Chairman

Credit as always to the senior coaching staff and of course the senior players who continue to work hard to put four or even five teams out at the weekend.

Our thirds got promoted in merit table league and they also won along with the Merit table cup. Well done guys and keep up the good work.

Next season we say goodbye to David Neale who will become head coach of Amersham & Chiltern who we will probably meet next season. David has been an asset to the club and we will miss him but he deserves his headship and will do well at any club.

The senior coaching team have replaced David with Mike Perera who will not only be the backs coach for Fullerians but will also be the Strength & Conditioning coach for the squad. A real catch for us and I'm sure all at the club will benefit from Mike and Rich throughout next season.

Rich will continue to support the coaches from the minis and juniors throughout the season and will run sessions to help improve communication and delivery of sessions.

The Colts in its third season is a developing project. Some aspects have worked well and we have had many more colts playing senior rugby than last year. However we are aware that some aspects can be improved – games were missed (due to opposition withdrawing) and it hasn't been supported as well as it could due to a number of factors. We are not alone in this as many clubs have struggled in this age group, and we are working to improve things for next season.

Next year the colts will be run by Steve Feasey as they move into this age group supported by his team of coaches and the senior section. This will create a better link between the junior and senior sections and hopefully keep as many of the colts playing rugby at all levels in the club.

On a negative note I need to point out a matter of discipline. We have had to deal with some matters of ill-discipline which has involved several age groups including senior teams this year which disappoints me. Remember we strongly hold the core values of rugby at this club: Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline and Sportsmanship. Please keep these values in your mind regardless of decisions that may go against you and unruly behaviour. We have to uphold these values otherwise we will lose the love of our great game.

Another fantastic beer festival run by Gary Wall and all the volunteers that helped to make it run so well. Thank you Jo Callender our volunteer coordinator once again. We raised over £5000 over the weekend. The Ball also a wonderful evening raised another £3500 for the club fund. Thanks again to those who support these events.

We have next summer to complete it so it is the last role of the dice for us. It will be achievable if we have one last final push in next season to raise money for the clubhouse fund. TREASURERS REPORT – Rowan Scranage - 2016/2017 season

Introduction

There have been two focus areas this season financially for the club in 2016/17 (1) To tighten up on expenditure and to try and ensure things go further and minimize expense in all areas possible. (2) To increase the income through of the club to support the professional development of the whole club both in equipment, coaching and facilities.

Both areas of focus are in support of getting the club on a sound financial track and to attract players in order support the goal of developing the new Clubhouse and building the club from strength to strength.

Expense Reductions

As detailed in the accounts that will presented at the AGM, this has been performed across the board seeking to cut small amounts from every area or making every pound spent go further.

As seen in the 2015/16 accounts the club is particularly susceptible to bad weather and the effects on major revenue streams such as the bar and kitchen, in the 2016/17 season we have started the process to create a contingency for such eventualities. The addition of this focus allows the club to financially cope with any prolonged dips in revenue due to adverse weather.

Cost control has also become required with the market increases from suppliers, this is something we expect to see additionally in the upcoming season.

The areas of focus are:

Wages are down £2770* versus 2015/16 but we have delivered more from the same expenditure this contributes straight to the bottom line of the club.

We are also seeking to open the club bar at additional times during the week using trusted volunteers to increase revenue but keep cost the same.

Increased Revenues – Sponsorship, Events, Facilities Hire & Membership Fees

Over the Season 2016/17 there has been an increased focus on how we maximise the inward revenues to the club as can also be seen in the accounts to be presented at the AGM significant progress has been made in the attraction and/or increase of these revenue sources.

Membership fee collection after some initial hiccups using the Pitchero tool the process has worked well and we are considering using this for the Senior Section. Overall Membership is up and fee collection, something we have had always had challenges in has improved significantly, we still see room for further improvement, Jeff Wall has recently take over this area and has chased people right to the end of the season. We would like to thank Simon Caplan for his efforts over the last several seasons. Sue Dollard also for her huge efforts in ensuring that the Minis and Juniors were always ahead of the curve. We are revisiting the costs of membership as the we still offer very attractive membership in relations to other clubs in the local area and versus other sports and with increased costs this is something that will be discussed during the AGM and a proposal made.

Sponsorship has been a focus for the last number of years and has been steadily increasing and in the 2016/17 season has jumped significantly, in part due to the willingness for sponsors to be part of the clubs' recent success in the Senior section and in the Minis and Juniors section due to excellent community and proactivity of coaches.

Sponsorship has increased by nearly 75% from season 2015/2016 to 2016/17

The club would like to thank – Kevin Brind, Sean Mahon, Alban Barnes, Grant Murray, Rowan Scranage and many others who have supported this large increase in the season sponsorship and we need to keep the momentum.

Events has continued to be strong with the Beer Festival and Ball raising significant funds for the clubhouse fund in addition support for the county finals drove additional sales. These events are critical to the long-term cash generation of the club and need to be

The revenue from club functions is now back to the levels of 2014/15 season with 1 less major event (Mini & Junior Country Festival) this is a huge Club achievement and special thanks must go to Gary Wall, Kevin Brind, and Alban Barnes for the organisation of these events along with support of many volunteers.

Facilities Letting This figure is down in 2016/17 on 2015/16 but slightly hirer than 2014/15 this is due to the refurbishment of the car park and preventing rental, not that its complete we have had an increase in demand, we are also receiving more interest in hiring the pitches from new 3rd parties.

Summary

It is particularly important that the club can show that it is an ongoing economic concern, if we are to achieve and obtain certain grants and loans when commencing the building work

As part of a review of the previous year's accounts and in consultation with the club auditor we will be presenting the clubs accounts differently moving forward to allow us to clearly see the operations business of part of Fullerians RFC and that of expenditure relating to the new clubhouse project as this has in previous years not be so clear.

This will clearly allow members and sports bodies to see the financial stability of the club, and that we are building a club for the next generation and not just for today.

The ongoing focus will be to ensure greater levels of control of the Fullerians RFC costs and revenues and we will roll out a now POS and Stock control system for the upcoming season to allow of further optimization in our finances.

The Club is in much better financial health due to the team work of all the Fullerians Membership pulling together over the last season and I would like to say personal thanks for the support and the working towards ensuring we have a great club in the short term and the long term for our members.

Finally, I must report that after several years of service that Kay Hancock has decided to step down as our book keeper and general all around finance support. I would like us all to acknowledge the great work performed by Kay and thank her for the fantastic support, she will be missed greatly.

Junior Chair Report

Another good season has passed us by with little incident but some great rugby being played by the players and delivered by the coaches. We have been very fortunate that the senior coaches are great advocates that the future senior players will mostly come from the age groups so have been instrumental in working with the coaches to help improve the quality, ability and fun by all.

We continued the development and integration of our coaching resources which has worked well and will continue with the support of our senior coaches through next season again. The Aim is to ensure a 1 club ethos throughout developing and supporting the coaches and in turn developing the player's skills enhancing their journey to senior rugby player

We were also gifted with some good inclement weather which resulted in very few games being postponed and a logistical nightmare in rescheduling as experienced in previous years, furthermore supported by the efforts and hard work of our grounds man who managed to keep all the pitches in tip top condition

The Colts has completed another season and thanks to all the coaches involved.

It was good to see a number of the colt's players stepping up and making their debuts into the senior setup.

This is most definitely continuing to be a work in progress and will benefit from year on year tuning and development to ensure we maintain and continue to develop our players whilst ensuring they enjoy their Rugby here at Fullerians RFC
