1. Welcome and Apologies

No apologies were received prior to the AGM. In total, we had approximately 40 people attend the AGM in person, with another 10 joining virtually online. A good turn-out and one of the best we've had in recent years.

2. Chairman's Notes

Over the last 12 months the club has experienced some real highs and devastating lows, both on and off the pitch.

Last summer, a much-loved member of our club, Thando Ndlovu, sadly lost his life in a tragic accident. Thando was a valued member of Don Miller's team, who always had a smile on his face and the people around him only ever had positive things to say about him.

More recently, another former member of our club – and a close friend to many associated with Melbourne Dynamo – Kev Earp, sadly lost his life. Kev was a former player for Melbourne United over many years and more recently became coach of his son's junior team at AFC Chellaston. A passionate Liverpool fan and loving family man, Kev was a big part of our community.

During these devastating times, the local community came together, and Melbourne Dynamo & Wildcats Football Club were at the heart of this. In September 2021, our fundraising team put on a





memorial day to celebrate the life of Thando Ndlovu. A football match between his close friend and former teammates was the main event of the day, with other fun activities also happening. This raised £2,200 which will be put towards a memorial for Thando at the MSP in the coming months. We will also arrange something to remember Kev Earp by in the near future.

On the pitch, we had more reasons to smile. The 2021/2022 season was the first in three years to be uninterrupted due to COVID. This has been reflected in both the performances on the pitch, and the feedback received from parents and managers on how the club was progressing. A special thank you goes to all our coaches, who have worked tirelessly over the last season to make this a successful one.

3. Club Structure

- The club is growing in size, with an increase in numbers of teams and numbers of players in each team.
- This growth has to be managed sustainably, due to the number of pitches we have for matches, as well as the number of AGP slots available for training – an issue we have each year.
- Next season (2022/2023) we expect to have 35 teams wanting to use the AGP (including Soccer Schools). Last season we had only 16 full-AGP slots available.





- We have purchased foldable lightweight 7v7 & 9v9 nets, which can be used for grass training, as well as portable floodlights to help us in the winter months. This grass training has to be monitored closely to avoid damage to our pitches. We have asked the MSP to mow the area at the back of the AGP to produce a "half-AGP" sized grass area for additional training.
- We ask for full co-operation and patience from both parents and managers while we try to sort the training schedule for next season.

4. Player Registration

- This season was the first using Pitchero as a way to register players. Overall it has been successful in allowing us to chase payments, however it is not gone smoothly all of the time.
- Both the boys and girls players have to be registered on Pitchero <u>AND</u> Whole Game System (WGS). Girls also have to be registered on GotFootball, but not until they are registered on WGS.
- The issues we've experienced with Pitchero are due to managers/parents not filling out the details correctly and making secretaries aware of new players.
- Earlier in the season, a "How To" guide was circulated to all managers on how to register a player. This guide will be circulated to all managers and parents again as a step-by-step instruction on registering players.
- A lot of parents are not filling out <u>ALL</u> sections on Pitchero when registering a player. These
 details are important to link players with their parents accounts. We do not share your
 details with anyone externally and it is all managed securely.
- Some parents are checking the box which opts out of receiving emails. It is advised that you uncheck this box, as you will miss out on important emails relating to the club.
- A list of Do's and Don't's was shared (see AGM pack for more details):

Parents

- **DO** Fill out **ALL** sections on Pitchero
- **DO NOT** leave any sections blank on Pitchero
- **DO** let your manager know when you have registered on Pitchero
- **DO** tick the box saying you want to receive emails

Managers

- **DO** let your secretary know when a player is registered on Pitchero
- **DO** send your secretary the player/parent details along with the player passport photo





- DO NOT assume the secretary knows when a player is registered on Pitchero
- **DO NOT** contact the league secretary directly

• In summary:

- The club is in a financially comfortable position, with £35k in the bank. £20k is planned to be transferred to a separate account to be used as a back-up float.
- There is a need to push sponsorship and advertising space a lot more. This is easy money for the club to make, but requires the support of parents to help find the sponsors
- There has been a lack of participation at fundraising events. A club of our size should be raising in the region of £5-7k per year, but we need a culture change where the club is more integrated.
- The number of fines has risen from £25 to £650. Fines for players are to be paid by the player (or their parent). Fines occurred by managers for not filling out match reports are to be paid by the manager.





6. Sponsorship

- Previously, the club has had one shirt sponsor for all age groups. This was not bringing in sufficient funds to cover the cost of all kits. A change of strategy this season meant that each team would find their own shirt sponsor to cover the cost of kits.
- So far, we have received over £10k in shirt sponsors, with more still to come.
- On Pitch 1, we have sold approximately 50% of the advertising space. The cost is £300 for the first season (including the cost of the board) and £100 optional renewal every season
- A challenge was set to all teams to sell sponsorship boards, with a prize to all children from the team who sold the most. Only one team managed to sell a board so far. We all have to pull together to make this work.
- If we sell all boards, the club will make £3-4k each year, which is a lot of money for minimal effort.

7. Fundraising

- We have had some successful Fundraising events in the last couple of years, raising quite a significant amount of money for the club.
- The latest fundraiser, the Race Night, did not receive the support that was expected from club members. Around 30 people attended, raising £800. A good amount, which would have reached £3-4k if we had sold out our allocation of 100 people.
- It is clear that a culture change needs to happen within the club, to get our members more involved.
- The next few fundraisers were discussed:
 - Melbourne Carnival Saturday 9th July
 - Boys We Will Rock You theme
 - Girls CATS
 - o Me & Dee Sponsored Penalty Shootout
 - Spring Lakes Water Park
- A target will be set for fundraising in the 2022-2023 season. If this target is not met, we may have to look at alternatives of raising the money with increasing subs an option.
- We want to avoid increasing subs, so we need all members to get more involved with fundraising events.
- The fundraising committee has a strong core of people, but we are in desperate need of more volunteers to support.





8. Club Development

- A 5-year plan has been submitted to the MSP by our Development Committee member, Stuart Uprichard (see slide pack for more information).
- Recently, we have started to use the Football Foundation grants to support the development of the club.
- In the last few months, we have purchased the following:
 - o 8x Portable Floodlights (for winter grass training)
 - Portable 7v7 nets (for grass training and matches)
- In the future, we will look to develop the club through the following:
 - o Portable 9v9 nets (for grass training and matches)
 - o New 11v11 nets on Pitch 1 & Pitch 2
 - o Ball Retention Netting around Pitch 1 & Pitch 2
 - Shipping Container (to store training aids)
 - Veo2 Camera (to film & livestream matches)
 - Electronic Scoreboard on Pitch 1 (for advertising)
 - Dugouts for Pitch 2
 - o 50-seater Terrace for Pitch 1
 - o Permanent Floodlights (for grass pitches)
 - Full-Size AGP
- These plans will need to be funded through sponsorship/fundraising and grant applications.

9. Volunteers / Committee Structure

- A new committee structure was proposed and agreed, which introduced a second Vice-Chair position. The two Vice-Chairs will cover two areas of the club:
 - Business (inc. Fundraising/Sponsorship/Marketing)
 - Football (inc. Secretarial/Welfare/Managers)
- A few new roles were also created, which remain vacant.
- After doing a fantastic job of kitman over the last few years, Andy Bell has decided to step down from his role. Thanks were given to Andy for his hard work and commitment to the club, despite the challenges that COVID-19 placed on kit orders.

10. Q&A

- Q: Has next season's training schedule been created (proposed) if not, do we know when this will be so we can communicate in advance to parents?
- A: The schedule has been proposed to the MSP. We are currently working with them to
 resolve some minor issues. We ask for full co-operation from all managers regarding the AGP
 schedule. We have limited slots due to external bookings that the MSP take, so we cannot
 please everyone.
- Q: Are there any plans to host tournaments and use this as a fundraising event?
- A: Yes, we could not do this in the summer as the pitches are out of action for maintenance.
 If the pitches are in good health during the winter, we can look to run a tournament. If grass pitches are not an option, a smaller tournament may be held on the AGP across a whole weekend. We need volunteers to help run this, as it is a big job. If we do not get the volunteers, we cannot run the tournament.
- Q: Why are we prioritising a 50-seater terrace over a full-size AGP?
- A: We are not prioritising the 50-seater terrace over the full-size AGP. The 50-seater terrace
 costs approximately £10k, whereas the full-size AGP will cost upwards of £500k+. The
 council have already given us money to build the current AGP, so may be reluctant to





provide any more funding. This means we need to source alternative methods of funding (fundraising, corporate sponsorship etc). This is going to take years to do, hence why it is at the end of the 5-year plan. The stand can be financed through sponsorship (e.g. naming rights of the stand), therefore wouldn't be a large expense to the club.









