within the town itself. This occurs because although the FRM options divert the majority of the flow away from the town, rain is still falling directly onto the urban area (effectively behind the defences) in sufficient quantities to continue to cause damage to properties. This is discussed in more detail in Section 6.6 when considering potential secondary FRM measures.

6.3.2 The Multi-Criteria Analysis (MCA) Methodology

The assessment of FRM options in the past has been primarily based on economic costs and benefits, with an Environmental Impact Assessment undertaken to minimise negative impacts on the environment, and public consultation undertaken to ensure social acceptability. The National Flood Policy Review (OPW, 2004) set a broader range of objectives for flood risk management in Ireland, which was subsequently reinforced by the EU 'Floods' Directive [2006/60/EC].

The MCA framework has been developed to broaden the range of potential impacts associated with flooding and the implementation of FRM options considered in the development and selection of FRM options and strategies, and their subsequent prioritisation. It is based on the numeric, but non-monetarised, assessment of options against a range of objectives. Indicators are used to assign scores for each objective on the basis of the degree to which the option being appraised goes beyond a specified basic requirement for that objective towards meeting a specified aspirational target for that objective. Weightings are applied globally (nationally) for each objective, with local weightings applied to reflect the local importance of that objective in the context of the respective SSA, and these weightings are applied to the scores derived as described above.

The sums of the weighted scores, set against the total costs of their achievement, represent the preference for a given option (using all criteria) or the net benefits of an option (using only the economic, social and environmental criteria). These total scores can be used to inform the decision on the selection of (a) preferred option(s) for a given location and the prioritisation of potential schemes between locations.

6.3.2.1 MCA of Potential FRM Options

Based on the methodology set out in 6.3.2 the results of the MCA are presented in Table 6.8. The MCA evaluation sheets providing the breakdown of scoring for each option are provided in Appendix D.

It can be seen that all three options achieved the same social scores as well as similar economic scores. This is due to each option providing a similar level of protection to relevant indicators such as residential and commercial properties. The economic score was less for Option 3 due to the size of the storage areas required being prohibitively expensive. The associated depths of water stored also were also substantial and would present a significant risk to life should they fail. On the technical criteria Option 1 has the highest score due to the low risk associated with the basic, low risk construction methods involved in excavating an embankment. Options 2 and 3 involve retaining wall structures which include piling, deeper excavations and heavy plant which brings about a slightly higher risk to workers. On the environmental score option 1 again achieved the highest score. This accounted for the reduced impact on landscape character and visual amenity involved with less intrusive earth embankments, compared to retaining walls.

6.3.3 Overall net benefit methodology

The overall net benefit is a ratio used to demonstrate the relevant overall benefits of each option. It is accepted that for an option to proceed it must be cost-beneficial in its own right, but it is a method by which a numerical score can be assigned to give an indication of the overall or net benefit of each option. To calculate the net benefit the MCA score is divided by the whole life cost of the scheme.

6.3.4 Net Benefit Scores

Based on the methodology described in section 6.3.3 the overall net benefit scores are detailed in Table 6.9.

6.4 SUMMARY OF OPTION ASSESSMENT FOR RAPHOE

The analysis of the three criteria described in the previous section has fully assessed each of the preferred primary options. Table 6.10 presents the complete scoring for each of the three FRM options.

It is clear from the above table that Options 2 and 3 are not economically viable as well as being more environmentally damaging from a visual and aesthetic point of view. Therefore Option 1 is considered to be the preferred primary option. Appendix B includes a map illustrating an indicative cross section of the preferred primary option. This cross section is an approximation for illustrative purposes and will require refinement at the detailed design stage, should the option be taken forward.

6.5 SENSITIVITY AND UNCERTAINTY ANALYSIS

6.5.1 Cost Uncertainty

At this stage of the design process for any flood alleviation scheme there is a degree of the construction costs associated within the preferred option, in that no ground investigation services enquires have been undertaken. In particular bed rock is anticipated to be relatively surface as it is visible on the hills above Raphoe. RPS undertook a sensitivity analysis on the option allowing for varying proportions of rock and topsoil being encountered and their effect on the overall BCR. The results of this sensitivity testing are presented in

Table 6.11. It can be seen that even in the worst case excavation of 50% rock still provides an overall BCR of 8.36. This provides assurance that the BCR is robust regardless of the ground conditions encountered.

6.5.2 Damage Assessment (Benefit uncertainty)

Many of the predicted flood depths within Raphoe are low and there is relatively little historical flooding information of sufficient accuracy to provide good calibration data. Relying on just hydraulic modelling results in this circumstance would not be recommended and therefore it is essential that comprehensive sensitivity testing is undertaken to ensure the estimated BCR is robust. Subsequently RPS varied a number of the parameters within the damage assessment to test the robustness of the preferred option.

6.5.3 Property Threshold Levels

The threshold levels for each property were estimated using the methodology described in Chapter 4 of this report using the best available information. There still remains some uncertainty on their exact level and therefore RPS considered varying the property threshold level by 300mm as a sensitivity test on the overall cost benefit ratio. Essentially this is equivalent to assessing damages at threshold level as opposed to the standard practice of 300mm below threshold level. Table 6.12 indicates that although this substantially reduces the overall BCR it still indicates a positive BCR of 9.68.

6.5.4 Short Duration Rainfall Events

An alternative approach used to calculate damages outlined in the MCM for 'short duration' flooding was carried out. This can be applied in areas where times of inundation of properties are limited, and assigns reduced damages when compared with the damages associated with long duration flooding. The MCM defines long duration as water depths above ground floor level for more than 12 hours, with short duration relating to water depths above floor level for less than 12 hours. This approach, although appropriate to the type of flooding experienced by Raphoe in previous events, comes with a warning that the damage figures derived in the MCM have been based on a relatively small dataset and that the long duration is still the recommended approach. With this in mind, this approach was used as a sensitivity test to provide a lower boundary for damages incurred to ensure a favourable BCR is still achieved. Table 6.13 indicates that although this substantially reduces the overall BCR it still indicates a positive BCR of 11.32.

6.5.5 Combination of Sensitivity Methods

Due to the uncertainties discussed in the previous two sections regarding the property threshold levels and damages relating to short duration events, it was decided to combine these two approaches for Raphoe. This conservative approach will provide absolute assurance that the preferred option is definitively cost beneficial despite the uncertainties identified. The results of this analysis are presented in Table 6.14 below. The BCR has been reduced further, although still shows a positive BCR of 8.99.

6.6 RESIDUAL RISK AND SECONDARY MEASURES

As discussed in section 6.3.1.1 even with the primary option in place there are still significant residual damages occurring in the town from rain falling behind the defences. Table 6.15 summarises the benefit and residual risk of the preferred primary FRM measure.

As a further step to focus on the areas which had the most significant risk, RPS produced a flood depth or "heat" map with small incremental depth bandings in order to highlight specifically those areas with the greatest associated damages. The intention of this map is to prioritise those areas where secondary measures are most likely to be required. Additionally only properties which actually have a flood depth greater than their estimated threshold levels were highlighted as being at risk. This is a justifiable approach as the fast flowing and short duration nature of the flooding may not affect the subfloors of properties in the same manner that more standard fluvial or coastal flooding would. This map is presented in Figure 6.3 in Appendix E. It was evident from Figure 6.2 and Figure 6.3 that a number of secondary measures within the town were going to be required to deal with the identified residual risk. The full range of secondary measures initially being considered is presented in Figure 6.4 in Appendix E. A table providing a brief description of each option is also included.

6.6.1 Hydraulic Modelling of Secondary Measures

RPS re-simulated the model with a number of secondary measures included but the results did not have the desired outcome. These measures were primarily the storage and defence options located in the fields immediately above the town but also included minor works within the town itself. The model results indicated that although the measures were having an effect by altering flow paths and lowering flood depths, they were only reducing the number of properties at risk by a small amount. On further investigation, flow paths were being cut off but were starting again almost immediately on the defended side of the measure. This was initially at very small depths but quickly escalated to similar depths as before. Upon further consideration it was determined that many of these flow paths had depths less than 150mm which was now approaching the level at which confidence in the accuracy of the model outputs is questionable. Especially when considering the accuracy of the data used to build the model, hydraulic parameters chosen and hydrological inputs. In particular:

- 1. Domestic and the public drainage networks are not included in the model although an allowance has been made for what they could potentially convey (assumed they can deal with 50% AEP rainfall). In certain locations the drainage network is likely to convey more than this and subsequently some of the flow paths maybe overestimated.
- 2. There are known drainage ditches and channels within the town which may not fully replicate flow paths.
- 3. Threshold levels have been estimated from the LiDAR data with some alteration to improve accuracy as discussed in section 4.4.
- 4. Kerb lines, walls, fences or in fact any structure on the ground which could alter flow paths are unlikely to be within the model.
- 5. Standard error in the LiDAR data.
- 6. Chosen roughness values become more significant at these depths.
- 7. Allowance for infiltration is not included within the model.
- 8. There is very little calibration data of sufficient quality for either flood depths or from rain gauging.

Given the potential magnitude of residual risk and the uncertainties identified with the hydraulic model at this resolution, further analysis was required to assess the need for the proposed secondary measures. Following consultation with the OPW and Donegal County Council it was determined that a walkover survey with key staff who had experienced some of recent flood events was a necessity.

6.6.2 Walk Over Survey to Assess Secondary Measures Suitability

A walk over survey was undertaken in July 2014 by RPS, the OPW and Donegal County Council Engineers. The purpose of this visit was to:

- Discuss the secondary options proposed, locate them on the ground and apply engineering judgement to the model outputs.
- Make adjustments to the lengths, areas and location of all measures to take advantage of natural features.
- Review the appropriateness of the proposed measures and remove those which were deemed
 no longer required due to recently undertaken work or geographical features which have not
 been included within the model.
- Identify areas for further investigation where engineering judgment on the information available was not deemed to be an acceptable approach to determining whether a measure is required or not.

During the walk over survey it was agreed that the model extents were accurate and the majority of the measures were agreed to have potential in providing localised protection against flooding mechanisms identified in previous flood events. This was particularly true of storage and attenuation measures proposed in open areas above the town. It was agreed as a general consensus that once storm water gets into the town it is very difficult to deal with, due to the restriction of scope for diversion or storage, as well as properties having doorways directly onto pavements which limits space for any construction works. In a number of key locations several sections of culvert were proposed to deal with known flood routes where the lack of conveyance was known to be a significant issue. An example of this was in the McBride Street area extending to the open drain adjacent to the

castle. The result of this exercise is presented in Figure 6.6 in Appendix E where the updated, proposed secondary measures and locations of the arrangements is provided. Estimated indicative whole life costs for each of these options are provided in Table 6.17.

There was one area of the town where there was considered inadequate information to quantify the extent of the secondary measures required. This was to the west of the Diamond as shown in Figure 6.2.

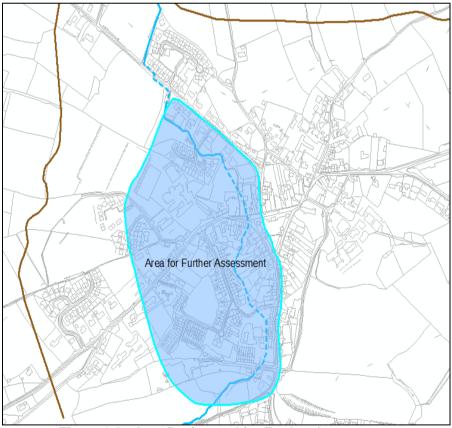


Figure 6.8 - Area Designated for Further Assessment

In this area it was agreed by all that while the modelled flood routes correlated well with historical flooding events, there was too much uncertainty as to whether the proposed secondary measures would still be necessary with the proposed primary measures in place. It was felt that given the reduction in flows from the primary measures the existing drainage network may have capacity to

manage the residual flows without further modification. Further analysis was subsequently undertaken as detailed in Section 6.7.

6.7 FURTHER ANALYSIS OF THE SECONDARY MEASURES

Following the initial description and indicative costing of the secondary measures it was agreed that further work should be undertaken to achieve greater certainty from both a technical and cost aspect in relation to the proposed secondary measures. It was agreed the following steps would be taken to achieve this:

- 1.) A review of the peak flows and total volumes of rainwater the secondary measures would be required to deal with;
- 2.) A site visit to examine local drainage, defences and flow paths to robustly justify the costs for any secondary measures in the urban area;
- 3.) Consideration of whether road drainage should be able to manage residual/excess flows;
- 4.) Critical review and refinement of secondary measures including costs and benefits;
- 5.) Recommendation for the OPW's information on the organisation that is most appropriate to implement the remaining proposed secondary measures.

6.7.1 Hydrological Analysis of Secondary Measures

The peak flows and total volumes of rainwater for each of the secondary measures were assessed. This was completed using hydrological design estimation methods (refer to Raphoe FRAM Study Hydrology and Hydraulics Report (IBE0809Rp0001_F01) for details) and compared to the values extracted from the model outputs. Refer to Appendix F for hydrological calculations for secondary measures.

There are two types of secondary measure proposed; storage measures which are generally in undeveloped areas above the town; and conveyance measures which include drainage infrastructure and measures to divert flow away from property.

In the case of the storage measures the total volume and depth are the critical factors in the design whereas with the conveyance measure the peak flow is the critical parameter.

To calculate the volume of each storage measure the catchment area specific to the measure was estimated. From this and using the hydrological methods employed in the aforementioned hydrology and hydraulics report a flow volume in cubic metres for the design event was calculated. The volume calculated was the total rain falling onto the entire catchment for the design event.

Within the model the storage measures allow the rainfall to build up behind each of the measures. The volume of water retained behind the measure was extracted from the model outputs. The maximum depth of retained water at the measure was also extracted from the model outputs.

The volumes from both methods were compared and the difference between the hydrology method and the model outputs was found to be within 12% for three storage areas and approximately 20% for two storage areas. The hydrology method was always higher as it calculates the total rain that falls within the catchment, whereas the volume extracted from the model was that stored behind the measure at the max water elevation. However this comparison indicates that the model is well anchored to the hydrological estimates.

To calculate the peak flow of each of the conveyance measures the catchment area specific to the measure was estimated. From this and using the hydrological methods employed in the aforementioned hydrology and hydraulics report a peak flow for the design event was calculated. These peak flows were used to help size the conveyance measures.

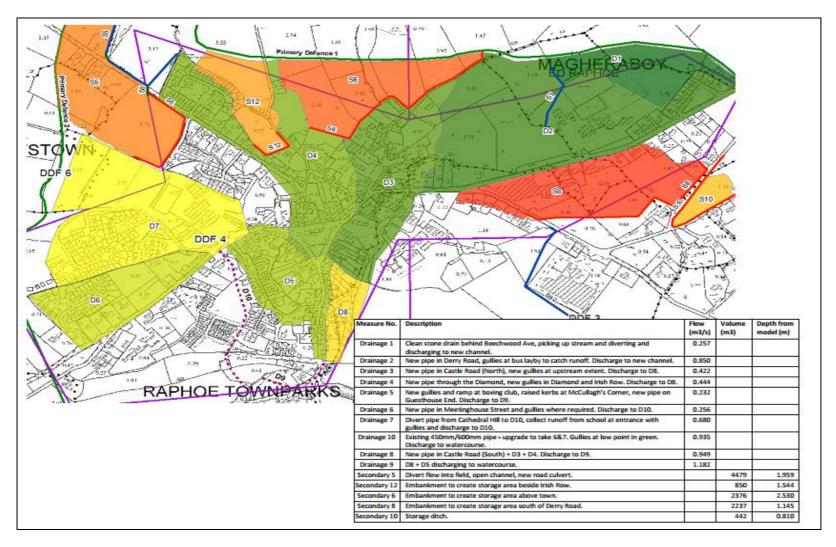


Figure 6.9 - Secondary Measure Catchment Areas and Volumes

As the conveyance measures were not incorporated into the model the overland flows were dispersed throughout each of the catchments and therefore the peak flows for measures could not be extracted accurately from the model outputs. However due to the good correlation between the hydrology estimated volumes and the model volumes the hydrology estimated flows can be used with confidence even though they cannot be extracted from the model. Figure 6.9 indicates the catchment areas that were used to assess the flows and volumes and the quantities that were estimated.

6.7.2 Meeting with Donegal County Council (20th August 2015)

RPS prepared a drainage record drawing detailing all known existing storm and combined pipes within the urban area. This was based on all information collated previously as part of the Jacobs prefeasibility study in 2009 and during the course of the current study. This drawing was presented at a meeting with Donegal County Council Engineers to allow them to review all of this information on a single drawing. As stated in Section 6.6.1 of this report the hydraulic model does have limitations in assessing the residual risk and therefore the purpose of the meeting was to readily identify any obvious omissions or errors regarding existing drainage infrastructure. It also sought to draw out any areas of the drainage network which were known to be problematic or alternatively which may have additional capacity to deal with the predicted residual risk.

A number of key omissions were identified by Donegal County Council Engineers and corrections to the maps were made. Appendix G shows the map presented to Donegal County Council and also the corrections and points of additional information highlighted to RPS at the meeting. Donegal County Council staff also agreed to attend a walkover survey to clarify the route of some of the piped network and review some of the predicted flooding mechanisms with a view to assisting in the outline design of flood alleviation measures.

6.7.3 Walkover Survey

RPS, OPW and DCC undertook a walkover survey on 23rd and 24th August 2015 to review the route of existing piped drainage infrastructure and the modelled residual flood risk outlines and flooding mechanisms. The intention of this exercise was to establish how realistic the predicted low depth flood outlines were, to see if in reality they may be confined to the road network and/or affected by localised changes in topography including garden walls, kerbs or ramps which may in fact protect some of the properties identified as being at risk. One of the key aspects of this walkover was to determine how to get the predicted surface water flows into the sub-surface drainage network especially given that standard road gullies are unlikely to be able to convey the predicted flows. These two days on site combined with the hydraulic modelling output provided the basis for the outline design of the secondary measures described as follows.

6.7.4 Outline Design of Secondary Measures

Based on the walkover survey and hydraulic model outputs, a suite of secondary measures were proposed to deal with the residual risk identified with the primary measures in place. All of the proposed measures are based on the hydraulic modelling and its limitations listed in Section 6.6.1 of this report but verified through the meetings and walk over surveys described in Sections 6.7.2 and 6.7.3. This work has enabled RPS to better understand the actual risk posed by the residual flooding. This has provided sufficient information to enable an outline design of the secondary measures to be undertaken with reasonable confidence on their need, buildability, cost and associated monetary benefit. Appendix H includes a drawing indicating the proposed secondary measures to manage the residual flood risk within the urban area.

The key objective of the secondary measures was to convey, divert and store the predicted flow paths away from properties. Where possible this was achieved by utilising the road networks and spare capacity within the existing drainage infrastructure to convey water but inevitably required the creation of new storage areas and upgrades to the piped network. Donegal County Council was particularly concerned with the capacity available in some of the culverted sections of the main watercourse as it flows through the Diamond area of the town. It was therefore imperative that no additional flows were added at this location and if possible the volumes of overland run-off reaching the watercourse should be reduced.

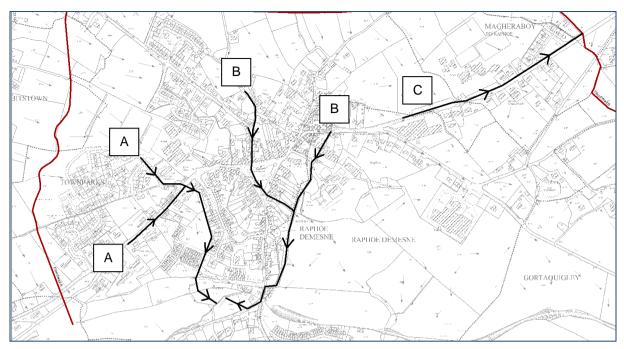


Figure 6.10 - Proposed Main Drainage Conduits - Arterial Routes A, B, C

RPS have proposed a wide range of secondary measures of varying size and scale across the town but the main alteration was the creation of drainage conduits to convey the stormwater through the town. This was achieved by essentially altering the urban drainage areas or sub-catchments within the town and creating three new main drainage pipes or culverts which would collect, convey and discharge the excess stormwater to the watercourses to the South and East of the town. Figure 6.10 highlights these three main arterial drainage routes and a description of each is provided below.

Arterial Route A – Additional gullies along Meeting House Street and raising of kerbs will assist in collecting excess stormwater along this road and will be discharged into a new manhole at the junction with Cathedral Hill. Also discharging into the manhole will be the collected run-off from Deele College. This run-off from the College grounds previously flowed out of the gates and straight down St Eunan's Terrace where it contributed to the flooding in the vicinity of the main watercourse near the junction with Guesthouse End. By collecting this flow, and the flow from Meeting House Street, and upgrading to a 600mm pipe this water is now conveyed along Route A, parallel to St Eunan's Terrace and directly to the main watercourse at the shown location south of the town. An existing unused 600mm pipe found along much of this route was calculated to be undersized and requires upgrading to a 1050mm pipe. By providing this new arterial drainage route it addresses the majority of the issues to the west of the town (in combination with the other proposed secondary measures) and also serves to reduce the flows to the main watercourse as it passes through the Diamond and particularly the lower end of the town.

Arterial Route B – Collects the residual flood flows from Irish Row and that which collects at the top of the Diamond and conveys these down the western and southern sides of the Diamond in a new 1050mm pipe. This upgraded pipe will continue along its current route between the Danske Bank and McCarron's Butchers and discharge to a new arterial 1500mm culvert which will be laid to the east of Castle Road. This will help reduce the risk to the Diamond and divert further flows away from the main watercourse at this location. Another upgraded 1050mm diameter culvert will also be laid from William Street, parallel to Castle Road, to meet the pipe from the Diamond and convey storm water to the main watercourse to the south of the town via Guesthouse End and Carnowen Road in a 1500mm diameter pipe. This pipe also ensures a reduction in flows along McBride street and William Street and hence the Diamond and the main watercourse.

Arterial Route C – A new upgraded 1800mm pipe will be laid along the Derry Road to collect flows emanating from Raphoe Royal School, its playing fields and the surrounding fields. This will collect flows from direct surface water run-off via a series of gullies and drainage outlets along this road and discharge them into the watercourse to the east of the town. There are also a number of storm water pipes of varying diameter between 250mm and 600mm which currently converge adjacent to the layby beside Raphoe Royal School which should be connected into the proposed 1800mm pipe. This will reduce the flood risk to those properties immediately to the south of the Derry Road when implemented in combination with the other secondary measures proposed at this location. It should be noted that the catchments of the pipes converging at the location is unknown and 1800mm has been taken as a reasonable estimation of the size of pipe that maybe required.

6.7.5 Cost Benefit Analysis

RPS updated the cost benefit analysis for the scheme on the basis of the additional analysis described in Section 6.7. This has included a full costing of all secondary measures as presented in Table 6.18 (a further more detailed breakdown is provided in Appendix I).

In order to assess the reduction in damage it would be normal practice to modify the hydraulic model and produce defended model runs identical to the process undertaken for the primary options for this project. The defended flood extents can then be used to determine the reduction in flood risk and associated economic benefit. However, for the reasons stated in Section 6.6.1 of this report, additional modelling has not been undertaken for the secondary measures in Raphoe. Instead an assumption has been made that the proposed measures will remove all flood damages up to the 1% AEP event. The results of this analysis are presented in Table 6.19.

This translates to a cost benefit ratio of 1.19 for the proposed secondary measures in dealing with the residual risk. These figures are presented in Table 6.20.

6.7.6 Assumptions

The analysis undertaken by RPS and described in Section 6.7 of this report is adequate to provide sufficient certainty in the assessment of the cost benefit for both the proposed primary and secondary measures. With any scheme at this stage of development there are assumptions related to ground conditions, land owner negotiations etc. However it is important to recognise that there are a number of specific assumptions to Raphoe which RPS would recommend are considered further during the detailed design process.

- The drainage network in Raphoe is not surveyed in detail. The information provided to RPS has been based on the extensive, local knowledge of Donegal County Council Engineers. The network would need to be fully surveyed to ensure all proposed pipe sizes and the assumed drainage areas within the town are correct. If required the InfoWorks ICM model could then integrate the drainage network to fully establish the impact of the proposed secondary measures.
- A full set of existing service enquiries needs to be undertaken to establish any conflict with the proposed new culverts and drainage upgrades.
- The condition of the main culvert through the town is unknown and only its current geometry has been included within the model. RPS would recommend that a full CCTV/structural survey (where possible) is undertaken to ensure this culvert performs as assumed in the model.

6.7.7 Responsibility for the Implementation of Measures

A range of flooding sources has been identified in Raphoe along with a variety of measures to alleviate flooding from these sources. It will be necessary for these measures to be allocated to the most appropriate body for implementation. The works allocated to the OPW are predominantly outside the urban area, that is, the primary diversion measures and flood storage areas and also works in the vicinity of the river which runs through the town. The DCC works are related to the improvement of the urban drainage network within the town incorporating laying new pipes and improving how overland flow enters the network. The flood risk measures have been categorised into groups in Table 6.22 below along with the body most likely to have ownership of each. A colour-coded drawing has been included in Appendix J which shows the location of the measures and which body would likely be responsible for progressing them. A description of each measure is included within Appendix I, which relates to the measure ID found on the "Responsibility of Secondary Measures" drawing in Appendix J.

7 CONSULTATION AND UPDATING PREFERRED FRM OPTIONS

Consultation on the preferred flood risk management options for Raphoe was undertaken as part of the overall consultation process for the North West – Neagh Bann (NWNB) Flood Risk Management Plans (Unit of Management 01). Public Consultation Days (PCDs) were held throughout County Donegal as shown in Table 7.1.

For each PCD Elected Members were briefed at 1pm and public consultation using a drop in format with small group discussions began at 2pm. Members of the project team (OPW, Donegal County Council and RPS) were in attendance to discuss drawings showing preferred options, answer questions and record comments or submissions made by PCD attendees. A PCD feedback register was prepared during each event and a summary report of submissions received prepared thereafter.

There were no comments or submissions made with respect to the Raphoe flood risk management options at any of the PCDs. Therefore no further update was made to the preferred flood risk management options.

8 SUMMARY OF PREFERRED FRM OPTIONS

The primary objective of this report is to develop preferred flood risk management options to manage present and future flood risk to the Study Area. The optioneering process involved data collection to inform flood risk assessment which quantified and mapped the adverse consequences of flooding socially, environmentally, culturally and economically. This is summarised in Table 3.2.

Monetary damage to certain receptors was completed to inform the economic assessment and provide the amount of potential benefit that would occur if a FRM measure is implemented to prevent said damage. The total Annual Average Damage (AAD) for Raphoe is €8,481,432. The total Present Value Damage (pvD) is €22,453,691. Acknowledgement was made of the limitations of the flood damage assessment and sensitivity analysis undertaken as discussed in Chapter 6.5.

A long list of viable structural and non structural options and measures for effective and sustainable management of flood risk within the Study Area was compiled. The preferred design standard for this study is the 1% AEP event for pluvial flood risk. The long list of measures was screened based on technical merit drawing on engineering judgement, information from local engineers, comments made at draft mapping public consultation day, and reviewing animations of model output. Careful consideration was given to the flood mechanisms in Raphoe to ensure all measures considered the correct source of flooding and the correct flow path. Measures which have technical merit were divided into primary and secondary categories. Primary measures are those which will be considered as having a reasonable likelihood of providing the required standard of protection, or at least reducing the flood risk, to the majority of properties at risk from a 1% AEP event. Secondary measures were designed to address localised flooding issues to a small number of properties at risk during the 1% AEP event.

Three potential flood risk management options consisting of primary measures were found to be technically, socially and environmentally feasible (see Table 6.5 and Appendix B). Further analysis of Benefit Cost Ratio (BCR), the Multi Criteria Analysis Score and Net Benefit ruled Options 2 and 3 out since there are not economically viable and are more environmentally damaging from a visual and aesthetic perspective. Therefore Option 1 is considered the preferred primary option with a BCR of 13.71:

Diversion of surface water flow originating from the hills to the north and west of Raphoe by
the creation of an open channel to collect and divert flows away from the town. Earth
embankments from the excavated channel will be created on the lower side of the
channels to provide freeboard and prevent overtopping. Diverted flow will be directed to
existing river channels to the south-west and south-east of the town respectively (refer to
Section 6.4 and Appendix B).

A range of sensitivity testing was undertaken to ensure robustness of preferred option selection (Chapter 6.5) and that the preferred option remains cost beneficial despite any uncertainty. The testing resulted in reduction of BCR to 8.99 which remains positive and therefore viable in terms of cost – benefit.

However it has been acknowledged that with any of the three primary options considered residual damage of €10,180,080 still occurs within Raphoe town itself. This occurs because although the FRM options divert the majority of the flow away from the town, rain is still falling directly onto the urban area (effectively behind the defences) in sufficient quantities to continue to cause damage to properties. To address this, further analysis and consideration of secondary measures was undertaken (Section 6.6). This included walkover survey and meetings with DCC engineers, additional hydrology and hydraulic modelling, outline design of secondary measures and cost benefit assessment. The key objective of the secondary measures is to convey, divert and store the predicted flow paths away from properties within the limited space available within the urban area.

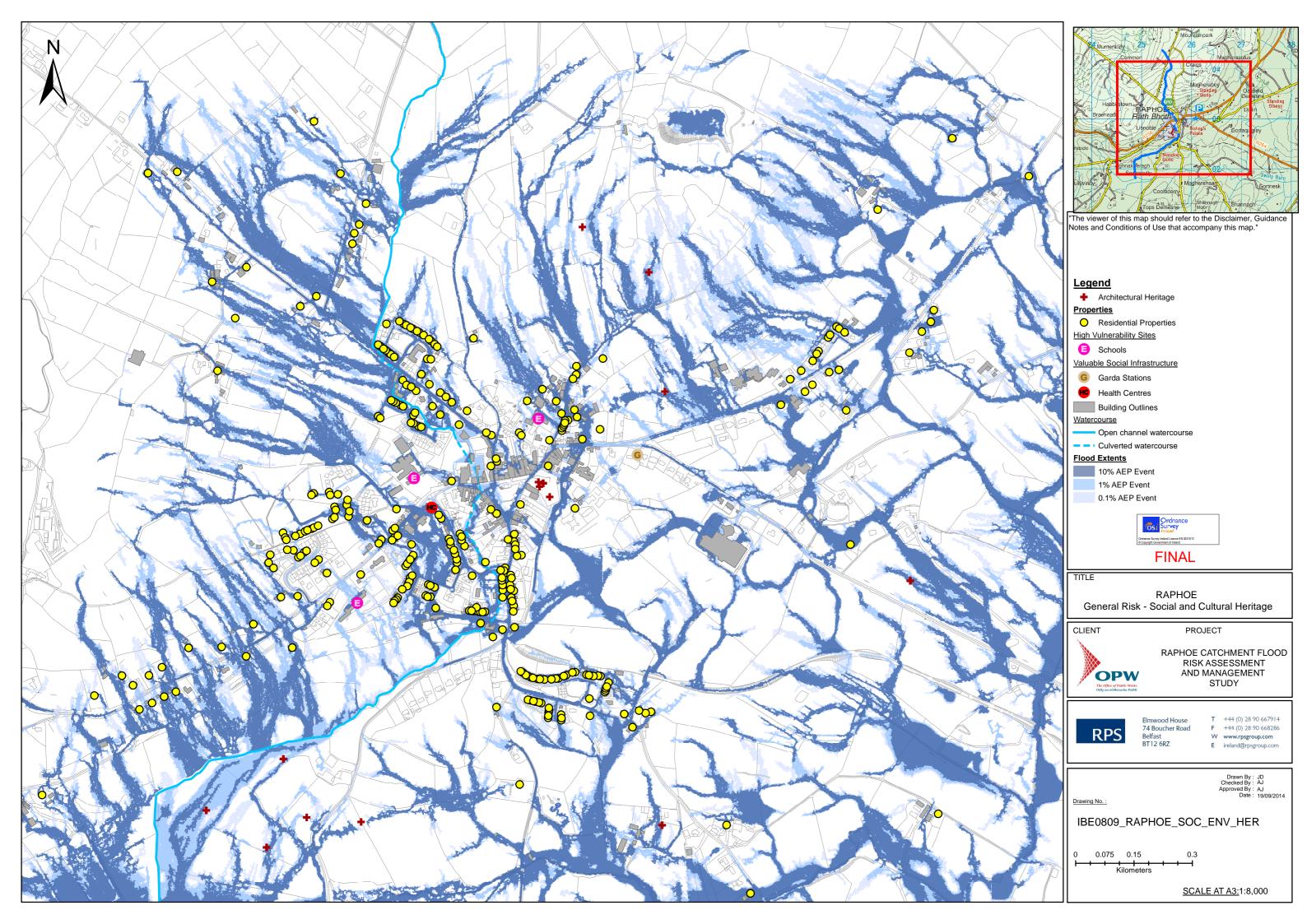
RPS have proposed a wide range of secondary measures of varying size and scale across the town (see Appendix 7) but the main alteration is the creation of drainage conduits to convey the stormwater through the town. This is achieved by altering the urban drainage areas or sub-catchments within the town and creating three new main drainage pipes or culverts which would collect, convey and discharge the excess stormwater to the watercourses to the South and East of the town (see Section 6.7.4). Cost benefit analysis of the proposed secondary measures in dealing with residual risk and in

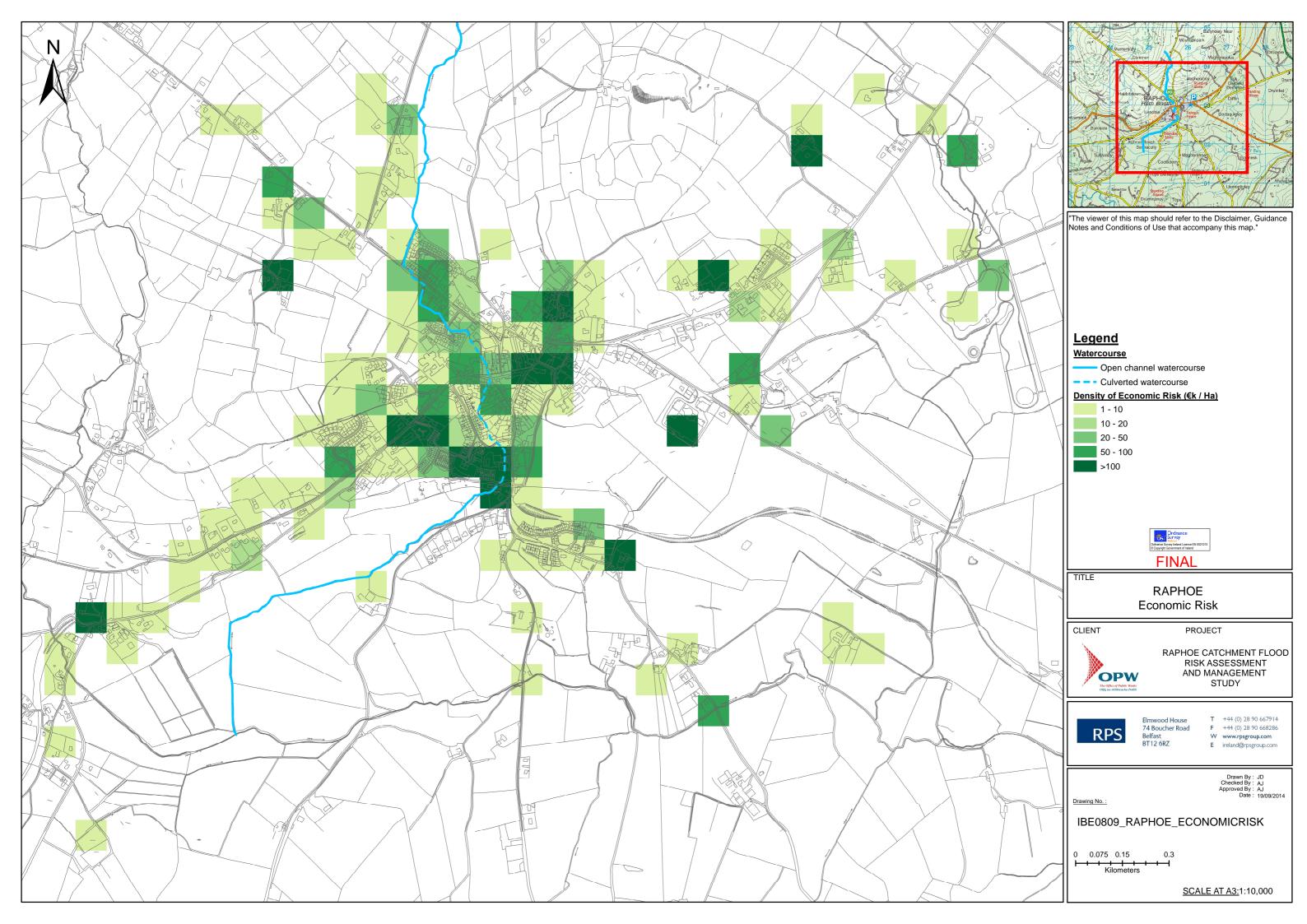
conjunction with preferred Option 1 (primary measures) was undertaken resulting in an overall BCR of 2.71 (Table 6.21).

In terms of implementation of measures it is recommended that OPW take responsibility for the primary diversion and storage measures and works in the vicinity of the watercourse, whilst Donegal County Council take responsibility for improvements to the road and urban water drainage network.



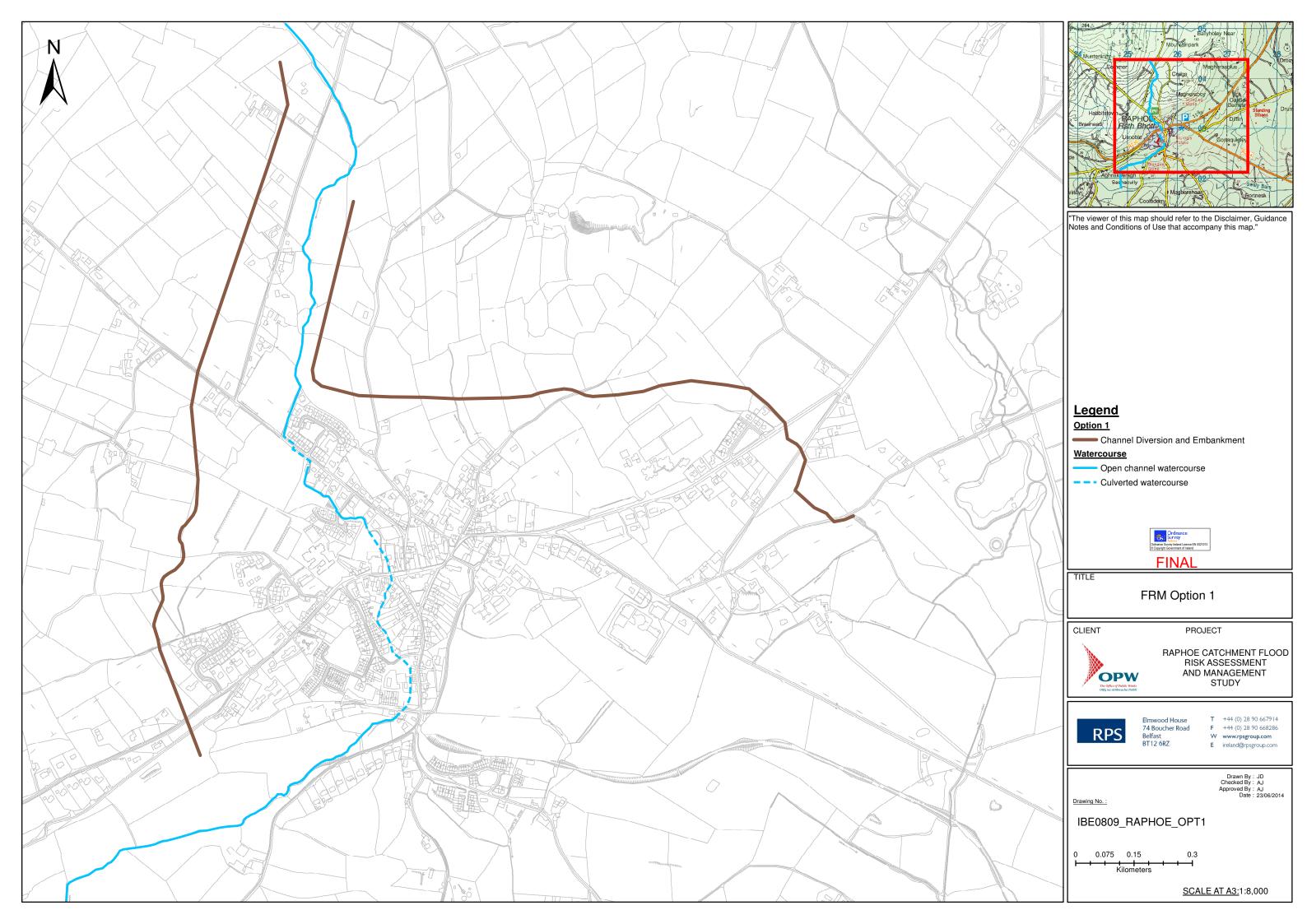

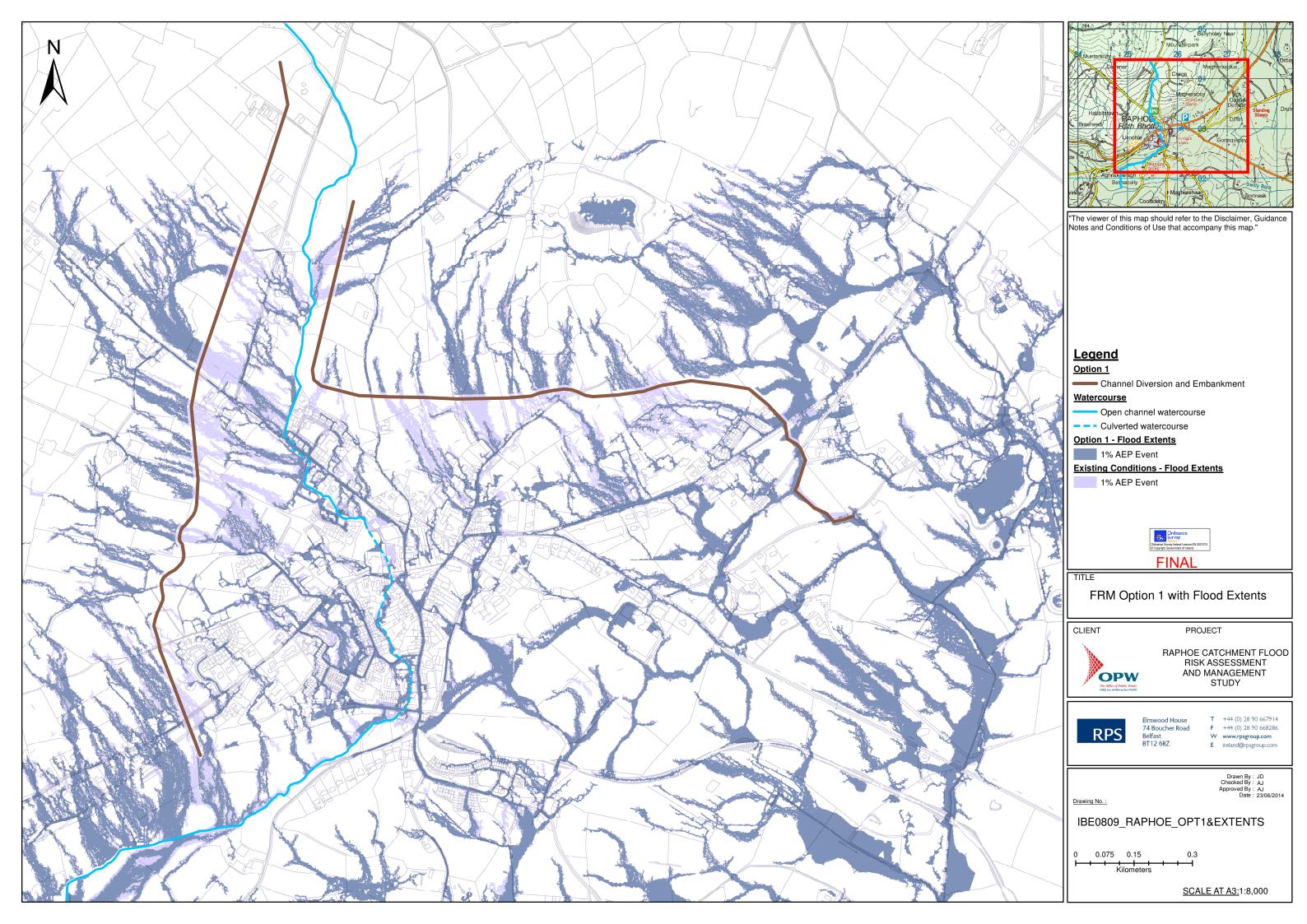


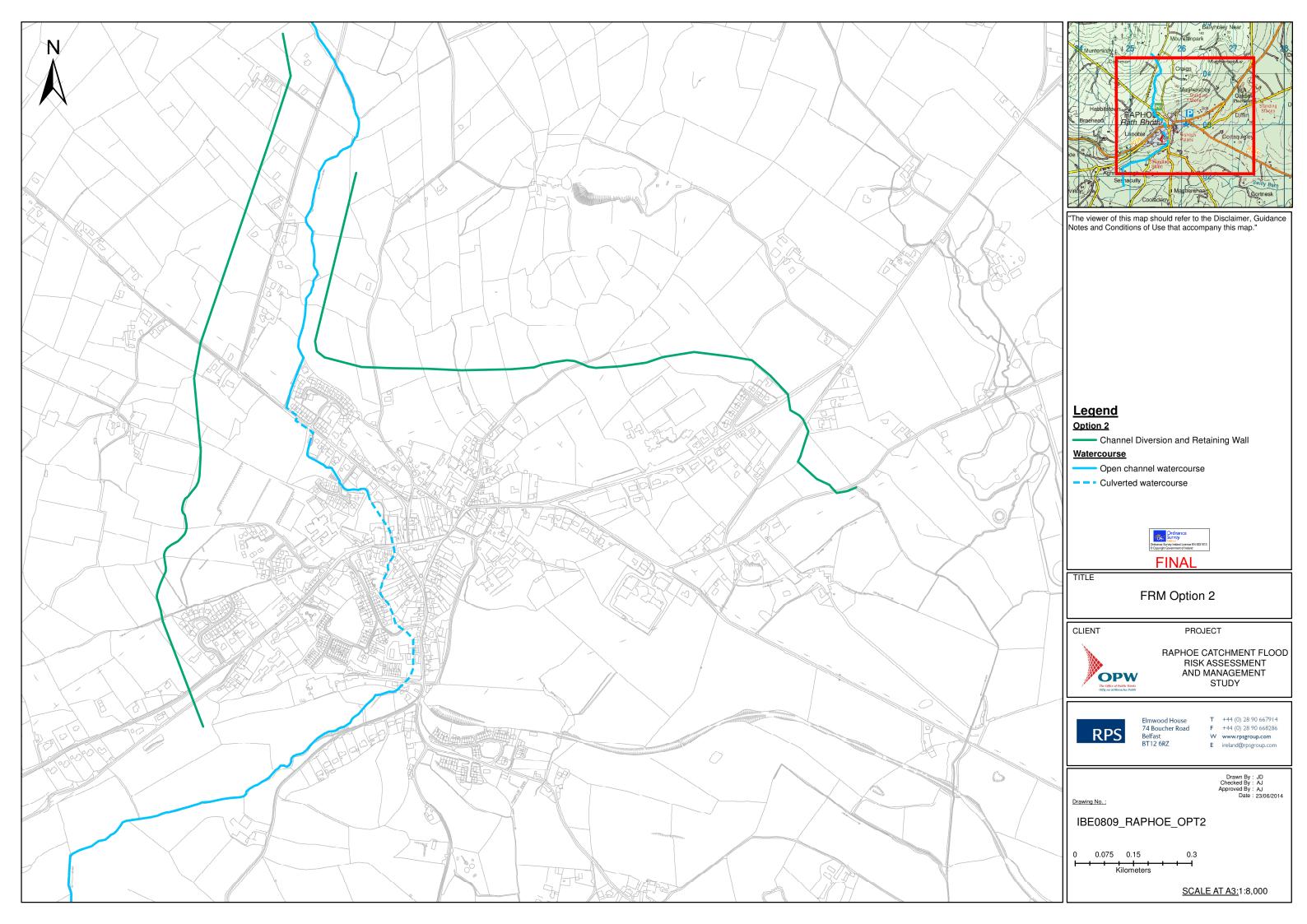


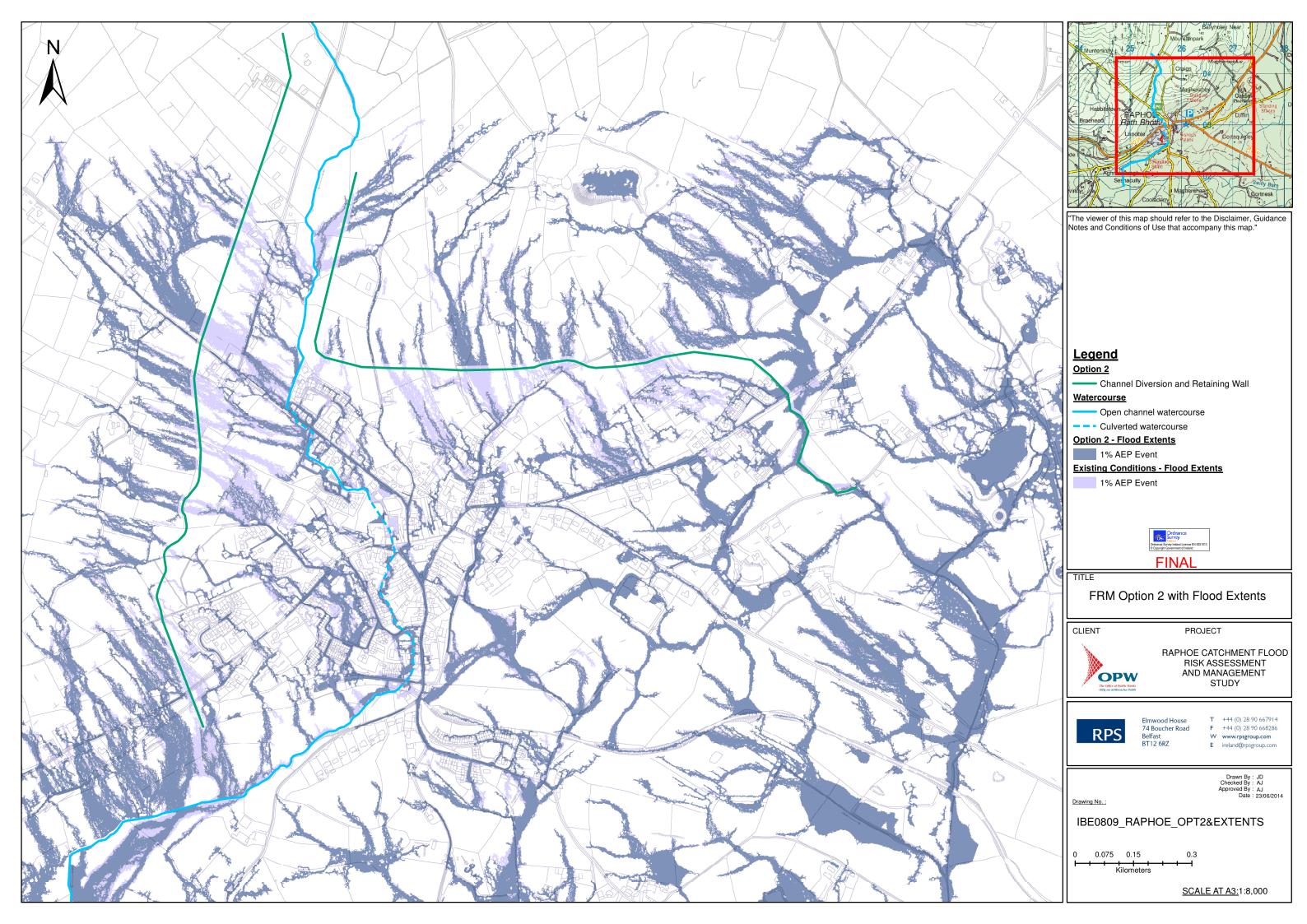


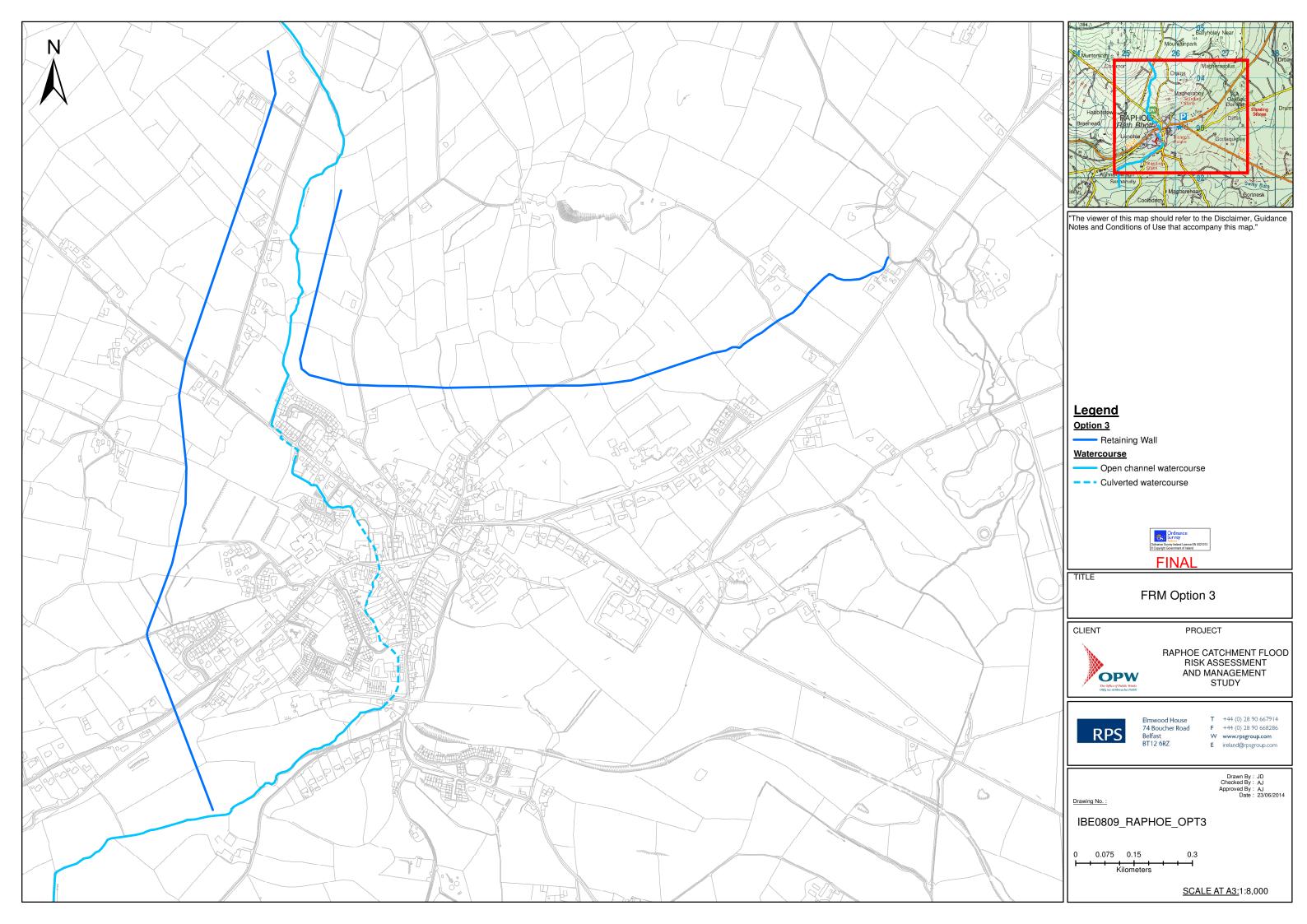
Appendix B Potential FRM Options

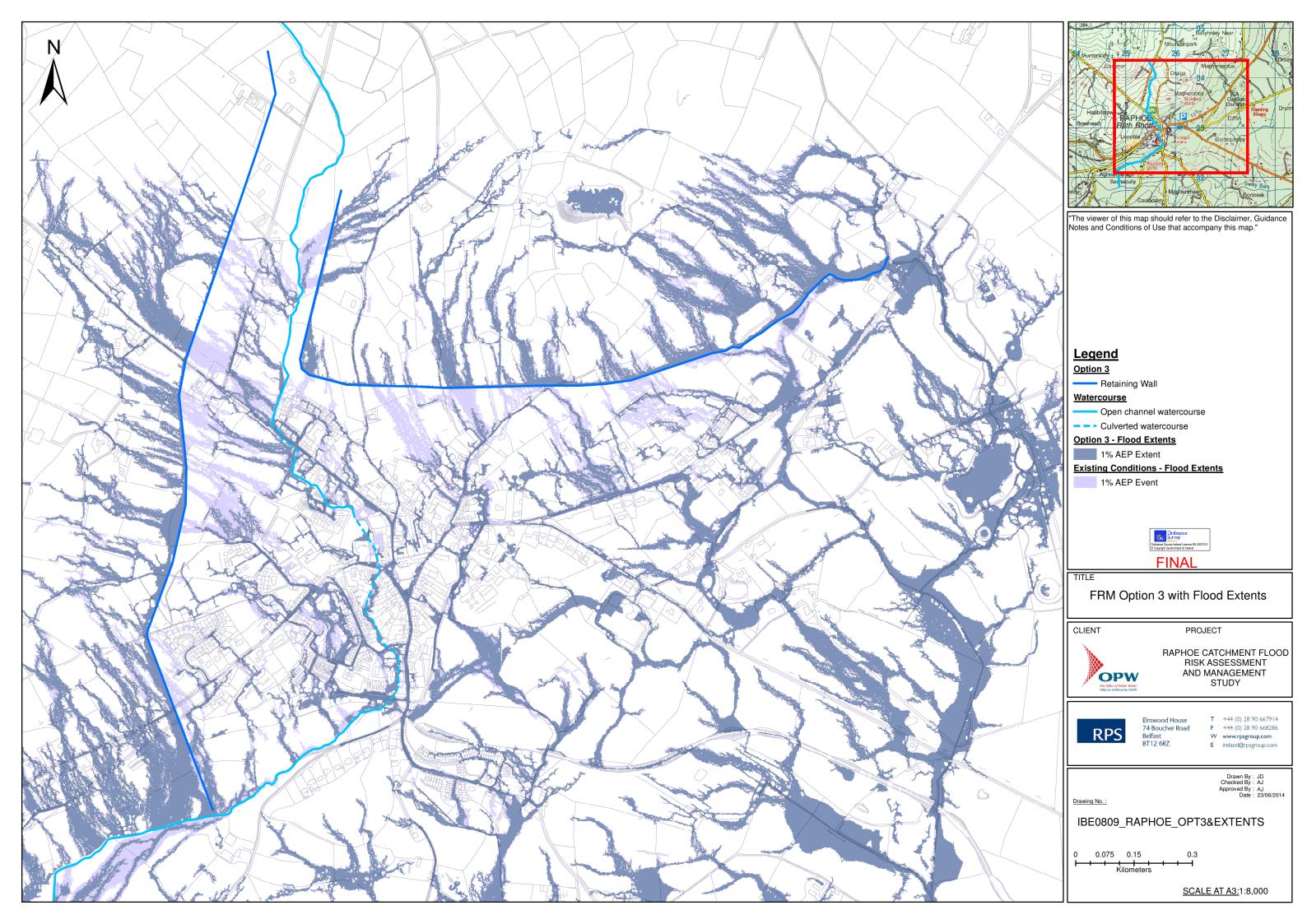

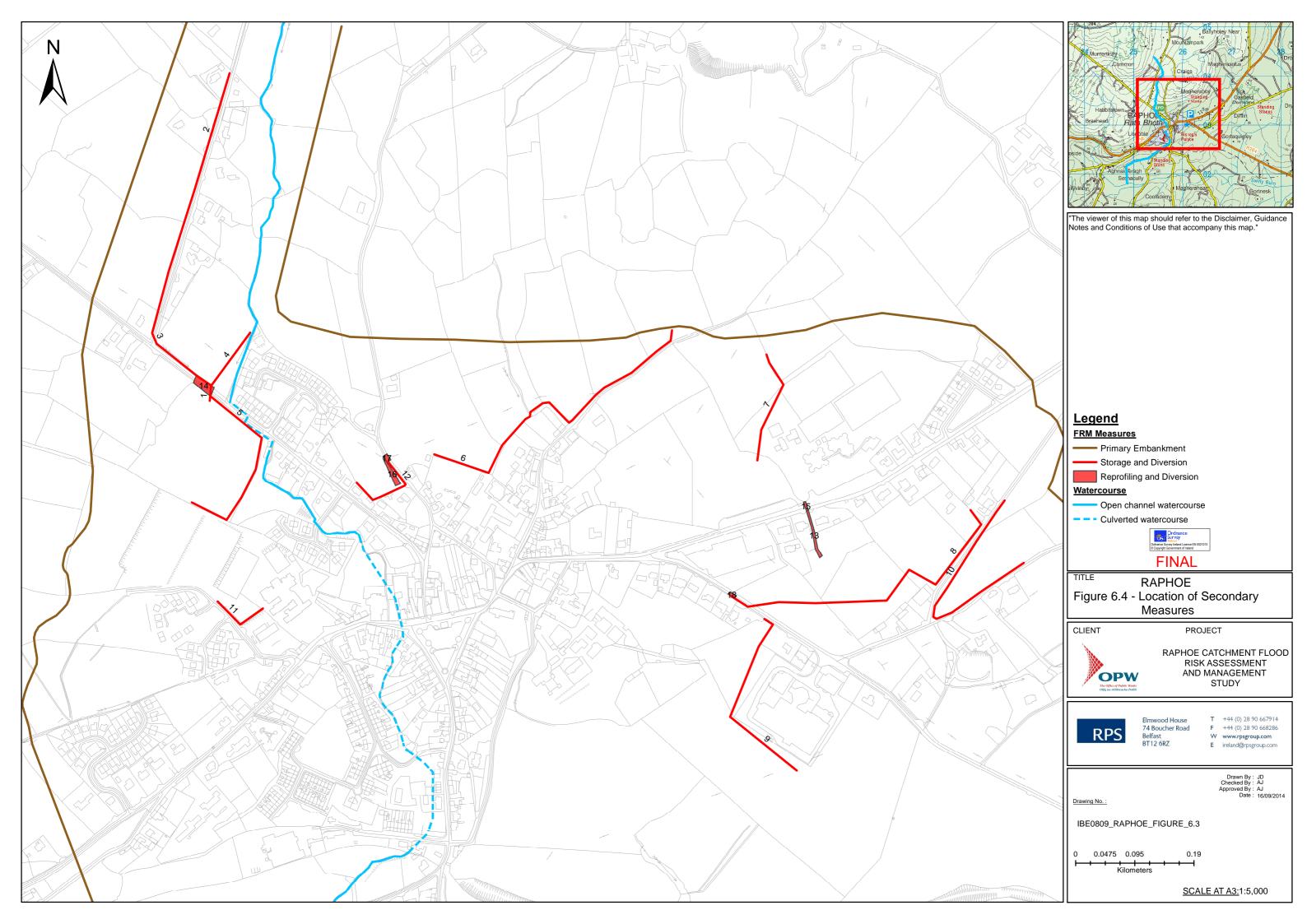
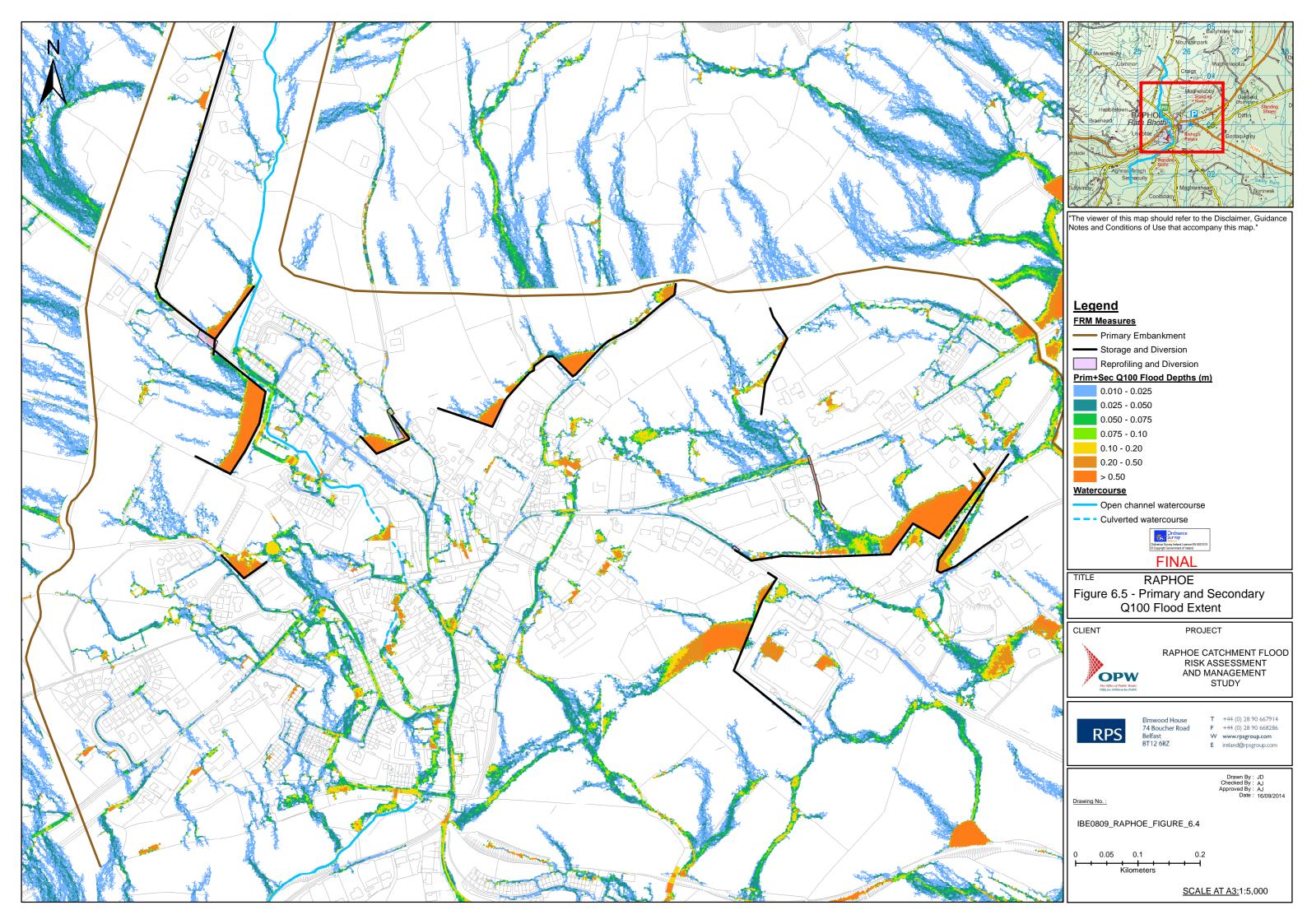
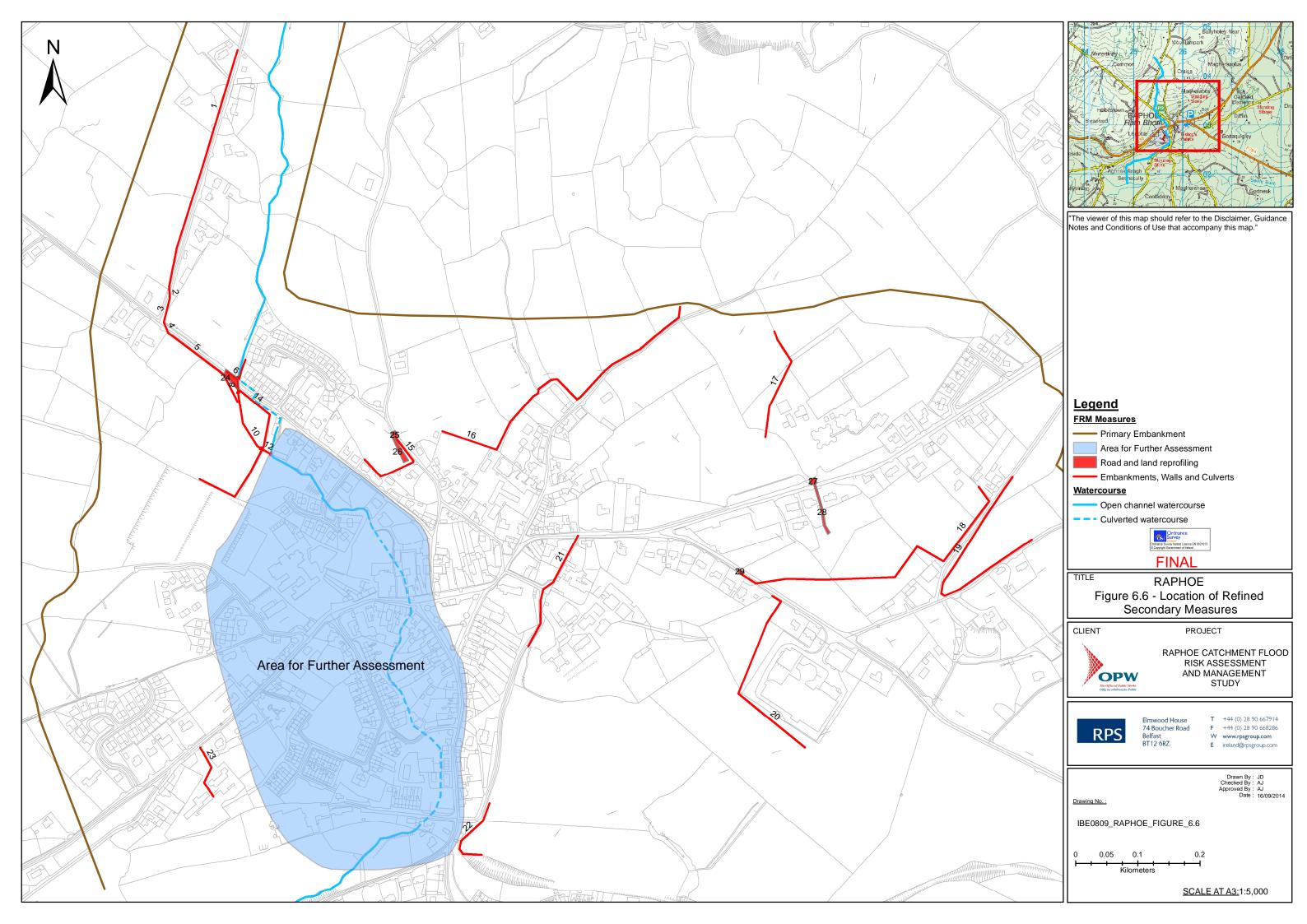


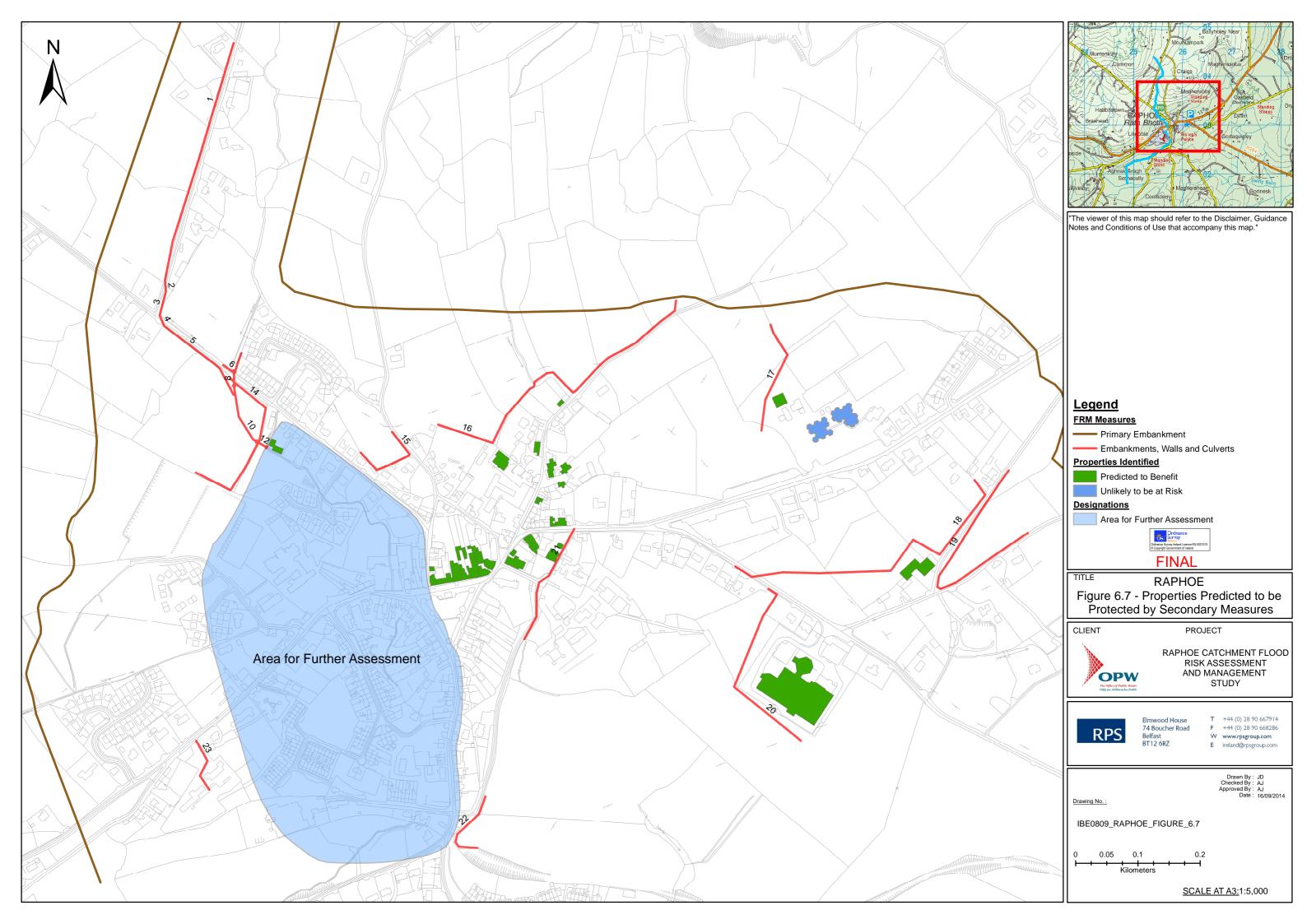
Figure 6.2 Comments - Secondary Measures

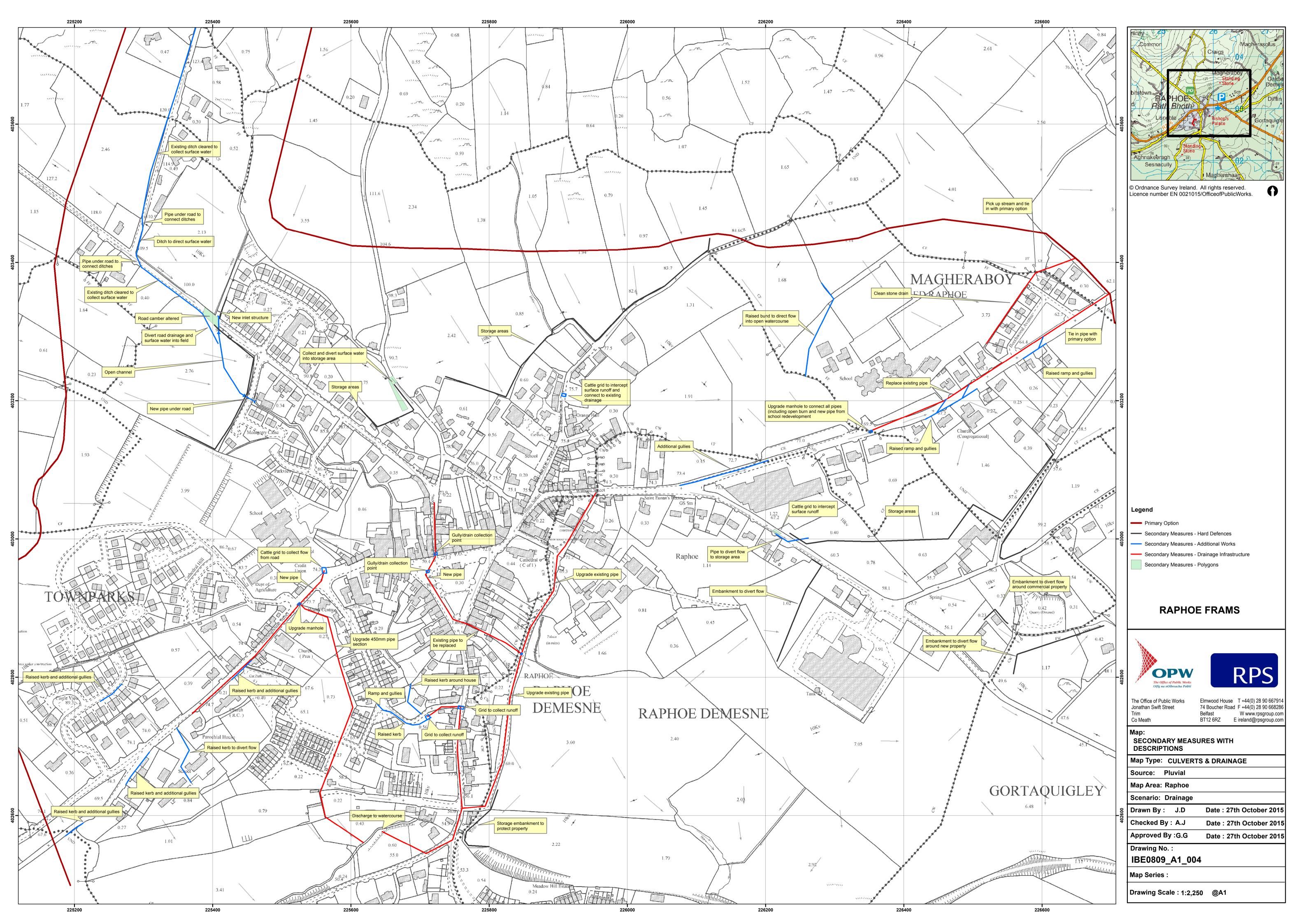


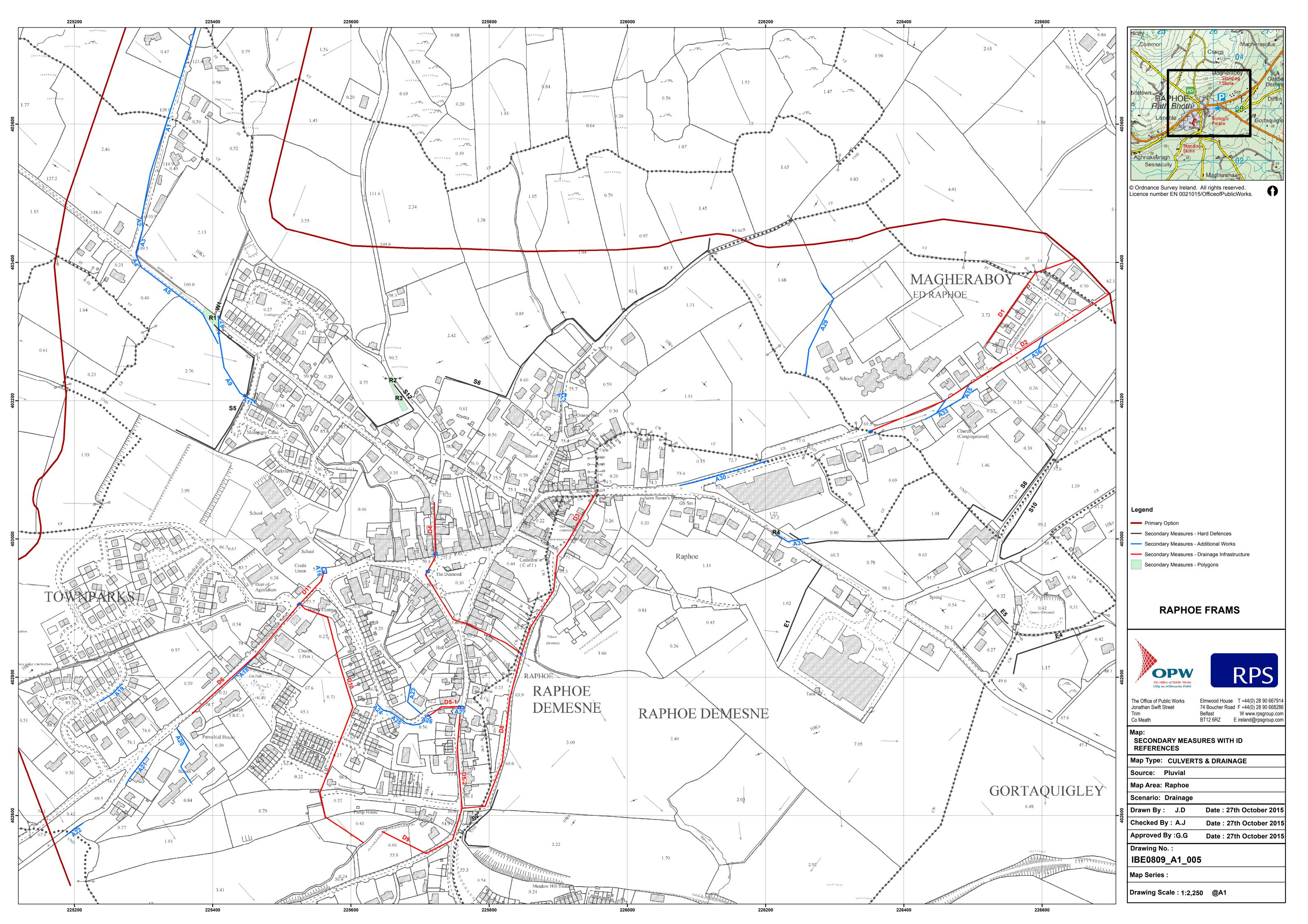
Appendix G Map of Existing Drainage Infrastructure
