
## **Happy New Year!**

#### **Resilient to the Final Whistle**

Harrogate Ladies 1st XV 0 - 87 Leicester Tigers. Saturday 19th November 2022

The Harrogate Ladies faced a tough encounter against Leicester Tigers at Welford Road. Despite a disappointing final result, the opportunity to play at Welford Road Stadium made this an unforgettable day.

The first half saw a series of impressive tackles from Harrogate, with intense play resulting in the ladies winning several rucks and holding off Leicester on a number of occasions. Particularly notable



were tackles from Kel Morgan, Sarah Foster, Georgina Youlden and Charlie Goode. The score at half time was 36-0 to Leicester, but the Harrogate Ladies did not make this an easy win. The Ladies continued to perform well in the second half of the match, preventing Leicester from scoring several times. The defensive play remained commendable with strong tackles again from Em Attwood and Sarah Foster and one particularly notable long pass from Georgia Briggs leading to an impressive run down the pitch from Georgina Youlden. This difficult match showed the grit and determination of Harrogate Ladies.

Leicester Tigers were expected to be a challenging team to play against, however the Ladies have much to be proud of in their performance.

- 1875 Harrogate FC Played at Dragon Fields opposite where Smiths the Rink is today.
- 1896 Harrogate FC moves to Claro Road. First game played 19th December.
- 1906 Harrogate Old Boys playing at the Agricultural Showground, Starbeck, currently Shaws Trailer Park.
- 1926 HOB purchase Claro Road ground.
- 1931/1932 Harrogate RFC playing at the Agricultural Showground, Starbeck.
- 1936 HRFC and HOB combine to become Harrogate RUFC at Claro Road.
- 2015 HRUFC moves from Claro Road to Rudding Lane.

### **Harrogate FC**




Despite the dearth of material available from the history of rugby in Harrogate it is remarkable that this splendid photograph, of the Harrogate Football Team from 1875 has survived and takes pride of place in the Rudding Lane clubhouse. It appears to have been taken outside the West Park Hotel on the West Park Stray.

Robert Waterhouse, writing about Wakefield's 22 - 20 victory over Harrogate in the Guardian newspaper, explained, "Just when Northern club rugby seemed in the doldrums these two very different Yorkshire teams produced an entertaining epic with unlimited skill and courage.

Wakefield, playing against the wind, and the run of play, opened the scoring. "Collecting the ball on the blind side in his own 22 Steve Townend gave Mike Harrison a well-judged pass to the wing. Harrison proved too quick for everyone else. But the lumbering Simmonds traded dropped goals with Angus Moran and there was nothing in it at halftime."

Wakefield used the wind to their benefit in the second half. Mark Rawnsley added a penalty and Bryan Barley picked up a loose ball to send Townend over for a try. Harrogate, now ten points down, responded: "with some rousing stuff" which led to a try for Cowling(spelt incorrectly Cowley in the team list.) "Wakefield's reply was even more dynamic", pushing Harrogate off their own ball, gaining twenty yards and setting up Moran for a drop goal.

However, Harrogate were still not beaten, and their internationals Roger Shackleton and Peter Squires combined and allowed Simmonds to snatch a try. Wakefield added another Rawnsley penalty before Shackleton added another try converted by Simmonds.
