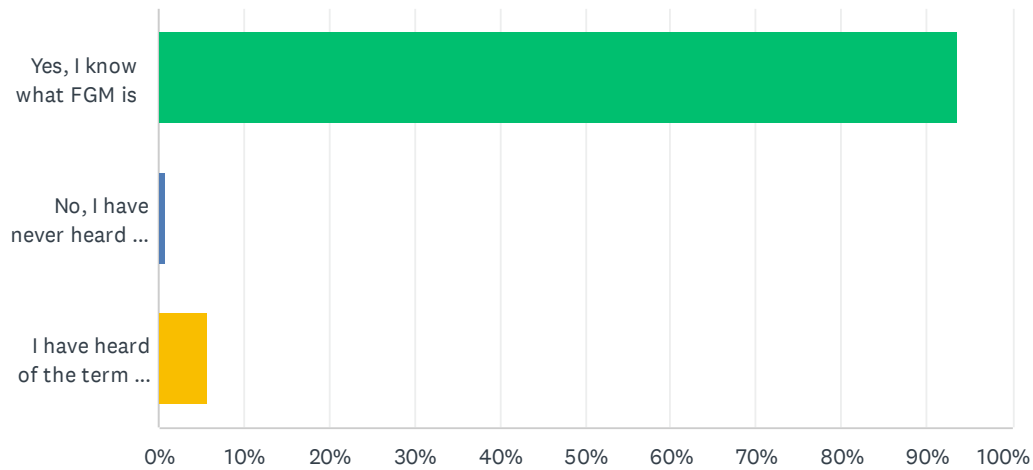


Q1 Do you know what female genital mutilation (FGM) is?

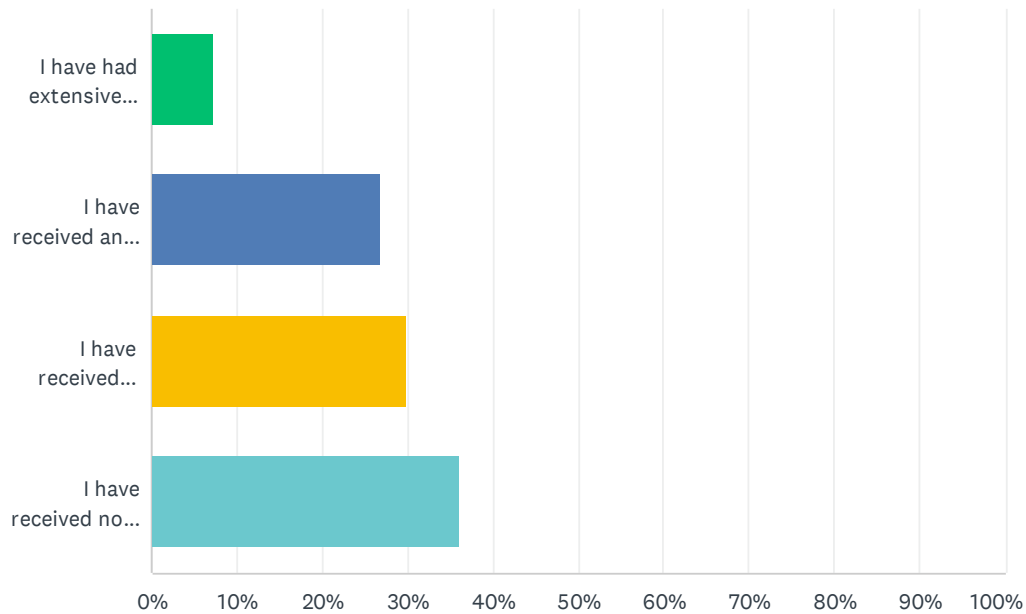

Q2 How much training have you received on FGM?

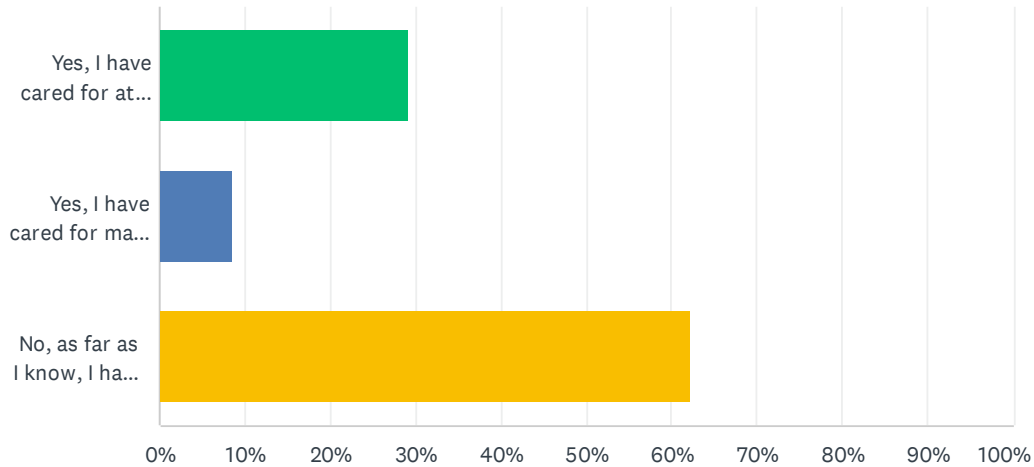

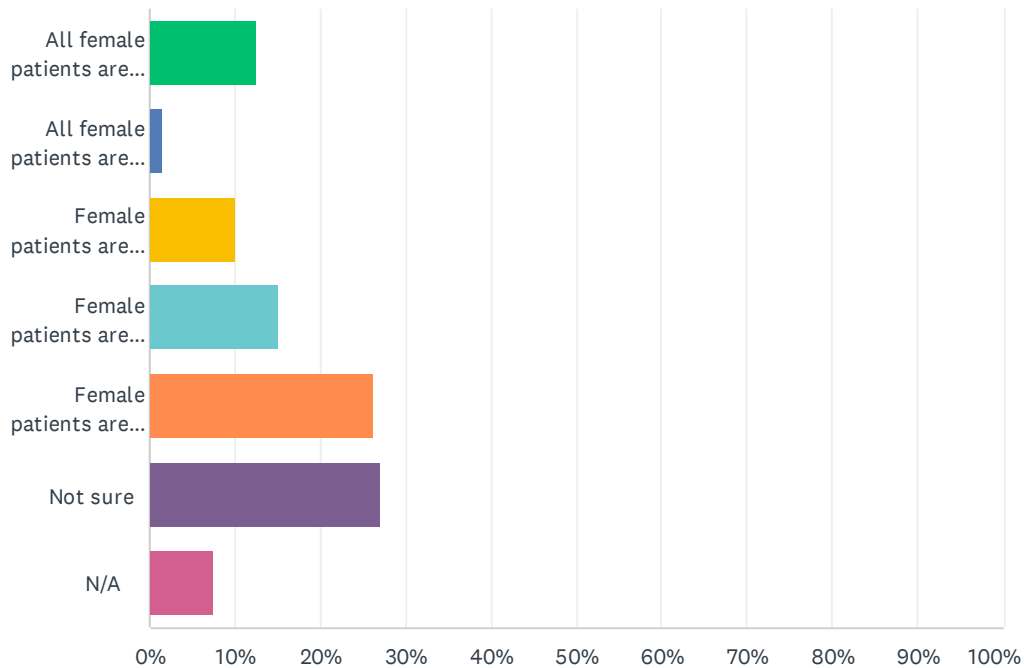

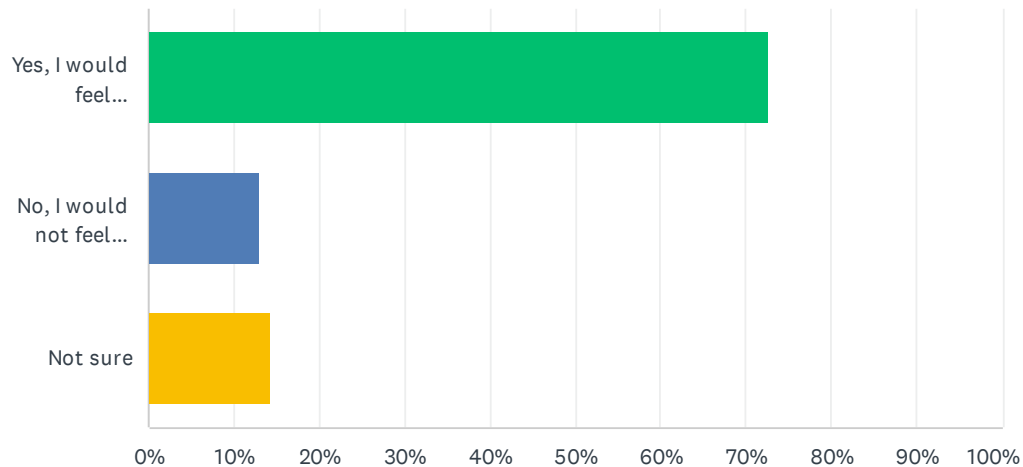

Q5 Would you feel comfortable asking a patient about FGM if you had suspicions that they were a survivor?

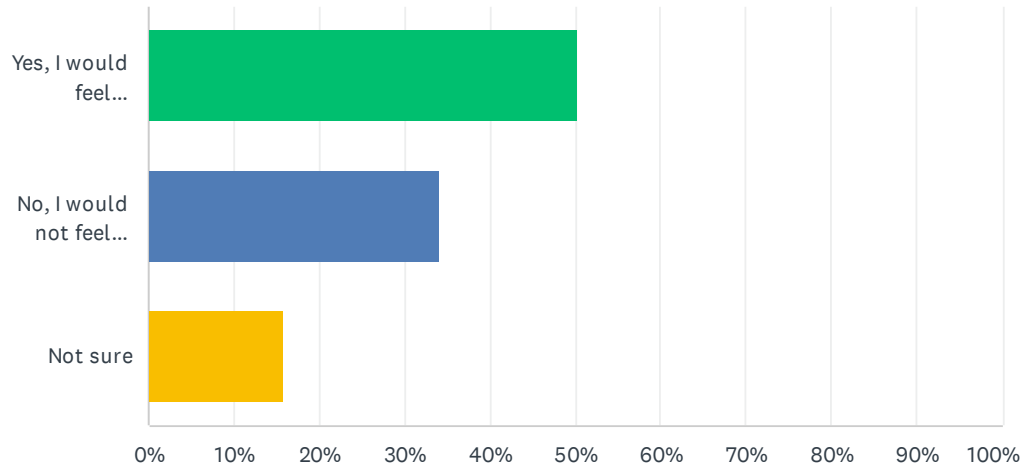

Q6 Would you feel comfortable routinely asking all female patients about whether they have been subjected to FGM?

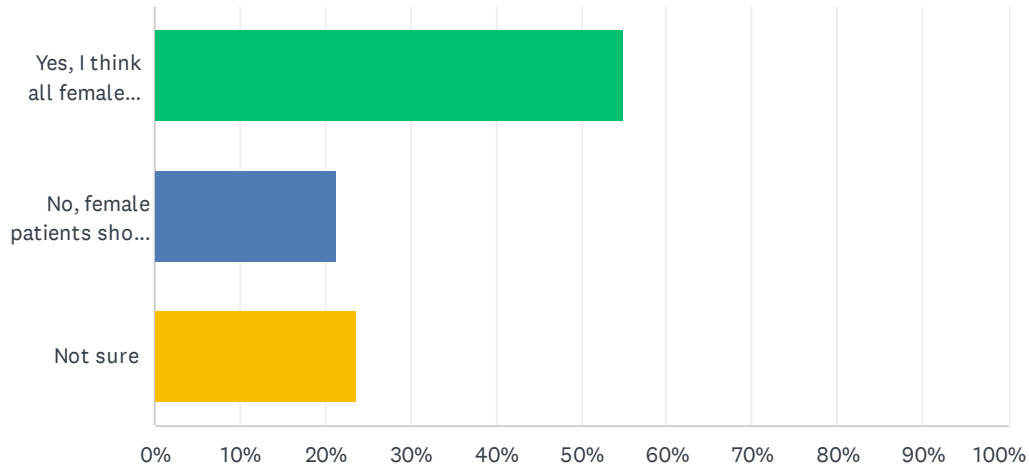

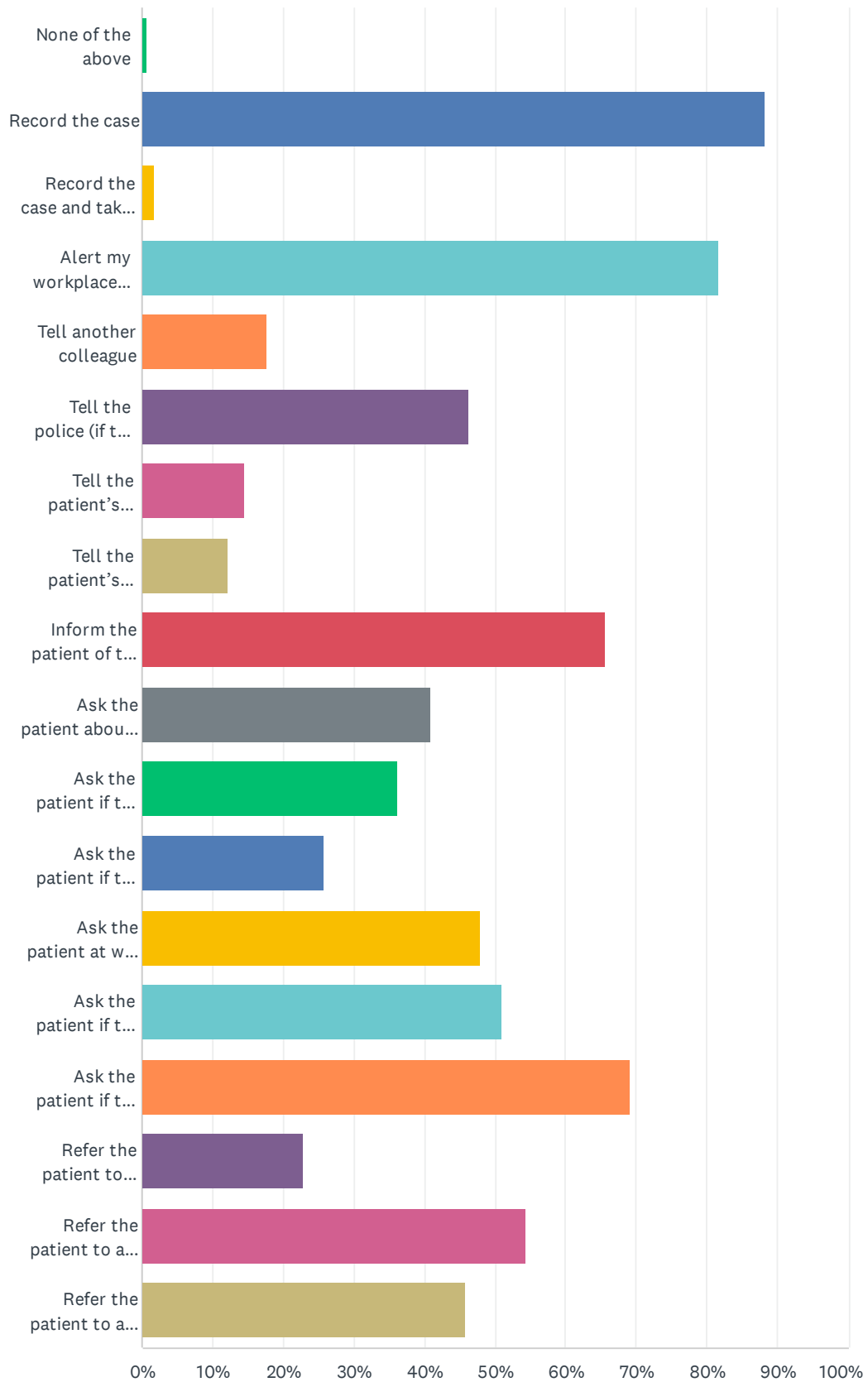

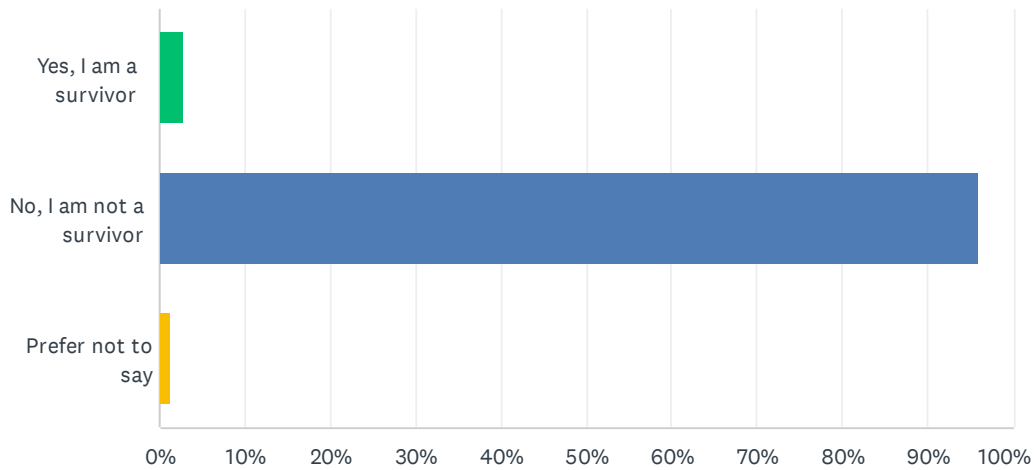

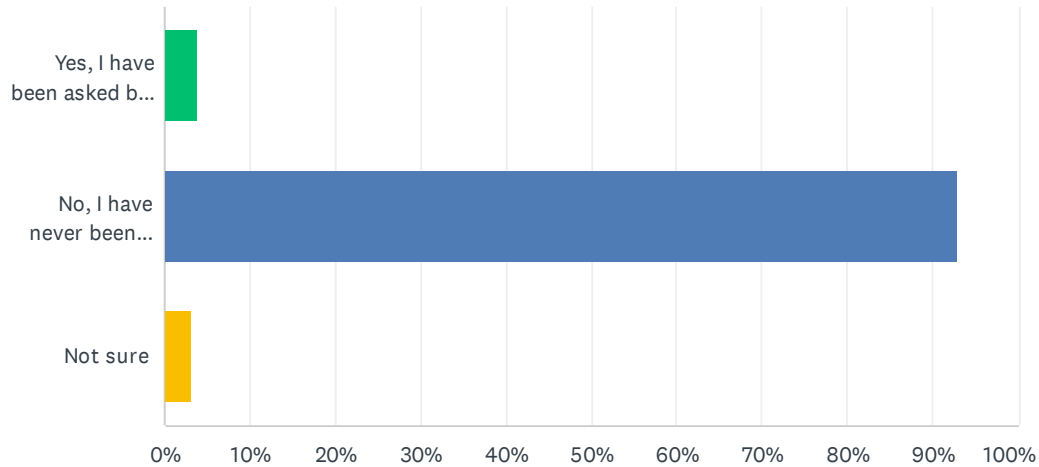

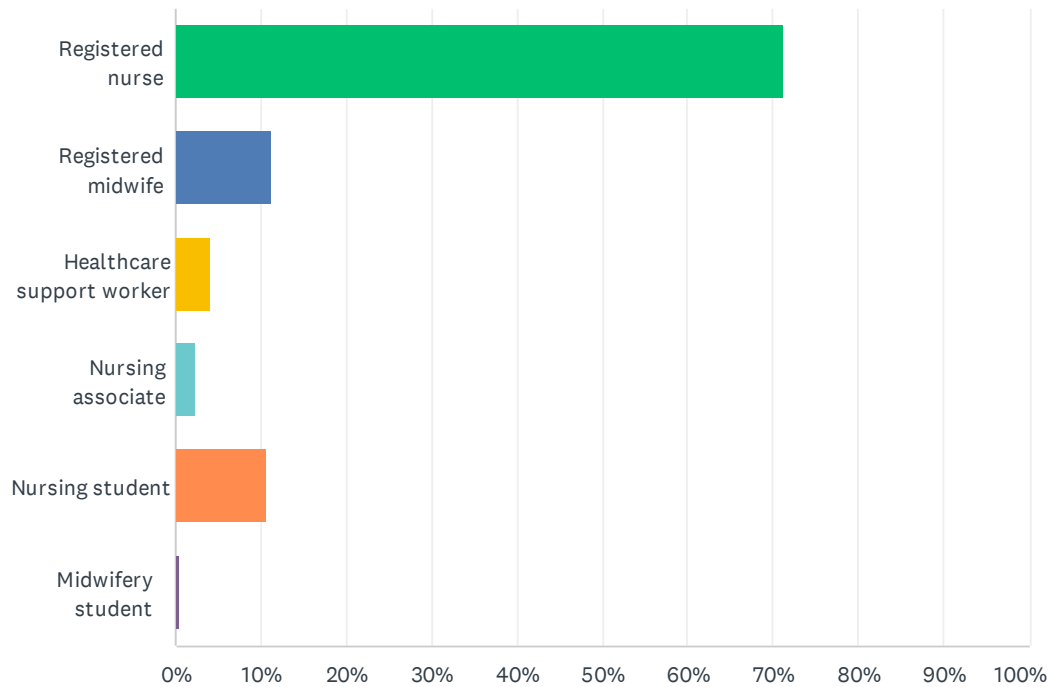

Q13 Which of the following best describes your role?

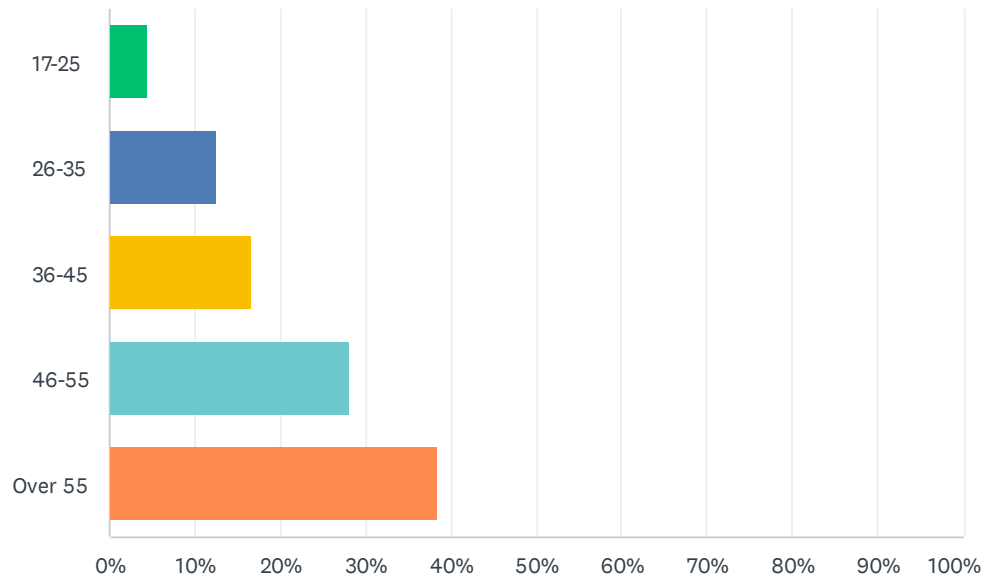

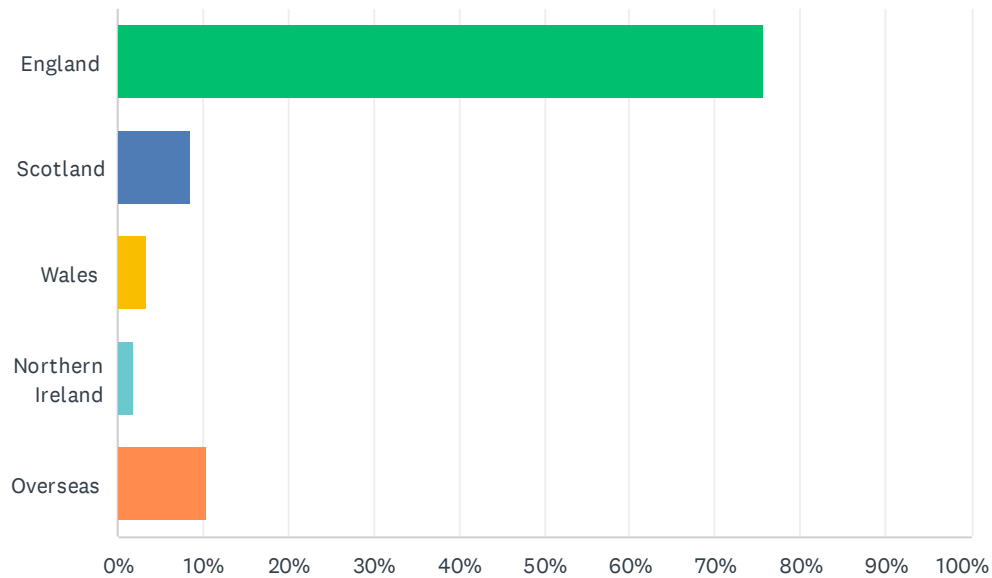
