However, by March we were on track to make history and on track to break even by year end!! This seemed like a dream last July but the hard work of all the team put this in our grasp as we cut our cloth to our income while driving revenue and cutting our costs. But, then came the COVID-19 virus which has disrupted all our lives and has put paid to that. However, we are in the fortunate position that the controls we had put in place to manage our cash flow and by using the government schemes available to us, we have mitigated some of our losses and not had to draw down too heavily on our reserves, so will be ready for "normality" or whatever the new 'normal' will be. We will continue to explore all avenues to ensure that our club continues strongly next season. Do Stay Safe.


