NEWBURY BLUES v SWINDON RFC SATURDAY 29TH OCTOBER 2022, KO 3PM

Local Derbies used to be a major part of community rugby, so it is great to see Swindon back at Monks Lane today after a few years absence. A warm welcome to all from Swindon as well as our own very valued and loyal supporters in the stands, on the North Bank and Blues Corner. Rumour has it that we have some real ale on tap today! I hope we have an exciting and open game of rugby, and you all have an excellent afternoon.

Swindon lie 8th in the league with two wins so far but some closely contested games; last week losing to Witney (31-10).

The Blues last week turned in a dogged performance for 65 minutes, creating numerous try-scoring opportunities against a very physical (but one route) Grove side. Not all chances were taken and a lack of concentration close to the end, with various substitutions made the game closer than it should have been as Grove fought back tenaciously. Nick is also part responsible for the reformation of Newbury Vets (known as the Bulldogs), who play their first game next Friday Evening (4th Nov) at the club against Hungerford. This is 'A MUST' for all rugby lovers and a chance to see some Veteran Superstars. I know they will want your encouragement and it's a great way to start the weekend.

The Newbury Women just keep on winning and are top of their league, last week securing a resounding win over St Mary's Old Boys Ladies. This means they retain their 100% record. Do look on the website for their fixtures and come and watch; the rugby is impressive!

Unfortunately, last week we had to again cancel the Stags game due to a lack of players. A huge amount of injuries has not helped but this is a also a national problem at second and third team level and it is so disappointing for those who want a social runout at the weekend. It is the biggest problem facing our rugby club in my view and the transition from Colts to Senior Rugby. The jump from Colts to the Blues is too big for most players and preserving the social side of a rugby club is fundamental to its success. I know the rugby committee are looking at it.

SCORE FORECAST – THE RULES

THE JACKPOT

Any ticket holding the correct match score at the end of the match wins the Jackpot.

MATCH DAY PRIZE

If the Jackpot is not won, a £50.00 prize is awarded to the nearest score at the end of the match. The nearest score will be determined in the following sequence

- 1. The winning score correct, in combination with the nearest losing score (above and below)
- 2. The loosing score correct, in combination with the nearest winning score (above or below)
- 3. In the event of a draw, the nearest other draw (above or below)
- 4. In the event of no ticket forecasting the draw, the smaller margin or any ticket holding the draw number of points win or lose.
- 5. If no ticket holds the draw number of points, then any ticket holding plus or minus one of the drawn points score with the smallest margin. The plus or minus two and so on.

Notes

- In the event of more than one winner the Jackpot or Match Day prize will be shared equally between the ticket holders.
- The end of the match is at 80 minutes or at time of abandonment. Extra time will not count.
- No prize will be paid without the winning ticket being presented.
- Winners have 28 days in which to claim their prize.
