

NEWBURY BLUES v GROVE RFC SATURDAY 25TH MARCH 2023, KO 3PM

A warm welcome to our guests from Grove today – the last league game of the season for the Blues before the start of the Papa John's Cup which starts on 1st April. A bonus point win and an 11-point margin today would push The Blues up to a third-place finish above Stow. Grove had a very close game against Swindon last week and will be looking to repeat that today and ensure that does not happen, so I fully expect a very competitive and exciting game.

The season seems to have raced by - 45 players have represented the Blues, with a good number of former junior and youth players continuing to emerge through the club, which bodes well for community rugby and our one club strategy next season. There have been many excellent Saturdays throughout the season, both home and away. Blues secured three wins and there was great community involvement with our charity day raising over £6800, our involvement with Interakt (the charity based at NRFC), and the regular mini mascots under the direction of Under 6s super head coach, Simon Best.

The Stags play Slough today and we wish them the best of luck; a win will ensure they stay in their current league which would be excellent in a tough season for our men's second team. This must be a club priority next season and we are already advertising for dedicated coaches. We want this club to become the best community coaching set up in Berkshire and what a great goal to have at all levels.

Meanwhile, the women just keep on going! They rode into Devon on Sunday, scored 46 points against Cullumpton, conceded none, recorded their 13th consecutive win and rode back to Berkshire, still undefeated and top of the league! What a story this season is turning out to be for their Coach, Nikki Paton, Captain Lizzie Harris and a squad with great skills and team spirit. Make sure you have Saturday 15th April in your diary as they will be playing at home and it could be a very big day for Newbury RFC if they secure promotion to Level 2. You can also book in for lunch on that day and hear about their journey.

The Bulldogs (Veterans) had a great win against the Army on Friday evening. A very competitive game, superbly refereed by Stewart Codling. A good crowd watched some great rugby - surprisingly quick at times, with Simon Niven and James McCarthy flying down the wings and Westy, G and Cripper belying their years and controlling the pace of the game in the forwards! Well played all and hopefully more games to come next season.

This was followed by Super Saturday with a giant screen on the pitch and all three Six Nations games televised, with plenty of food, beer and an Irish Band. It was a great family day out and thank you to all those who supported the event. Everyone had a great time and hopefully will be repeated again next year. Congratulations to all our Irish members as Ireland thoroughly deserved the Grand Slam. Probably not many "Irish eyes a smiling" the next day but a lot of celebratory hangovers.

The Annual Club Dinner is on 28th April with guest speakers David (Flats) Flatman and Mark Durden-Smith. Unsurprisingly tickets are selling fast for such incredible guest speakers so make sure you contact Reception to book your ticket. It should be a great way to celebrate a very good season at Newbury RFC.

SCORE FORECAST – THE RULES

THE JACKPOT

Any ticket holding the correct match score at the end of the match wins the Jackpot.

MATCH DAY PRIZE
