## Goalkeeper:

**David Hughes:** David Hughes was signed at the beginning of September 2018 and is a proven shot stopper after spending three years at Harlow Town. In the 2018/19 season, he made 31 appearances, winning 20 of those games with seven clean sheets.



## Defenders:

**Jack Mochalski:** Jack joined the Millers after an impressive pre-season in July 2019. Mochalski has previously played for Great Shelford, Great Wakering Rovers, Romford and Barkingside. The defender has been a key piece at Soham Town Rangers and featured heavily for the Greens over the past three seasons.

**George Allen:** Commanding central defender who joins us from Coggeshall Town for the 2019/20 season. He has previously played for Bishop's Stortford, Canvey Island, Welling, East Thurrock and Stevenage.

**Jake Pitty:** Signed for the Millers in October 2018 from Canvey Island and went on to make 15 appearances assisting twice. He would've played more games during the 2018/19 season but was injured, but looks to kick on in 2019/20.

**Harry Gibbs:** In 2016/17 he featured 31 times and did start off playing for us at the start of last season playing five times, before leaving when former manager Terry Spillane was in charge. That move saw Harry Gibbs go to Brentwood Town where he featured at right back and centre half, the 20-year old made 47 appearances scoring four goals, including a fantastic header against us near the end of last season. **Sam Mvemba:** Mvemba, 19, made 40 appearances for Romford, mainly at left back where he helped the club climb out of the relegation place and into safety at the expense of Norwich United back in 2017/18. Sam joined Romford from Barking Abbey where he was named coaches player of the year in the 2016/17 season. He made over 40 appearances for the Millers last season. (Left).

# MEET THE VISITORS: MALDON & TIPTREE

The re-establishment of normal life after the war saw the formation of Maldon Town FC in 1946, with their HQ at the Rose and Crown in the High Street and home venue was at Sadd's Ground on the causeway.

The Mid-Essex League Div 2 gave them their first league trophy in that season, when they gained the runners-up spot. Now transferring their home ground to the Promenade Park and joining the North-Essex League, they once again achieved runners-up spot in this league and were also runners-up in the Essex Junior Cup. Returning to the Mid-Essex Premier Division saw them lift the league title in consecutive seasons, as well as the league cup in 1949/50 Season. Success now followed them to their newly acquired Wallace Binder ground in Fambridge Road, joining the Essex and Suffolk Border League, that season the runners up spot was gained but the major trophy that year was lifting the Essex Intermediate Cup, beating a strong Leytonstone Reserve team 2-1.

Ex-Liverpool hero Kevin Baron took over the management reins continuing the success when his teams gained the runners up position in the Essex Intermediate Cup in 1964/65, 1965/66. The league winning team of 1965/66 gained them senior status, and they joined the Eastern Counties League in 1966. After six years in this league they joined the Essex Senior League, picking up the league title in 1984/85 and almost completing the double when beaten in the final of the league cup by Chelmsford City Reserves. Moving to the new ground in Park Drive in 1994, and crossing the pyramid structure to return to the Eastern Counties League in 1996 under the continued management of Ben Embery and his assistant Steve Jackson, the pair were very unfortunate not to obtain promotion in their first season in the Jewson League (ECL). Our second year in the League proved to be a different story, with the team gaining promotion to the Premier Division, ending the 1997/98 season in the runners-up position.

In our first year in the Premier League we finished a creditable 13th position and improved that to eighth in the second year. We now entered a new era with a new manager Colin Wallington, in our third year in the Premier League we finished fourth and now looked good to progress further. In season 2002/03 we reached the semi final of the FA Vase losing to local rivals AFC Sudbury.

After 14 years as chairman Bob Large decided to stand down as he felt he had taken the Club as far as he could. The new chairman Mike Kirkham stated that he hoped to take the Club to the next step up the ladder in a few years. Season 2005/06 after two promotion seasons we found ourselves in the Ryman Premier. This found us fighting relegation for the whole season, with our fate still being in our own hands right up to the last 3 games of the season. We did reach the final of the Thames Side Trophy losing 3-1 to Canvey Island and also the final of the Eastern Floodlit Competition losing on penalties 5-3 to Billericay Town.

# MEET THE VISITORS: MALDON & TIPTREE

Season 2006/07 saw us play in the Ryman North Division, where we finished fourth, and due to the Club not applying for promotion, the club were excluded from the play offs.

The 2007/08 season started with a new Manager Russell Tanner, after Colin Wallington left the club to join Tiptree Utd Russell brought in Dean Parrott as his assistant. The club made several major signings during the close season but these players moved on when Clubs from a higher level came in for them, this left Russell and Dean to bring in some fresh faces from Russell Tanner's former Club Witham Town plus some of the talented youngsters on the books who went on to win the Clubs Best Young Player Award that season, although the club never got to the play offs It was felt that the team had a good season.

In September 2008 former Tottenham and Millwall player Stuart Nethercott was promoted from his position of Assistant Manager to Caretaker Manager (and ultimately to permanent Manager) following the departure of Russell Tanner. Stuart's reign lasted a year, as he was replaced by former Manager Colin Wallington who hoped to bring back some of the good times to Maldon Town. Season 2009/10 saw mixed fortunes on the pitch, due in part to the large turnover of players during the period it took the new management to put together their own team. Away from the pitch new Chairman, Alan Brockhouse and his Committee entered into a ground share arrangement with local Club Tiptree United, which, as the season progressed, saw the relationship between the two Clubs grow stronger giving obvious signs that further, more formal, amalgamation of the two Clubs seemed on the cards.

In 2009 Ed Garty took over as chairman/Owner at Maldon Town as well as running Tiptree United. In 2010 Ed Garty merged both clubs and formed Maldon & Tiptree FC. Following the retirement of Manager, Colin Wallington, assistants, Brad King and Glen Knight were promoted to Joint Managers and put in charge of the Club for the season under the new name of Maldon & Tiptree Football Club.

Season 2010/2011 saw the new club placed in or around the play-off positions for the majority of the season. Despite another high turnover of players, the good standard of football was maintained and it was frustrating for the club to fall away in the later stages of the season when suspensions and injuries eventually took their toll to leave the club frustratingly short of the play-off positions at the end of April. Following King and Knight's departure during that season Mike Flanagan came in and took on the caretaker role and steered the club to a respectable mid-table position. At the start of the 2012-13 campaign, Ex- Stansted & Redbridge boss Terry Spillane was appointed as Manager. After a fantastic start to the season, the club found them-selves at the top of the table but an incredible run by eventual Champions Grays Athletic meant Maldon had to settle for a place in the play-offs. Disappointment came in the Final when they lost a two goal lead to draw with Thamesmead Town, who then won through on penalties. Kevin Horlock was the team manager from 2016 & 2017 seasons but unfortunately promotion did not come about through all his hard work. Wayne Brown will continue as manager for season 2019 - 2020 and looks to improve on last season being runners up in the playoff final.

# THE NON LEAGUE PAPER

This season has heralded the news that yet another island team are hoping to enter the Non-League pyramid.

Following in the footsteps of Guernsey, who play at Step 4 and the newly formed Jersey Bulls, who are currently competing in Step 6, a group from the Isle of Man have unveiled plans to create their very own football club, with ambitions to play in the Northwest Counties League in time for the start of next campaign.

This is brilliant news both for the Non-League system and players and fans living on the Isle of Man.

Last year I went to visit Guernsey, where I thoroughly enjoyed watching a match and have subsequently interviewed their manager Tony Vance on a number of occasions.

It was brilliant to see how the island's community had really embraced the team and the atmosphere on matchday was a superb thing to be a part of.

When speaking to Vance it quickly becomes clear just how much pride he has taken in the project and the importance that it has had in developing young players on the island.

Whereas before, making the jump into the professional ranks was extremely hard for young footballers on the island, they now have the opportunity to showcase their talents in England throughout the year.

One of the big drawbacks of starting an island team is the high costs involved, which include having to pay for the travel of both themselves and their opponents, however both Guernsey and Jersey Bulls have demonstrated how, with the support of their local communities, these steep financial commitments can be managed.

The fact that Jersey Bulls were able to attract almost 1000 fans for their very first fixture at the start of the month shows both how island clubs can develop revenue and help to cultivate a special following across the community.

The Isle of Man bid is being led by National Team manager Paul Jones.

When interviewing him last week I was immediately struck by his immense passion for football on the island and his determination to see the project through.

There have been plans in the pipeline to start a team on the Isle of Man for almost 15 years but for one reason or another the project has never come to fruition, until now.

I wish Paul and his colleagues the absolute best of luck in creating a club because these island teams have the potential to unite their communities in such a unique way.
