The President's Charity attracted over £700 worth of goods with over 50 separate donations and in particular a fabulous donation from Jerry Winston. Thank you everybody for your generosity in just a two week period and during a lockdown. Those provisions were very gratefully received by two local charities (see article).

Look forward to hearing about more challenges from other individual groups or how about a whole club challenge? Any ideas or volunteers? DISCUSSIONS TO ENHANCE THE SPORTS GROUND AT MONKS LANE

I wanted to update you on some informal discussions that have taken place with West Berkshire Council on the possibility of them renting part of our ground which would be used to improve the availability of community sport in Newbury and surrounding area.

The initial discussions have included options for developing a high-quality artificial grass pitch, floodlights, changing room and possibly other facilities, including a stand which would be available for rugby, football, and other sports activities.

Next week, the Council's Executive will meet to consider a recommendation that formal talks with NRFC begin.

The Club's position is clear in that we would be landlord to the Council in this arrangement and would be looking to enhance the facilities for rugby, provide some financial benefits to the club and retain our independence. If successful, the initiative could improve our sports facilities, including the ability to train all year round and host higher level competitive matches.

David Jones our President who has been involved in the preliminary discussions on behalf of the Board of Trustees "As landlord, NRFC will be seeking to underline our objective to be a key community sports club for Newbury developing modern facilities and improving our long-term financial sustainability. We are supportive of the council's objective to offer sporting opportunities for all age groups locally and we already have 600 playing members at the club. We are expecting that the proposal will enhance the existing rugby facilities".

The next step will be that the Council will make a formal proposal for NRFC to consider, which we await with interest.

Any proposal negotiated will be consulted upon and ultimately be approved by the club's Trustees. Rest assured we are not selling any land and importantly any proposal should not compromise rugby in any way.

Members will be updated on progress as talks develop but if you have any questions in the meantime, please get in touch.



FEBRUARY, FLATULENCE AND BLUE LIGHTS

Bad news stories, tragic news stories. My God we didn't have to look too far to see these last year. And it continues. Far too many. Far too much tragedy. But if you want to hear some good news, some optimism, some glass half full stuff spend an hour in the company of Simon Best, Head Coach of the U6 minis. It was all very normal, dog in the car, a short drive and then a gentle jog. Part way through the jog, a feeling of fuzziness, something not quite right and within a couple of hours, Simon found himself in an ambulance being rushed to John Radcliffe hospital in Oxford for an emergency operation for a burst aneurysm causing a bleed on his brain. Now I'm not a medical expert but that is a serious condition and as Simon says, "Luckily they were able to operate in time so there should be no long lasting issues, and with the incredible support of my wife Melanie and my family, I am



making a swift recovery." Great news, and I know I am speaking for everyone involved at the club in wishing Simon all the very best for a full recovery and here's to a return to normal Sunday mornings when he again takes charge of the U6 sessions and is back in full flow, fart jokes and all, which not surprisingly the kids love.

Growing up in Bristol, Simon was surrounded by rugby and he played for Gordano RFC from the age of 7, "where I found my love of rugby," Bristol Grammar School and Bristol Schools as a front row forward. He once played alongside Mark Regan, ex England and British Lions hooker although by Simon's own admission he was not quite at that standard. University at Southampton saw him playing for the Medics mainly for social reasons and when the time came to take up paid employment Simon devoted much of his time to work rather than playing rugby. In fact it was not until his own son started at Newbury minis that he once again became involved with the game. Like many enthusiastic parents it was not long before the involvement resulted in his coaching the U6 age group, which he has now been doing for four seasons. Alongside his coaching role he is responsible for encouraging mums and dads to take the U6's on to the next stage of their rugby careers when they reach the U7's.

Anyone who has seen the U6 Sunday morning sessions will know the enthusiasm Simon brings to the sessions and he is acutely aware of the importance of making the sessions fun but also to instill in the children the values that underpin rugby, values relating to respect for teammates, respect for coaches and respect for opposition. He says that the best part of being involved with children this age comes around about February each year when something clicks with the children and they seem to get it in terms of playing for each other, when all of a sudden the chaos of previous months changes into what amounts to something approaching rugby, the beginning of an understanding of what the game is all about. He was unprepared for the huge sense of satisfaction he felt with this and is the main reason he continues to coach this age group

Simon was full of praise for the parents who assist on Sunday mornings and was quite overcome with the messages of support and well wishes he received from many people at the club when he was seriously ill. Not only that, a number of parents organised and run the Sunday morning sessions in his absence. There are heartfelt thanks from Simon to every one who has helped in what ever way, however big, however small.

When the U6 will train or next play is unknown but good luck to them when rugby starts up again, good luck to all our mini and junior teams, good luck to all our senior teams. But best of luck to Simon.

The Kickers has long been a great facility, not many clubs at our level have such a fantastic bar area! But times change and the whole clubhouse, (as everyone keeps telling us!) is very expensive to run.

I was asked late last year, to give my thoughts on our beloved bar and how it might help the clubs finances more. Now, I have been a Blues fan for many years and latterly was proud to sponsor the men's senior team. We all have memories, some bad, but mostly good or great, of our time in The Kickers and, I'm sure, want to see it and the club successful on and off the field for generations to come. Enough of my meandering, let's get to the present day! All bets were off in so many ways with the



arrival & effects of Covid. For Blues, the lack of match day and related membership revenue has, as you will doubtless have realised, left a substantial hole in the club's accounts and accentuated the opportunity, and absolute need, for The Kickers to be a main revenue stream for the club in the future. I'm happy to help, and we have a very willing team in place, but it needs to be a whole club effort!

Whilst an out of town site, the Kickers has multiple housing surrounding it. I feel we should be aiming at sports fans, those not wanting a "town" experience, and general pub goers around us. For

those unconvinced, The Bowlers Arms acts as both proof and template for a local community, sports led pub.

The opportunity is therefore proven, the method will require buy in from members, players, pa rents et al, Yes you! The whole Blues Family! We can then grow to the local community and have a successful Kickers. Given initial, limited, peak time openings, the increased profit would start to help fill the hole. Roll that on in 2021/22 and beyond and this extra contribution to the clubs coffers every year will increase to the point where we could, just possibly, get the club's accounts back in the black!
