#### CALL FOR ABSTRACT

Scientific contributions shall be sent in the form of abstracts.

Publishing regulations: The abstract shall be written in both Italian or English and include:

- Title
- First author (name, surname, affiliation, telephone, e-mail)
- Other authors (name, surname, affiliation)
- One of the following subject areas Longevity Fraility Welfare Technology
- Brief curriculum (in Italian) of the first author

The text should not be more than 5,000 characters including spaces (please do not insert images, tables or attachments). Abbreviations are not allowed in the title and if they are used in the body, they must be preceded by the full registered name on the first occasion that it appears.

**Deadline:** The abstract shall be sent exclusively by e-mail to the Scientific Administrative Office: margherita.campanello@fondazioneferrero.it by 31 August 2017.

The author presenting the work will receive an e-mail to confirm receipt. Once the deadline has passed, the papers will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee of the Conference. Each first author will receive notice by 30 September 2017 regarding possible acceptance. The accepted abstracts will be published in the conference proceedings.

**Ferrero Foundation Award**: Travel Award (travel expenses and accommodations for the duration of the conference) for **the first authors of the three best abstracts**, who will make an oral presentation on the awarded contribution during the afternoon scientific session on Friday, 10 November.

#### **CME CREDITS**
