CLUB HISTORY

Woodley United FC was formed in 2011 as a result of four Woodley based football clubs and Berks & Bucks FA recognising that the provision of women's and girls' football in the town would be better provided by one club dedicated to this purpose rather than the existing clubs each having one female team to satisfy FA Charter Standard needs but no player progression policy.



During its time as a female club, Woodley United FC saw success on and off the pitch. This included coaching in schools, supporting the Woodley Community Carnival inter school tournaments, being presented the Wokingham Borough Sports Council annual award for Service to Sport in and the Community in 2014, winning four Berks & Bucks FA County cups and the Southern Region Women's Football League league cup.

Such were the benefits of working together that two of the town's oldest clubs, Woodley Town FC and Woodley Hammers FC in conjunction with Woodley United FC saw greater opportunities for the provision of local football if the clubs were to amalgamate. As such a "One Woodley" steering group was created in April 2014 and has overseen proceedings so that from 2015 – 16 the three clubs have been playing under the Woodley United FC name.

The objective of the club is to "offer everyone in our community the opportunity to play, develop and grow through football, regardless of race, gender, age or ability" and in so doing provide community based football that is the envy of the footballing world." To help with this objective the club is a FA Charter Standard Community Club.

The FA's National Clubs' Manager Mick Backle stated "The vision, ambition and purpose of the One Woodley project is an inspirational football model that places the players and its community at its core."

The club provides football from mini-kickers (pre-school), youth through to adult (male & female) and veterans and has gone on to further be presented the Wokingham Borough Sports Council annual award for Service to Sport in and the Community in 2015, 2017 and 2019. The club also has players of Reading FC Women's team, coach and manager the men's Saturday Step 7 Reserve side.

This season sees the men's 1st team play in Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One East, the ladies team competing in the Premier Division of the Southern Region Women's Football League (Tier 5 of FA Women's football pyramid) and the Veterans playing in the Hellenic Veterans Premier Division following their Division One league title and league cup success last year.

Didcot Town • Club History

Didoct Town FC were founded in 1907 and prior to becoming founder members of the Hellenic League in 1963 the Club had competed in the North Berks, the Reading & District, the Oxfordshire Senior and also the Metropolitan Leagues, albeit with mixed fortune. Didoct adapted well to the new Hellenic League format and, under the captaincy of Ray Warr (who remains one of the club's most dedicated supporters), became the insugural League Champions. After four seasons in the Hellenic League, Didoct joined the Metropolitan League and reached the League Cup Final in 1961/62. Then in 1963 Didoct returned to the Hellenic

League where it has remained involved to this day. Didoct waited until the 1665/66 season to taste success again when they won the Premier Division Challenge Cup (Witney Town were defeated 3-2 in the final). The following season the oup was successfully defended but the Club had to wait ten long years for further honours. Indeed, the intervening years had seen Didoot demoted to Division One, but season 1976/77 not only saw a return to the Premier League as Division One Champions (from Flackwell Health) but also success in the Challenge Cup. A decade later, in 1987, Didoot again returned to the Premier Division after finishing in third place behind champions Bishops Cleeve and runners-up Cheltenham Town Reserves. The Club benefited from Hellenia League rules which prevented Cheltenham Reserves from participating in the Premier Division and Didoot took the second and last promotion spot. The sesson was rounded off with success in the Division Chellenge Cup, where Cheltenham Town Reserves, again the violims, were defeated 2-0 in the final.

The Club remained in the Premier Division for the next six campaigns, and managed a notable honour in 1992 when they lifted the Premier Division Cup (Banbury United defeated 3-0 in the final). Despite this success the following season resulted in disappointment with relegation to Division One. Within three years the Club was reinstated to the Premier League and while the League Cup was won in 1997, the Club had to wait until they moved to the impressive new Loop Meadow Stadium (in 1999) before a turnaround of fortunes was truly achieved. In fact, the Club established itself as one of the most consistent. performers in the Premier Division over the next 7 years, never finishing outside the top 7. And along the way silverware has been lifted in the form of the Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy (2001 and 2003), the League's Supplementary Cup (2003) and the Challenge Cup (2004). Season 2004-2005 ended up as arguably the most successful in the club's history so far following a memorable 3-2 win in the final of the FA Vase at White Hart Lane against pre-tournament favourites AFC Sudbury. This came on the back of the Club retaining the League Challenge Cup with a 5-1 win against Carterion. Didcot came agonizingly close to claiming the treble but failed to win the League by a point despite amassing 97 points and winning 31 of their 42 matches. The Club also ended with their best ever defensive record, just 21 League goals conceded including a remarkable 19 clean sheets at the Loop Meadow. After a wait of 53 years, the team finally brought the Hellenic League trophy back to Didoot in 2006 and with it the Club ensured a move up into the Southern League for the first time. The Berks & Bucks Senior Trophy and the Hellenic League Challenge Cup were also claimed, the latter to make Didcot the first Club to win the competition three times in a row. The League triumph broke all records with Didcot Town becoming the first Club to reach more than 100 points in a season in the Hellenic League and the average points per game (2.63) gave Didoot the best record of any club at level 5 or above in British football that year.

Moving closer to present day, Didoct Town have enjoyed spells in the South & West Premier Division, following play off success against AFC Totton in 2009. Didoct Town stayed in that league for 2 seasons before being relegated courtesy of Windsor being removed from the league following financial difficulties. Ironically, Didoct Town were one of the few Club's to take points off Windsor that season, so it was a bitter pill for DTFC to swallow.

Fallow seasors followed with sporacic FA Cup and FA Trophy success. However, things started to improve in 2014, when new management duo of Ian Concarnon and Jamie Heapy (both DTFC legends) were appointed as Joint Managers following a period of uncertainty and destabilising management changes. DTFC fought through numerous qualifying rounds of the FA Trophy to be eventually awarded a prime fixture versus Forest Green away. DTFC managed to draw that match (to the euphoria of the strong traveling contingent) and were narrowly beaten when Forest Green returned to the Loop Meadow Stackum a week later. Didoot Town's biggest moment came in the FA Cup in 2015. DTFC managed to qualify for the 1st Round of the FA Cup with a home te against Exeter City. Being the underdog, Didoot Town were even awarded a live televised te on BT Sport, which didn't deter a record crowd of 2,707 to the Drayoott Engineering Loop Meadow Stackum.

DTFC employed manager Andy Ballard in December 2018 following the sudden departure of Heapy and Concannon. Ballard stepped up into the role as caretaker manager whilst still being a key player in the side and after a mixed start, Didoct finished the 15-16 Season strongly to finish 10th. Ballard's first full season in charge was full of many highs and lows as a number of key player departures drew mixed results but the 17-18 season saw Didoct exceed all expectations as they finished in 6th place to secure a place in the Play off's. A 2-0 defeat in the semi finals to Wimborne Town couldn't deny a brilliant season for The Railwaymen which included a Final appearance in The bigfreebet com Challenge Cup. In the 2019 close season Jamie Heapy returned to his "Railwayman" roots to manage once more, along with Paul Bedwell as his assistant.

Didcot Town retain their Hellenic League heritage by maintaining a Development side who are established members of the uhisport Hellenic League Division One East. The side, predominately consisting of young players, will be looking to improve on the 5th place achieved in season 18/19. In addition to the Development side, Didcot also retain Hellenic recognition with two sides playing in the Veterans football divisions.

In front of a decent crowd. Woodlev extended their unbeaten run to four matches with an excellent result against second placed Abingdon United.

The opening ten minutes were closely contested with the visitors just shading possession and having the game's first real chance which Pete Davies in the home goal did really well to save.

Woodley's first real attack resulted in them going ahead. Thirty seconds after a potential penalty was turned down when Max Laschok was given a hefty shove in the back, a spot kick was awarded when Toby Briggs was tripped in the box on the left hand side. Laschok stepped up from twelve vards and continued his good scoring run sending the keeper the wrong way with a strike into the left corner.

After Abingdon midfielder William Leach blazed a free kick well over, Woodley started to dominate. A Gareth Ainsworth free kick was only punched clear to Ben Anderson who saw his shot from just inside the area blocked by a defender.

More pressure from the home side followed as Ainsworth tested Jack Griffiths with a fierce strike before a lovely team move was capped off with Laschok going agonisingly close to nabbing his second when his shot just missed to the right.

The scores were level on thirty four minutes with a goal out of nowhere. Picking up the ball on the left, Ben Curtis seemed to hold onto the ball for eternity; weaving past several challenges, he curled a shot past Davies into the right corner.

Sixty seconds after the equaliser, the challenge facing Woodley drastically increased when full back Jamaal Whight was shown a straight red card for a challenge on the half way line.

Three minutes before the break, a tactical change was made with Freddie Barron replacing Briggs. This saw Woodley revert to a 4-4-1 formation with Barron taking over at right back.

A second change was made before the start of the second period. Anderson made way for Lamin Ceesay. This saw Ainsworth move to the left wing and Ceesay play down the right.

The early stages of the half saw little action for either keeper. Woodley had another penalty appeal waved away on fifty five minutes when Laschok went down after a long throw in from centre back Ryan Alexander.

Midway through the half, Abingdon had their best spell of the match. Davies showed good hands to hold a Curtis free kick. Nathan Kimber had a well hit drive blocked. Leach fired over whilst a shot from a good thirty five vards had Davies scrambling across his goal line to cover a shot that ended up going just wide.


