The Chairman will arrange for all track & trace candidates to be contacted in the event of an outbreak. • Reduce numbers / maintain distancing on premises in general, and all internal areas • Seating in the clubhouse, changing areas, technical areas and stands will be extended, taken out, or otherwise clearly marked to maintain minimum distancing of 2m face to face or 1.5m ("2arms lengths") side by side • Reduce use of changing rooms to absolute minimum, staggering use as necessary to maintain distancing in the space available. • Maximum permitted group size of 30 persons • Use remote meeting technology instead of onsite briefings where possible • Minimise participants in team briefings to only the first 11 • Enforce 2m separation as far as practicable • Where <2m is unavoidable, face to be worn & disposed after use • Players and officials to attend matches dressed for play, other than boots which can be changed outdoors • Stagger post match changing & shower times • Partially remove seating and showers from use to enable distancing • Awareness campaigns including: • team briefings, • poster signs & notices • website information • formation sharing with interested parties by email • Organise indoor & outdoor transit routes areas to maintain separation as far as practicable, using signage, floor markings and 1-way systems where possible • Hold team talks, Half time breaks and briefings outdoors • Maintain fresh air ventilation as far as practicable, keep doors & windows open • Reduce shared travel	After con Likelil Consequ	ntrols hood ences ating	Further
