### Overview

These blackline masters in the measurement stand of mathematics have been devised to:

provide teachers with activities to reinforce teaching objectives related to required aspects of curriculum documents;
give teachers alternative approaches so students can practice the necessary skills;
be time saving (teachers don't have to prepare worksheets);
provide enrichment activities;
provide starting points for teachers;

As such the book covers concepts directed towards meeting curriculum references for:

For children to learn effectively they need to be taught using a problem solving approach involving only one new concept being introduced at a time, with plenty of time to practise new skills. Opportunities should be given for children to work together in groups or pairs and to discover why they need to learn mathematics and how it relates to everyday life.

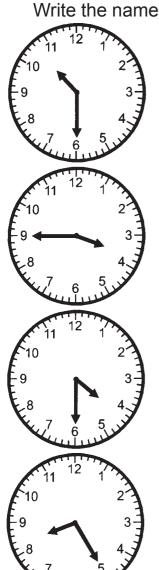
