VALUATION REPORT BY H. PRETORIUS/VALUER FOR GASTROWORLD GEBAUER

1. VALUATION INSTRUCTION:

I was instructed by Mrs Gebauer to determine the probable market value of Section No. 24 on Portion 29 of the Farm Ujams No. 288.

2. DEFINITION OF MARKET VALUE:

The definition of Market Value as laid down by the International Valuation Standards are as follows:

"The estimated amount for which a property should exchange on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arms-length transaction after proper marketing where-in the parties has each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion".

3. DATE OF INSPECTION:

I have inspected the subject property on Tuesday the 17th of June 2025.

4. DATE OF VALUATION:

I have completed the valuation report on Friday the 20th of June 2025.

5. PURPOSE OF VALUATION:

The purpose of this valuation is to determine the probable market value of the subject property.

6. DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY:

Section No. 24 on Portion 29 of the Farm Ujams No. 288 is situated in the municipal area of the City of Windhoek and is **8 929 m² in extent.**

The subject property is also situated in Kudu Gas Street and has a zoning of "Industrial" with a bulk of 1 and a coverage of 75%.

The subject property is located in the industrial park known as "Barleo Park".



7. DESCRIPTION OF IMPROVEMENTS:

<u>Section No. 24</u> consists of a double storey office, warehouse, mezzanine floor, shade-net parking, paving and electrified boundary walls.

<u>The office</u> consists of a kitchenette with BIC, ablutions and 1 office on the ground floor.

The first floor consists of 1 office.

Minor improvements consist of 2 air-conditioning units and an alarm system.

8. CONSTRUCTION OF IMPROVEMENTS:

<u>The offices</u> are built with cement brick walls, IBR roof sheeting, concrete and rhino board ceilings, aluminium frame windows with ceramic tiles on the floors.

<u>The warehouses</u> are built with cement brick walls, IBR roof sheeting, sisalation and cement floors.

<u>All the improvements</u> are in a good condition and need some minor maintenance work on the inside and outside.



9. MARKET INFORMATION:

9.1 Market Conditions:

The Namibian economy has held up relatively well in the past few years. However, the past four years was a big struggle for the economy and a growth of \pm 4,3% for the year 2024. In 2025 it is expected to achieve similar results with a steady recovery. Mining output and the short-term intervention programmes by the government will be implemented to aid economic growth in 2025.

Despite the risk posed by inflation and the higher than desirable consumer credit growth numbers, which may lead to higher interest rates, chances are that the Namibian economy will grow with $\pm 4,5 \%$ during 2025.

9.2 Domestic Interest Rates:

The Bank of Namibia almost mechanically followed the South African Reserve Banks interest rate policy. However, since the beginning of 2008 the Bank of Namibia has followed a more independent policy by focusing only on foreign reserves and credit growth. The continuing global economic uncertainties and possible spillover effects for the domestic economy, resulted in the Bank of Namibia keeping the Repo Rate to 6,75%, effective from June 2025. Monetary policy makers will continue to find a balance between supporting economic growth and managing inflationary pressures.

Inflationary pressures remain relatively contained; however, interest rates should remain stable in the second quarter of 2025.

9.3 Inflation Rate:

Annual inflation is currently on \pm 3,5% and it is expected that inflation will trend upwards in 2025, mainly as a result of the unstable Economic conditions in leading countries and the impact of a weakening Namibian Dollar on the prices of imported goods. Inflation is expected to average around 3,6% for 2025 as a whole.

9.4 Exchange Rate and Global Conditions:

The Namibian economy is very open and as a result very dependent on global and regional markets and exchange rate developments.

In this regard the outlook for economic improvements both globally and regionally remains cloudy. In addition, there is also a strong focus from global investors on risk aversion, which generally results in weaker emerging market currencies (including the N\$ and ZAR). A weaker currency will generally be supportive of the local economy. The Namibian Dollar is currently trading at around N\$ 17-97 to the US\$.

9.5 Market Research and Application:

The City of Windhoek has experienced a stabilizing trend over the past year in most of the property sectors, i.e., residential, general business, industrial, general residential units, etc.

The area in which the subject property is situated is coming from a good base, as the area had historic good marketing activity and the developed erven consist of predominant owner occupancy.

There has been a stable demand for occupation at the surrounding addresses, as can be witnessed by the fairly good tenant occupancy in the surrounding area.

9.6 Economic Outlook:

The Namibian economy is estimated to have recovered moderately during 2024 and is projected to improve further during 2025 and 2026, supported by better growth for the mining industry and most tertiary industries.

Domestic economic growth was at 4,8 percent for 2024 and is expected to improve to 5,6 percent in 2025 and 6,0 percent in 2026. The 2024 growth estimate was revised down to 4,5 percent published in the September 2024 Economic Outlook update, largely reflecting lower performance for sectors like non-metallic minerals products, construction, wholesale and retail trade, and financial services.

The projected improvement in 2025 will be supported by the mining industry and most of the industries in the tertiary sector.

10. VALUATION OF PROPERTY:

When valuing real estate, the Valuer must concern himself with placing a value on the rights attached to the property and the benefits of occupation and /or ownership thereof.

In the valuation process, cognisance must be taken of the purpose for which the property is capable of being used for and the future income which it is likely to produce. At the same time the property must be compared with available substitutes and/or alternative investment opportunities.

<u>The object of the valuation process</u> is to arrive at a figure, which will reflect the point of equilibrium between supply and effective demand at the time of valuation.

Property's utility value or capacity to satisfy the needs and wants of humans creates value. Contributing to the value of a particular property is general uniqueness, durability, price, fixity of location, relatively limited supply and the specific utility of a given site.

I will make use of the following <u>Income Capitalization Valuation method</u>, to determine the probable market value of the subject property.
